


Survey results

- The survey was open from December 14th to February 15th
- a full two months.
- Lev Dov has the support and endorsement of over
 professionals and 10 leading community Rabbis.
- The survey response exceeded expectations by 248%
- Of the respondents, **5.20**% were individuals in need of support, and **94.80**% were family members or others.
- The majority of respondents have lifelong disabilities and/or diagnoses and are unable to live independently.


The majority of the respondents live in the GTA




Present living arrangement for supported individual

- As parents age, this arrangement becomes tenuous and high risk.




How much daily support is required?

Monthly average



Areas of interest for the applicant or family


- **83.72**% Housing
- 80.23% Recreational programs
- **52.33%** Inclusion programs
- 49.42% Vocational training and placement
- 43.02% Social and dating programs
- **40.70%** Respite in a safe residence away from home
- **40.12%** Transportation assistance
- 39.53% Behavioural support programs

- **37.21**% Respite at home
- 36.05% Economic advice and assistance
- 33.14% Family / siblings support
- 31.40% Transition support (school and work)
- 6.98% Other





How confident are families in their options for the future






Preferences for future living arrangements

Respondents described what type of long term residence would best suit the applicant:

- Day program
- Dignified
- Group home with full time nurse
- Independent
- Kosher home
- Loving
- One that can look after her medical, healthcare, daily living and social needs.
- Permanent

- Residence with participants of higher abilities
- PSW support, wheelchair accessibility
- Safe
- Small-group living with support
- Social programing
- Subsidized long-term residential housing to accommodate young adults that don't have the ability to earn enough money to support themselves or their future family with adequate home, utilities, cleaning and other living expenses
- Warm
