HISTORICAL SKETCH OF HOOSICK.

"Hoosac" is an Indian name, and when translated means "Owl Valley," or Valley of the Owl, "Hoo" being the Indian name for owl, and "sac" for valley. The United States Government has, however, established the spelling of "Hoosick" for its post-offices in this township.

Hoosick, the northeastern town of the county, is bounded north by Cambridge and White Creek, in Washington county, east by Bennington, in Vermont, south by Petersburgh and Grafton, and west by Pittstown. The boundary lines are straight, or nearly so, following, however, somewhat the course of the Hoosick river. The town is considerably wider at the north than at the south. The farm acreage of the town is about 40,000 acres. The present population of the township is about 12,000.

The scenery is of a varied character, combining many elements of beauty. The highest peaks are those of Fonda Hill, in the southwest. These are said to be 900 feet above tide water. The valleys are bordered in many places by steep hillsides.

The town is divided into two nearly equal parts by the Hoosick river. This is an old, historic stream, whose valley was the war path along which the French and Indians made their stealthy marches upon the villages of New England.

In the southeast part of the town are mineral springs, and deposits of slate exist in various parts of the town.

The settlement of the Hoosick valley was delayed by the long and often sanguinary struggles of the French and English for supremacy and dominion in the valley of the St. Lawrence and the adjacent provinces.

This stormy period extended from 1688 to 1760. Hoosick, from its location, being in the direct route from Canada to the towns and villages on the Deerfield and Connecticut, was the most exposed to attacks of these merciless foes.

The one great event of the revolutionary era in this immediate section was the battle of Bennington. This was fought in the town of Hoosick, and, as Judge Ball and others have suggested, it might well have been called "*the battle of Walloomsac*," as it was fought in the valley of that stream, or upon the adjacent hills, and near the village of Walloomsac.

EARLY HISTORY OF HOOSICK FALLS.

On April 14, 1827, the village of Hoosick Falls was incorporated, Seth Parsons being elected president of the board of trustees. It is said that at the time of its incorporation the population of the village was 200, the number of buildings 36, the electors 50, and the valuation of the property \$96,370.

The first known lease of land of the Hoosick patent, at Hoosick Falls, was made of 220 acres by Jonathan Fuller from Augustus Van Horne of New York. The survey of this tract began at a marked birch tree standing below the falls of Quequick. This farm was next conveyed to Henry Northup, of North Kingston, R. I., who shortly after removed to it, where he lived until his death in 1797. The other part of the village west of Main street and east of the Hoosick river was a part of the farm of 250 acres belonging to Henry Barnhart. The first store in Hoosick Falls, it is said, was one opened in 1785 by Isaac Turner. In 1784 Joseph Dorr came to Hoosick Falls, and, leasing of Barnabus Bratt 280 acres of land, together with all the water power on the north side of the river, began the erection of a carding and fulling mill. Subsequently a flax mill, a distillery and a saw mill were also erected there. Benjamin Colvin, about the year 1786, built a grist mill on the south side of the river. His successors were John Chase and Theophilus Comstock. In 1791 the first bridge was constructed over the river at Hoosick Falls. In 1822 the first post-office was established in the place, Seth Parsons being made post-master.

In 1823 Joseph Gordon, a Scotchman, built what was known as the Caledonian cotton factory, on the south bank of the Hoosick river between the bridge and the grist mill. About 150 persons were employed in the factory. In 1827 the factory was purchased by Samuel S. Crocker, John Knickerbocker, John House of Waterford and Jacob Merritt of Troy. In 1868 this property was sold to the Walter A. Wood Mowing and Reaping Machine Company.

In 1831 George W. and Lyman Benedict erected the Tremont cotton factory on the north side of the river.

About 25,000 yards of cloth were manufactured weekly, the number of employes being about 70. In 1855 the property was sold to Walter A. Wood, and was the starting point for the present extensive harvesting works bearing his name.

HOOSICK FALLS AND ITS FUTURE PROSPECTS.

