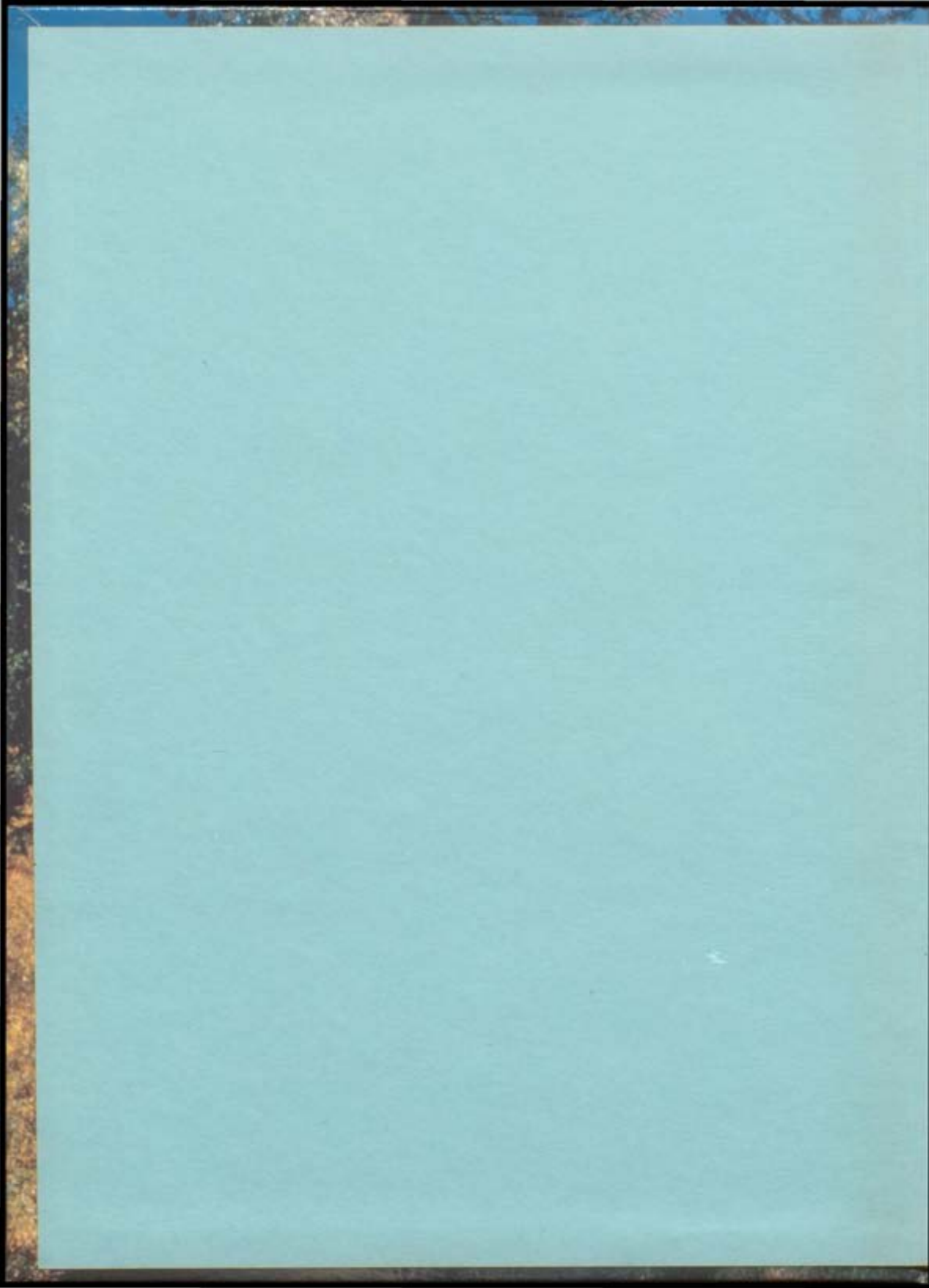
