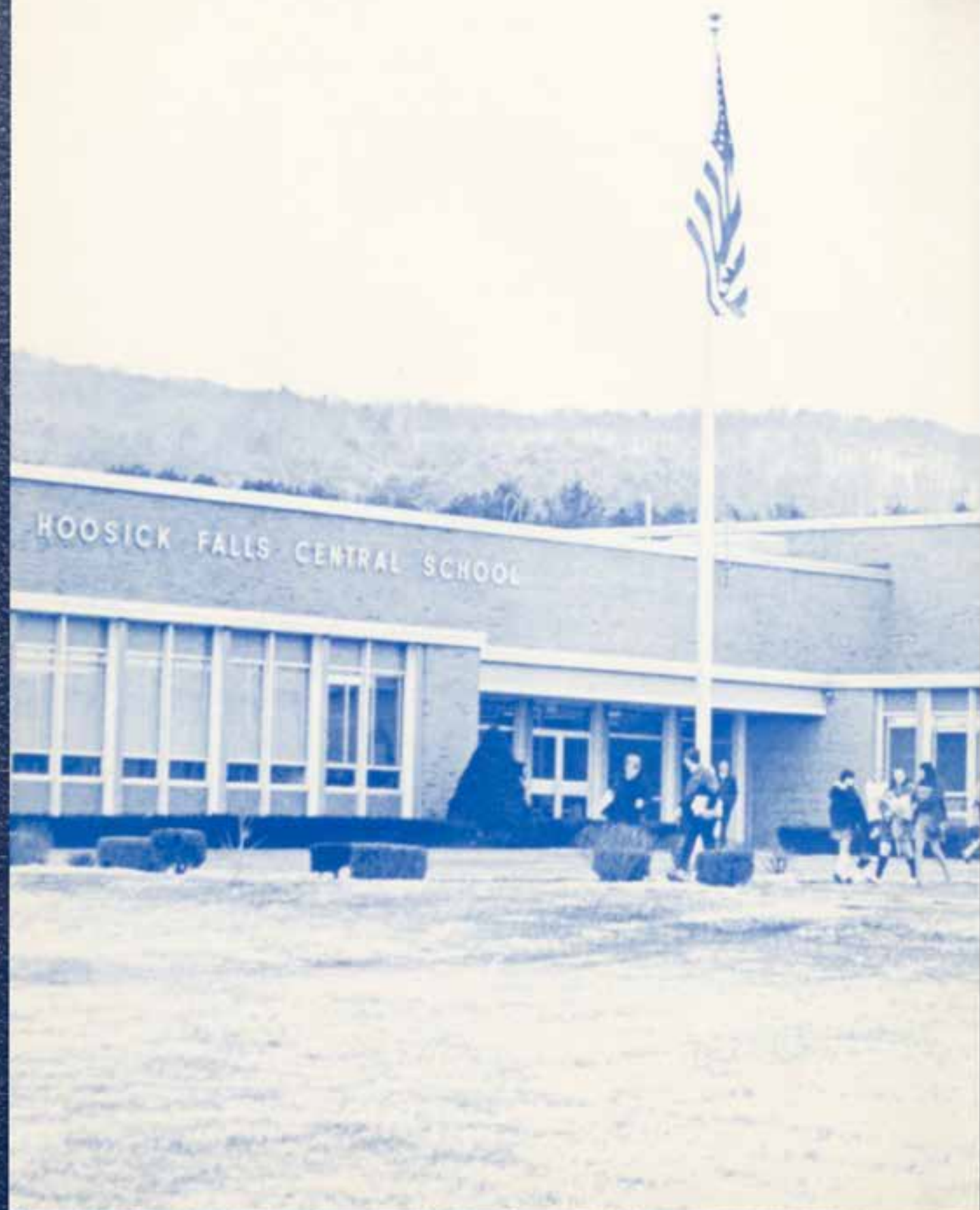


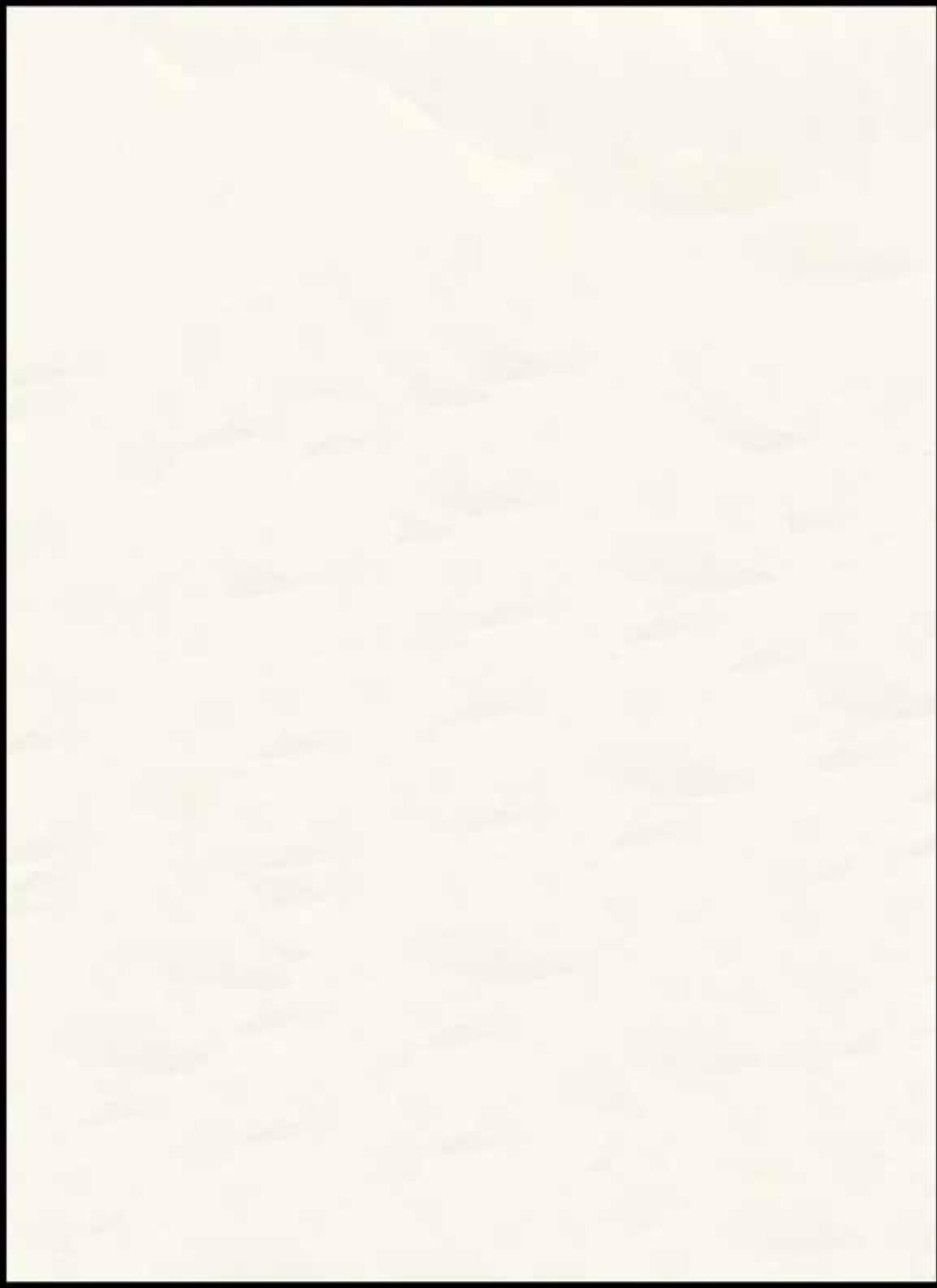