This village, known throughout the country for its thriving manufacturing enterprises, is situated upon the Hoosick river, which supplies valuable water power. The river runs in a serpentine manner through the village and has a picturesque appearance from the hills. It is also on the line of the Fitchburg railroad, which connects with the entire railroad system of the United States.

It is a lively and bustling village of nearly 8000 people, and is fast being equipped with all the modern conveniences of city life.

The chief industry of the village is the world-renowned Walter A. Wood Mowing and Reaping Machine Co., which has facilities for employing between two and three thousand men, a full description of which will be found on the following pages. As the products of these works are increasing from year to year, and as new industries are being introduced into the village through the intelligence and energy of the Board of Trade, the outlook for Hoosick Falls is certainly bright and encouraging.

representing "Agriculture," in the Salle des Fetes. The Wood reaper was placed at the disposal of the famous artist at his special request that it might be copied in every detail for this great work, which has been admired by the countless thousands who visited the Exposition.

At Vienna in 1873.—Grand diploma, highest and only award, Mr. Wood being decorated by the Emperor of Austria with the knight's cross of the Imperial Order of Francis Joseph.

The inception of the famous works of the Wood Company dates back half a century, when Mr. Wood interested himself in the manufacture of the machine known as the Manny combined reaper and mower, under territorial rights purchased from the owners of the patents. It was a crude and unsatisfactory machine, and Mr. Wood immediately undertook to produce something different and better. In the early fifties the first real Wood type of machine was brought out and was known by the name of the Walter A. Wood mower. Improvement followed improvement during the succeeding years, until finally the famous Wood system of harvesting machines was developed and successfully established in all the markets of the world, and the Wood plant was increased and expanded until its capacity has become sufficient for its enormous annual product of machines. Following the mower, the self-rake reaper appeared first in 1861, and was further perfected in 1868. The first American mowing machine is claimed to have been shipped abroad and introduced in England by Walter A. Wood in 1857, and was tried at the Royal Farm at Windsor Castle, under the personal supervision of Prince Albert, Consort of Queen Victoria. This was really the commencement of the foreign trade of this company, which has grown and expanded from year to year until now there is not a country where grass and grain grow that the Walter A. Wood machines are not in use.

The first successful harvester and binder, it is claimed, was one produced by this company, using wire as a material for binding; also, that the first successful harvester and binder using twine as material for binding was introduced by the Wood Company. So the work has gone on, not only in improvements, but in adding to the quantities of machines put out and the kind, until to-day the company is building mowers, reapers, harvesters and binders,

Otherwise the company could not furnish a warranty with every machine, as it does. That the machines are of a superiority and excellence which cannot be surpassed the world over is evidenced by the world's highest awards given to the Walter A. Wood machines at competitive exhibitions in this country and abroad, as noted in the beginning of this article. The great works of this company at Hoosick Falls are now being rushed to their utmost capacity, turning out hundreds of machines daily.

THE BENNINGTON AND HOOSICK VALLEY RAILWAY COMPANY

The road has been operated since July 1, 1898, and goes the whole length of both of the villages mentioned, and runs through Walloomsac, North Benning-

ton, and the other small villages between Hoosick Falls and Bennington. It traverses the celebrated Hoosick and Walloomsac valleys, made famous by the battle of Bennington, running through the battlefield, near to the monument, passing the Vermont State Soldiers' home, and nearly to the foot of the Green mountains. The scenery along the line is unsurpassed.

The Company was mustered into State Service on March 20th, 1885, and since its incorporation has always been in the first rank of military companies throughout this State.

In 1888, the Company was ordered out to Buffalo to help suppress the Great Strike Riots in the Railroad Yards of that City, and accomplished a very successful tour of duty at that time.

In May, 1898, the entire Company, without a single exception, volunteered to enter into the United States Service for a period of two years.

The Company was again ordered North in September and on October 26th, 1898, was mustered out of United States Service.

The record of the Company, during the Spanish War, was an extremely creditable one. During this tour of service, the Company lost a number of men.

