



A controversial historical figure, Custer is most known for the defeat of his entire Calvary (including 2 brothers, brother-in-law, and nephew) at "Custer's Last Stand" at the Battle of Little Bighorn in Montana following slaughters of Native Americans and mistreatment of their women as the US pushed westward for gold.

Unfortunately, Custer is less remembered for his significant role in the Union winning the Civil War. A fierce warrior who led many battles including the capture of the first Confederate flag, Custer fought at the Battle of Antietam and was a crucial contributor to the Gettsyburg victory. At age 23, Custer was one of the youngest generals in the Union Army.

Custer received the first truce flag from the Confederates. He was present at the Appomattox Court House, and as a gift for his gallantry, received the table upon which Lee's surrender was signed.

On a more personal note, Custer was not only known for his flowing hair and fastidious grooming, but just like Amy, known to brush his teeth after every meal.
