President - Joyce Bordeaux Vice President - Gary Bouplon Secretary - Mary Anne Nesbitt Treasurer - Lawrence Ludwig


Lawrence Ludwig became Student Council President, Susan Shaw, Vice President and Gary Boupion, a student council member.
