# Park and Lake Updates! Lake Survey Done...

It's so nice to see so many folks already out on the lake fishing! The good news is, we need more of you to catch fish!

A study was done by UT Extension Lake Management recently.

While waiting for the full report, the main jest is that we have *wayyyyy* too many fish in the lake! We should be pulling out about 40 lbs of fish per acre/per year. With the lake being 10-12 acres, that's over 400 lbs a year! At this time, we have about 500lbs of fish in the water... **So, catch the fish and take them with you!** 





Especially the Crappie, which can overtake the population if we don't catch them and remove them from the water. They recommended that if you catch Crappie to *not release* them back into the lake unless they are dead, in which case they feed the birds and the turtles! These are great food for the herons and other critters, or you can bury them in the garden as fertilizer!

While we worry about too many turtles, in fact, they are serving a purpose in keeping the fish population down! The fountains some of the neighbors have installed are a big help in keeping the water aerated.

Reminder to please pick up extra line and hooks, etc. from the area when you leave. These can be a real hazard, not only to the wildlife, but to the next kids who come down to fish!

# Park Spring Clean up

Huge shout out to our volunteers that have pitched in and helped do our initial spring trail and park cleanup!



The Nature Trail looks just beautiful, especially these days after the rains! But be careful after wet weather, the rocks and roots do get slick!! (...ask me how I know 2)

And do watch out for trip hazards, especially if running the trail...this is a nature trail, so always be on lookout for exposed rocks or roots!

Also, we did see some **poison oak** on the trail...

Leaves of 3, Let it be!