Hoosick Falls is supplied with pure water by the Hoosick Falls Water Supply company. The source from which it is derived is four wells, twenty-five feet in diameter, located on the flats above the falls. Water is pumped into the main pipes direct, and also into a storage reservoir located on one of the eminences of the village. The company has over eight miles of street mains, and it supplies the village with ninety fire hydrants. The average pressure is eighty pounds to the square inch. The force is sufficient to throw streams from the hydrants over the highest buildings. E. R. Estabrook is the superintendent.

A NOTABLE BUSINESS ENTERPRISE.

Among the largest and most successful business houses worthy of mention is that of Easton, Rising & Worden, lumber, coal, stoves and ranges, hardware and agricultural implements. In the year 1875 Mr. C. W. Easton located in the village and opened a general insurance and coal business, which he soon established as a successful undertaking. In 1880 Mr. Easton formed a partnership with Mr. G. F. Rising, when the foundation of the present large and lucrative business was laid. In 1883 Mr. L. E. Worden, a builder of reputation, was admitted. Mr. Worden has since then represented the town two terms in the board of supervisors, and represented this district in the Assembly two terms.

In addition to their business of merchants and fire insurance, they have contracted for and built many of the finest residences and most of the public buildings in the place, and stand unrivalled by any concern in the same line outside of the larger cities in eastern New York.

1834. The meeting for incorporation was presided over by the Rev. N. O. Preston. Geo. M. Tibbits and Dr. Salmon Moses were elected wardens; L. Chandler Ball, Jonathan Eddy, Jr., Geo. M. Tibbits, Dr. Salmon Moses, Harry Patterson, Seth Parsons, Samuel Shaw Crocker and Hezekiah Munsell, Jr., vestrymen.

The parish continued to exist in a very uncertain condition till 1858, when a new organization was effected. The corner stone of the church was laid in the summer of 1858 by the Rt. Rev. Horatio Potter. The first services in the church were held on Sunday, August 26, 1860. The church was consecrated May 5, 1863. The church was partially destroyed by fire in 1886. It was restored the same year, and enlarged in 1888-89. This church contains a town-clock and a fine chime of bells, some beautiful carved work in wood, and handsome furnishings.

The rectors of the parish have been Rev. Nathaniel O. Preston, 1833-38; Rev. Ebenezer Williams, Rev. Jas. Henry Morgan, 1861-63; Rev. Geo. A. Weeks, 1863-65; Rev. Geo. H. Nicholls, 1865-81; Rev. Geo. D. Silliman, Oct. 1, 1881-93; Rev. C. C. Edmunds, Jr., 1893-96; Rev. W. C. Rodgers, now rector. On Nov. 10, 1881, Rev. Geo. H. Nicholls was elected "Rector Emeritus."

The Methodist Episcopal Church at Hoosick Falls.

This society was incorporated April 12, 1858. On that day the members of the congregation assembled at the place of worship—the meeting house of the Warren society—and elected Stephen Williams, William A. Stoney, John V. Carney, Jesse F. Dunham and Asa Colgrove "trustees of the Methodist Episcopal society at the village of Hoosick Falls." In 1860 a frame church edifice was erected on Main street, in which services were first held on Christ-

mas day of that year, at which time it was dedicated. The building cost about \$3,300, and had a seating capacity for 300 persons. It was further enlarged in 1877. A fine toned bell, weighing 1866 pounds and costing \$642, was placed in the belfry of this church in the summer of 1874. In 1887, during the pastorate of Rev. C. W. Rowley, Ph. D., it was determined to build a new church, the old one having been outgrown. The Russell homestead was purchased, the old house converted into a parsonage, and the cornerstone of a new church laid October 20, 1887. This edifice was completed in about a year, at a cost, including furnishing, of about \$30,000; the value of the entire property—lot, parsonage and church—being about \$40,000. This building was dedicated Oct. 31, 1888. The society is a strong and flourishing organization, having a present membership of about 400 persons.

The Church of the Immaculate Conception.

