Almost one hundred years ago Catholics were a small minority in Hoosick Falls. As early as 1834, priests from Troy came to Hoosick Falls to say Mass for the Catholics. In 1862 the Augustinian Fathers were assigned to Immaculate Conception parish by John Cardinal McCloskey who was Bishop of the Diocese of Albany. Father J. A. Darragh, O. S. A., was the first pastor. In 1865 he was replaced by Father E. A. Dailey who served the parish until 1874. Today's parishioners can be grateful to Father Dailey whose faith and foresight were responsible for the building of the present church. At the present time the parish is headed by the Very Reverend Charles E. Bauman, O. S. A., pastor. His assistants are Father Lawrence J. Gerrity, O. S. A., Father Thomas R. Cook, O. S. A., and Father Alfred Ellis, O. S. A.

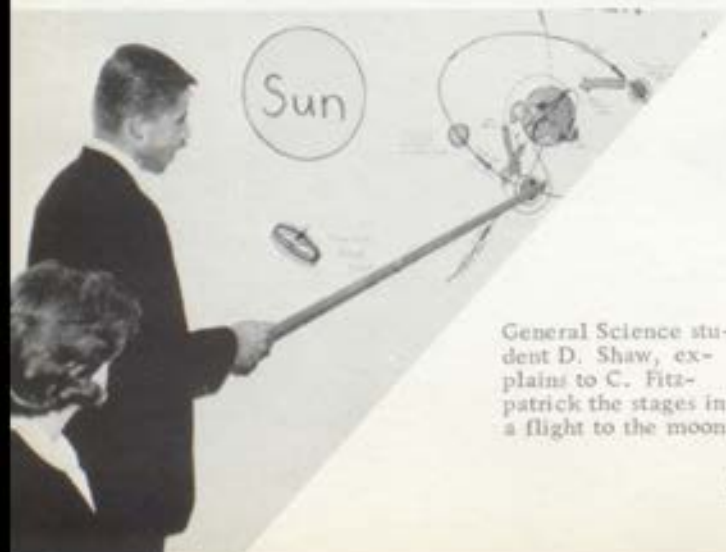

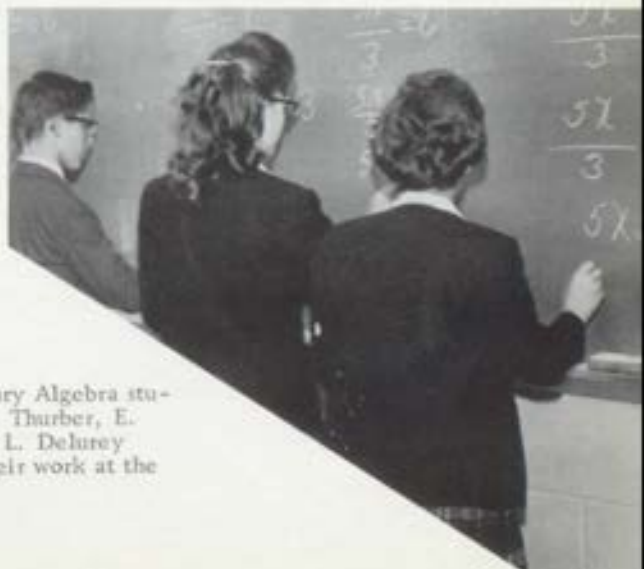
