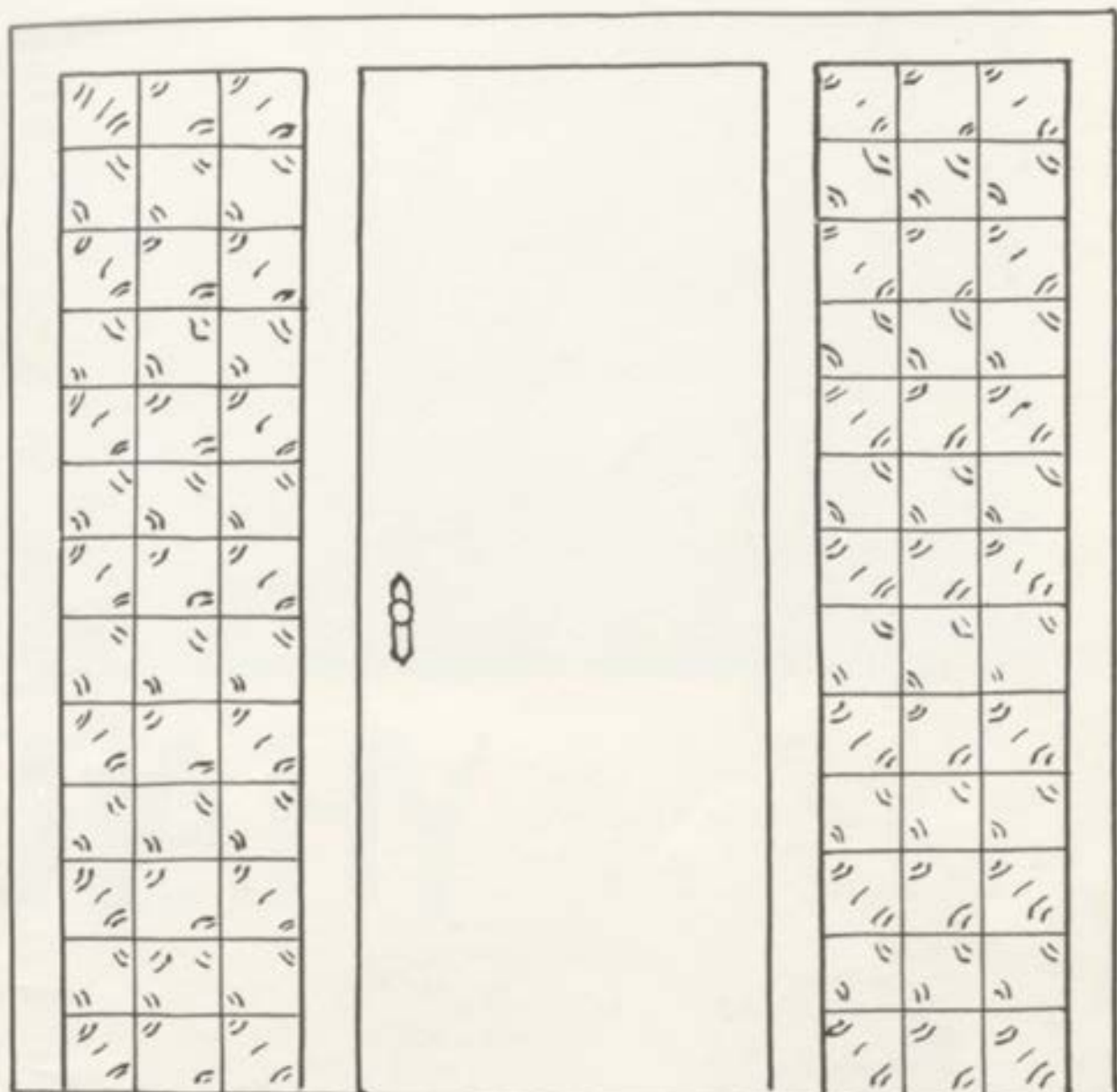


To The Class of 1959: Congratulations!
