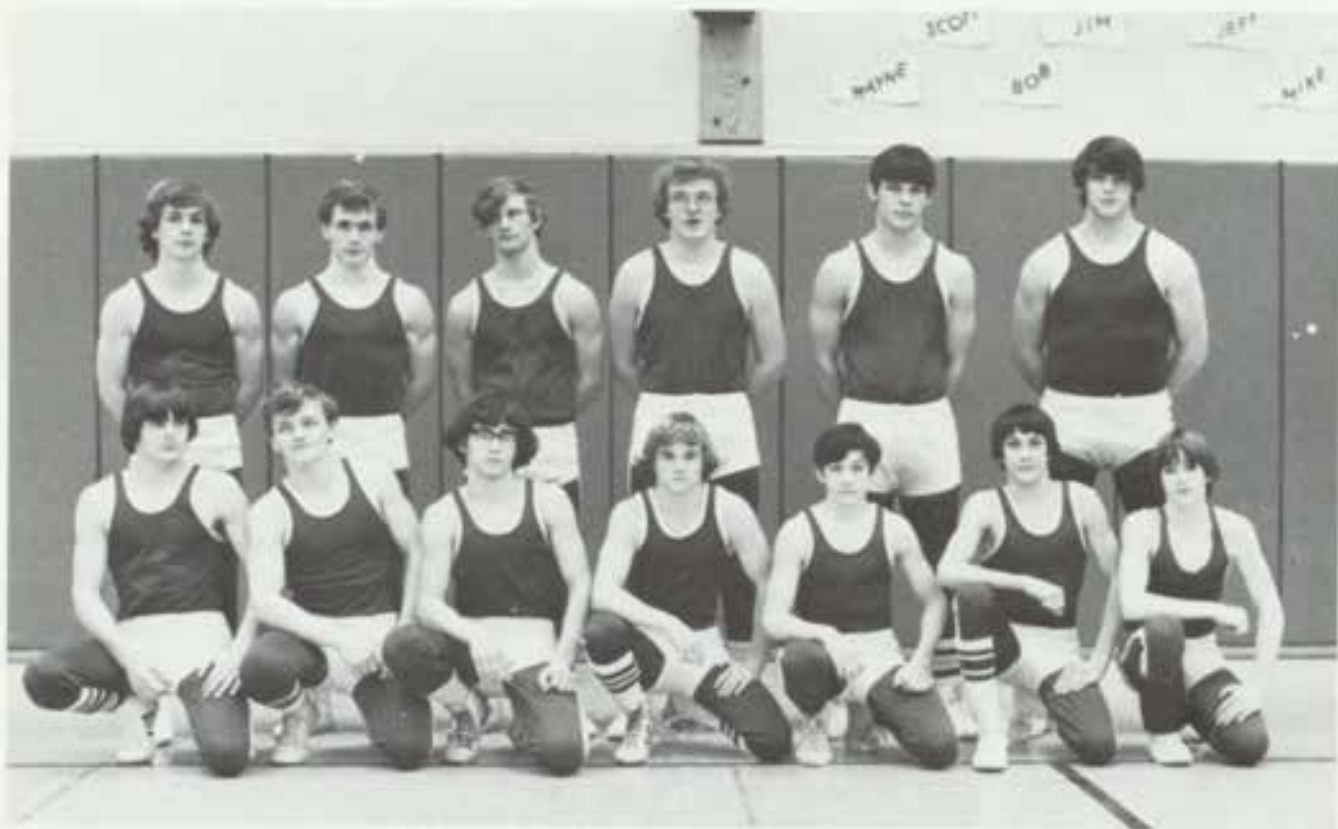
Varsity Wrestling

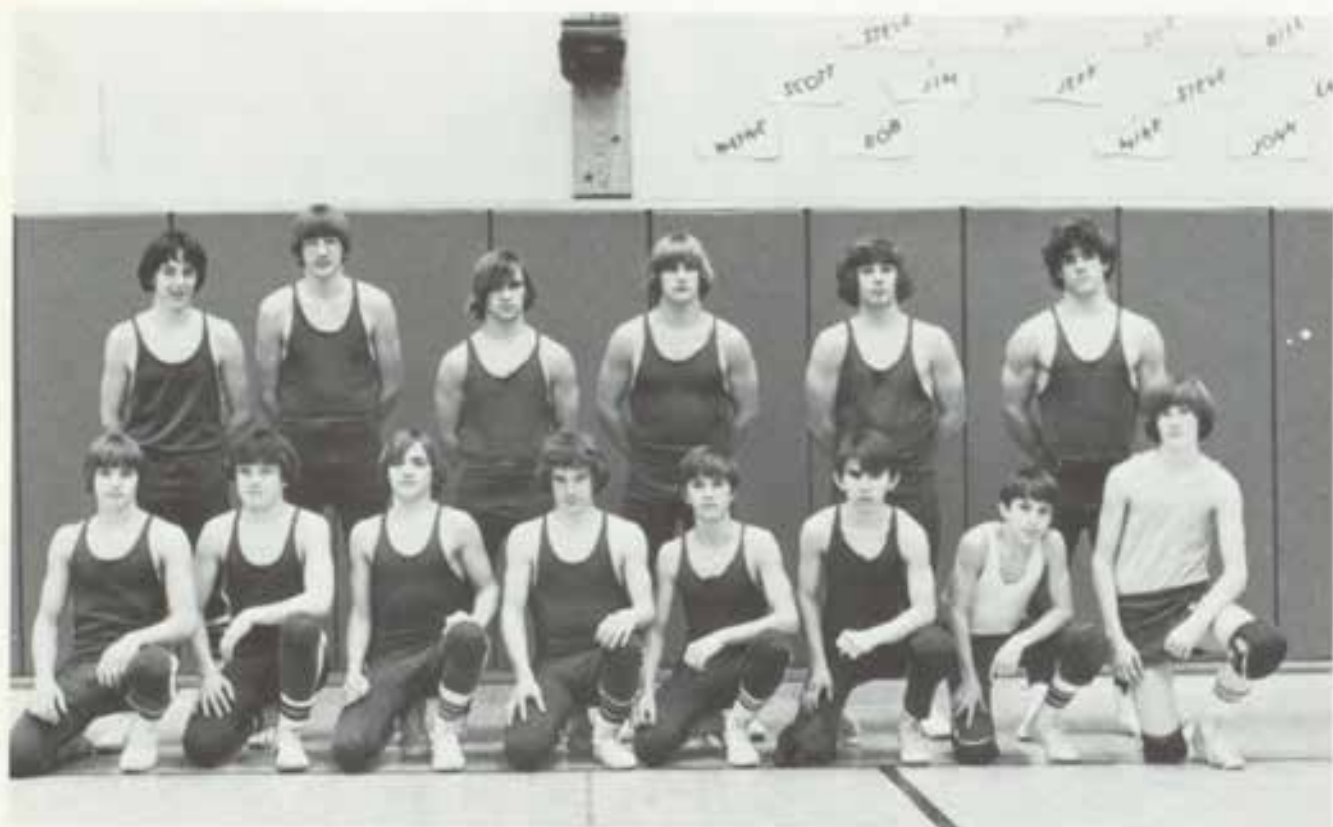