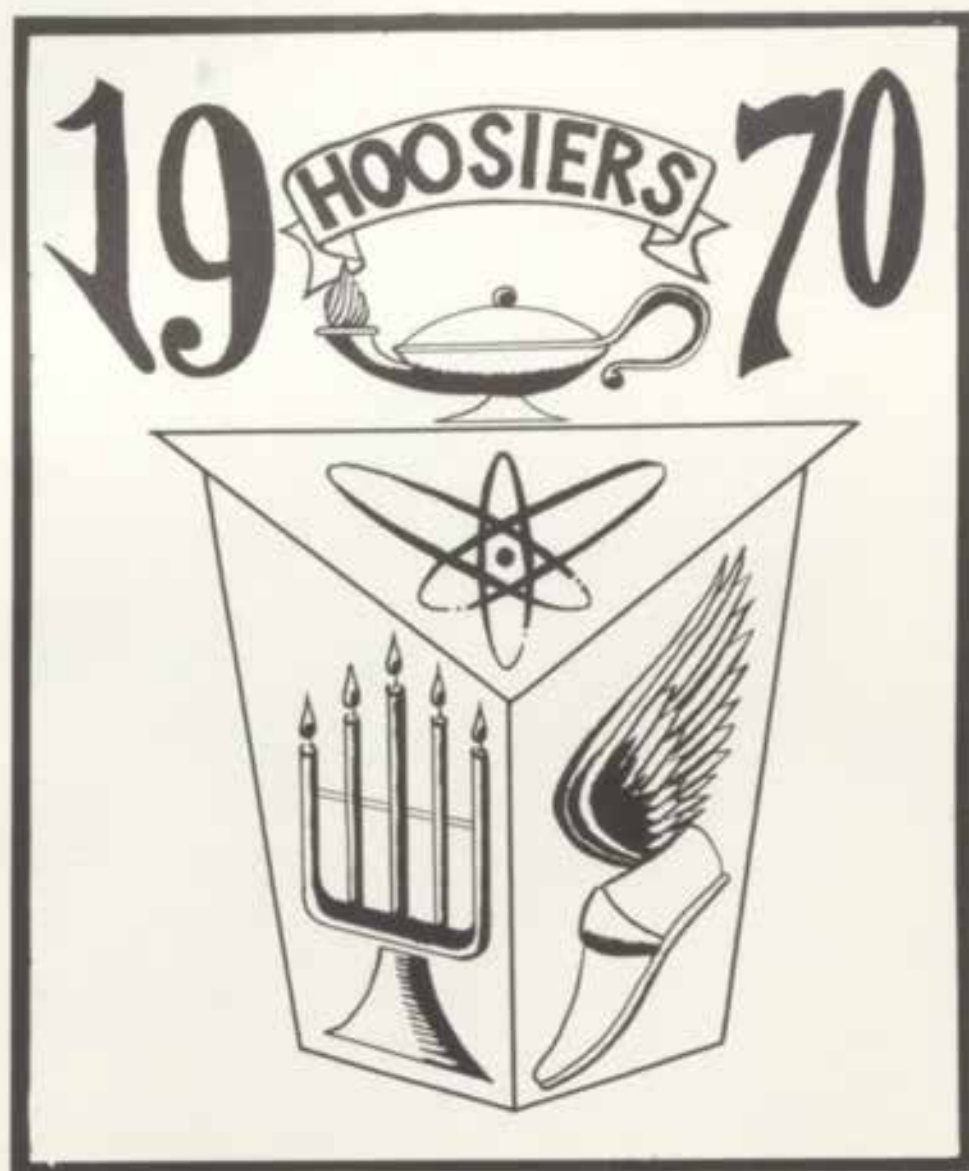

# FOREWORD