The first masses were celebrated here in 1834, by Rev. J. Shanahan, in the old school on Elm street, and in the Baptist church (then used as a union church). Rev. J. B. Dailey attended this place in 1836-7, and subsequently Rev. Fathers Haverman, Farley, Finnely and Quigley officiated, until 1849, and in that year Rev. Hugh Quigley built a church on Church street, which was afterward enlarged by Rev. John McDermott, who officiated until 1862.

In 1862 the Augustinian Fathers took charge of the parish. Rev. J. A. Darragh, O. S. A., was appointed first pastor, and remained in charge until 1865, succeeded by Rev. E. A. Dailey, O. S. A., who remained in charge until 1874.

The church proving too small for the increasing congregation, the corner-stone of a new church on Main street was laid August 15, 1869, by Very Rev. E. P. Wadhams, V. G., of Albany. It was dedicated December 10, 1871, by Very Rev. T. Galberry. A bell, weighing 2960 pounds, was placed in the tower of the church August, 1872.

A new organ, built by Johnson & Son, was placed in the church August 15, 1881. The present edifice is a substantial brick structure with stone trimmings, and cost \$58,000. Its seating capacity is 1050.

A parochial school costing \$48,000 was opened in 1890, also a convent for the sisters of St. Joseph, who are in charge of the school, was completed June 1899, at a cost of nearly \$20,000.

The present pastor is Rev. D. D. Regan, O. S. A.

Presbyterian Church of Hoosick Falls.

On the 5th of January, 1825, a number of the inhabitants of Hoosick Falls assembled at the Warren meeting house on Main street, and there organized a religious society by the name of the "Presbyterian Society of Hoosick." In 1829 the congregation erected on Church street a frame meeting house, which when finished, was dedicated by the Rev. N. S. S. Beman, D. D., of Troy. This building cost \$1800 and had seats for about 300 persons. In 1854 the old building was removed, and the present

church edifice was erected at a cost of about \$7000, and having a seating capacity for about 500 persons. It was dedicated in the spring of 1854, the Rev. N. S. S. Beman, D. D., LL. D., of Troy, the Rev. J. H. Noble, D. D., of Schaghticoke, and the Rev. A. M. Beveridge officiating. The membership of the church is nearly 300, and the Sunday school 400. Seth Parsons was the first superintendent.

The church edifice was enlarged and improved in 1879, at an expense of \$6500.

The different pastors of this church have been the Rev. C. Cheever, 1825-6; the Rev. Samuel W. May, 1826-9; the Rev. Robert Shaw, 1830-1; the Rev. Luther P. Blodgett, 1831-6; the Rev. Leonard Johnson, 1837-9; the Rev. Thomas Gordon, 1841-50; the Rev. A. M. Beveridge, 1851-8; the Rev. A. DeWitt, 1859-65; the Rev. A. B. Lambert, D. D., 1865-8; the Rev. John Tatlock, D. D., 1868-96; and the Rev. E. P. Berry, the present pastor.

First Baptist Church at Hoosick Falls.

The First Baptist church at Hoosick Falls was organized October 30, 1847. On the 8th of May, 1851, at a meeting held at the place of worship, John Lyon, Jonathan Case, Allen Spencer, Hosea Daniels and Edmund Leonard were elected trustees of the Hoosick Falls Baptist church. The certificate of incorporation is dated May 16, 1851.

The following have been the pastors of the church:—The Rev. John M. Gregory, 1847-50; supplies for several years, the Revs. Grant and Thomas Rogers from Hoosick Corners; the Rev. O. C.

This congregation, until recently, occupied what was called "The Meeting house" of the Warren society, erected in 1800. During the year 1884 a beautiful and commodious house of worship was built at a cost of \$12,159.55, with a seating capacity of 700. It was dedicated October 31, 1884. The membership at present of the church is about 400 and of the Sunday school 325. The entire value of the church property is \$20,000.

There are toilet rooms and bath rooms. In a word, the rooms are elegant and the furniture and fittings magnificent.




