
Saturday morning began with a powder puff football game. The participants were the senior and junior girls. The juniors won 12-0.

Two sides will meet on terms

WASHINGTON — As the ceasefire held Thursday in the Persian Gulf War, allied generals prepared to meet in the desert with their Iraqi counterparts to discuss terms of ending the battle and exchanging prisoners of war.

President Bush said Iraq agreed to a U.S. request to name military commanders to meet with the coalition to discuss a permanent cease-

"We are going to get back our POWs and we're going to do it fast." Bush declared. "... We will promptly go back to them with the arrangements" for the meeting, which he said should take place soon.

By late Thursday, Secretary of State James A. Baker III had sent a message suggesting a time and place for the meeting to the Soviet Union, which is acting as an intermediary between the United States and Iraq, a State Department official said. The State Department also notified Iraqi diplomats in Washington and at the United Nations.

Bush ordered Baker to the Middle East for the first time since the war began to discuss the future of the Persian Gulf region.

In addition, the Bush administration put finishing touches on a draft resolution for the U.N. Security Council to maintain a ban on all weapons shipments to Iraq — as long as Iraqi President Saddam Hussein retains his political power. The resolution also would continue economic sanctions until Iraq complies — as it has promised to do with all 12 U.N. resolutions passed to protest its Aug. 2 invasion and occupation of Kuwait.

While U.S. officials did not predict Security Council approval, resolutions are normally not introduced unless there is prior assurance of passage.
