



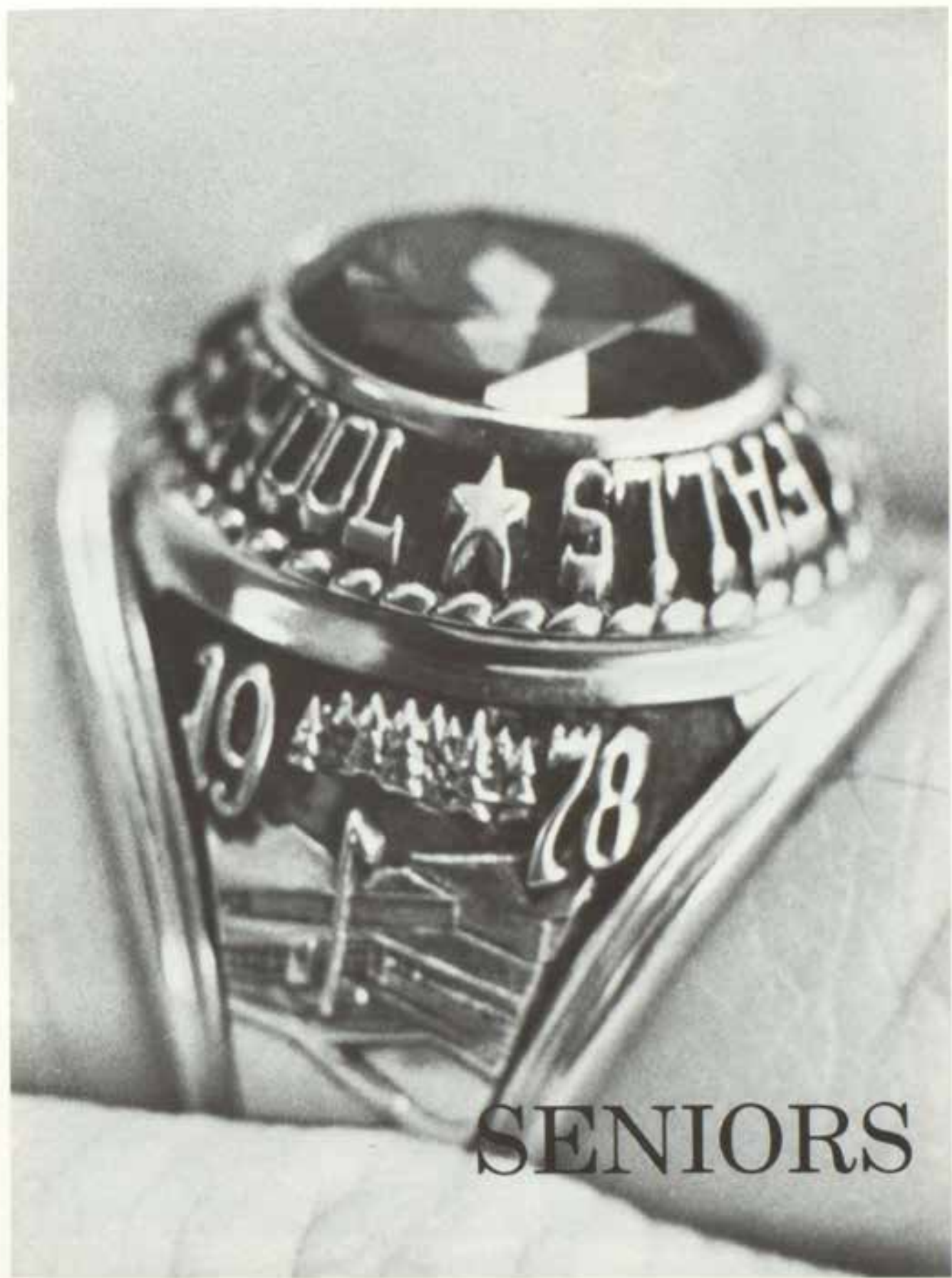
Reminise And Fore Shadow.