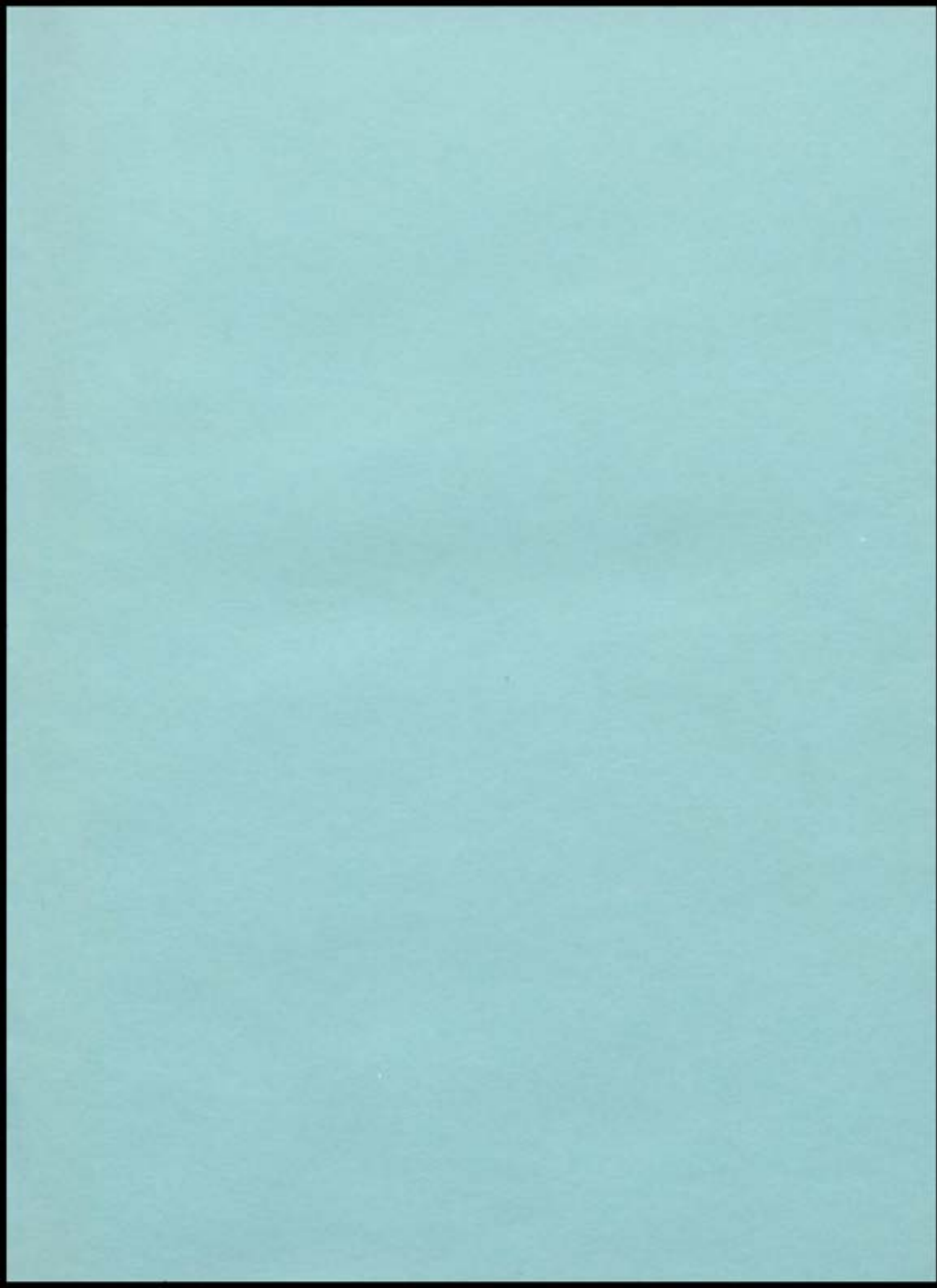
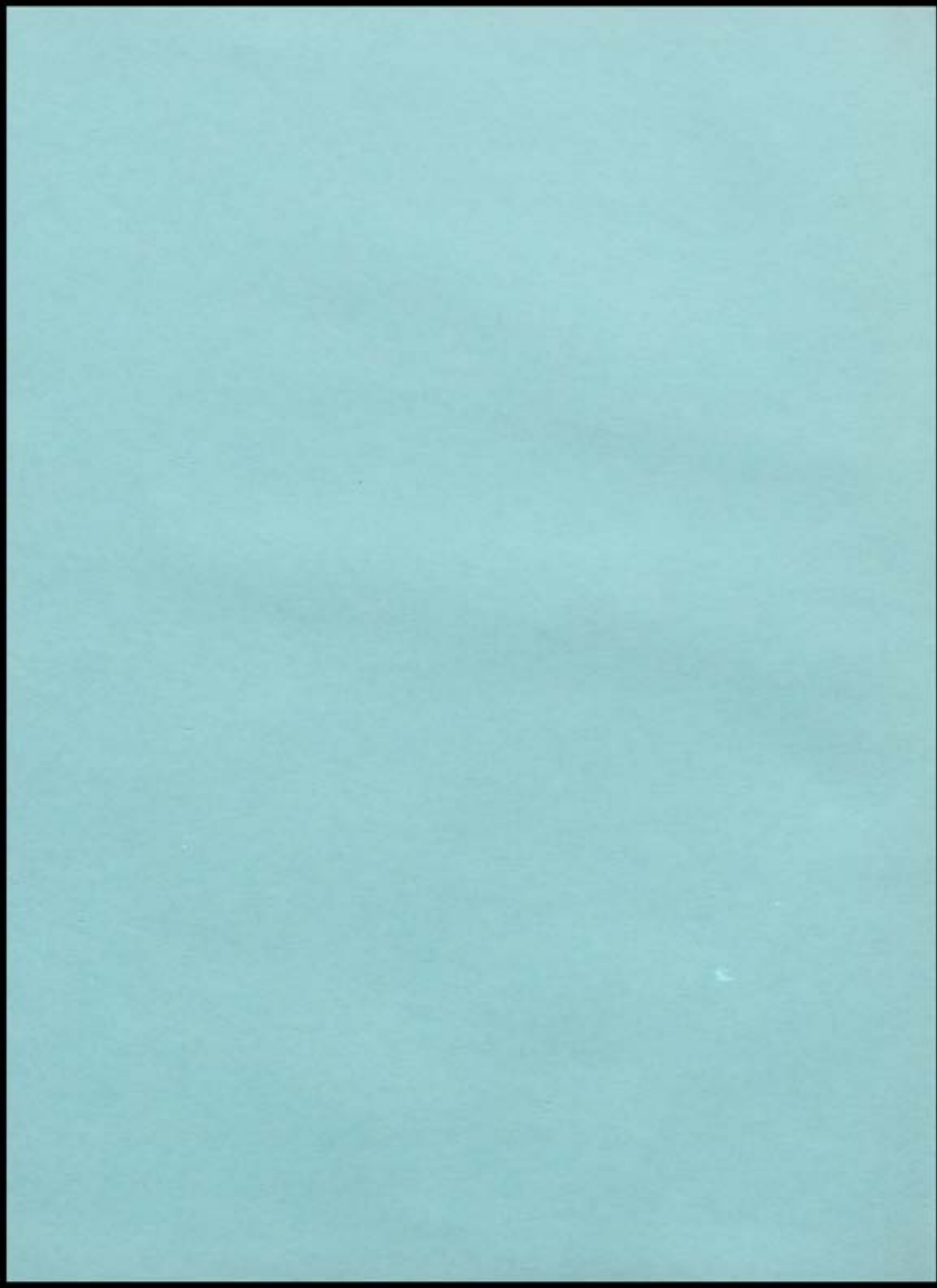

Dear Graduates of the Class of '83

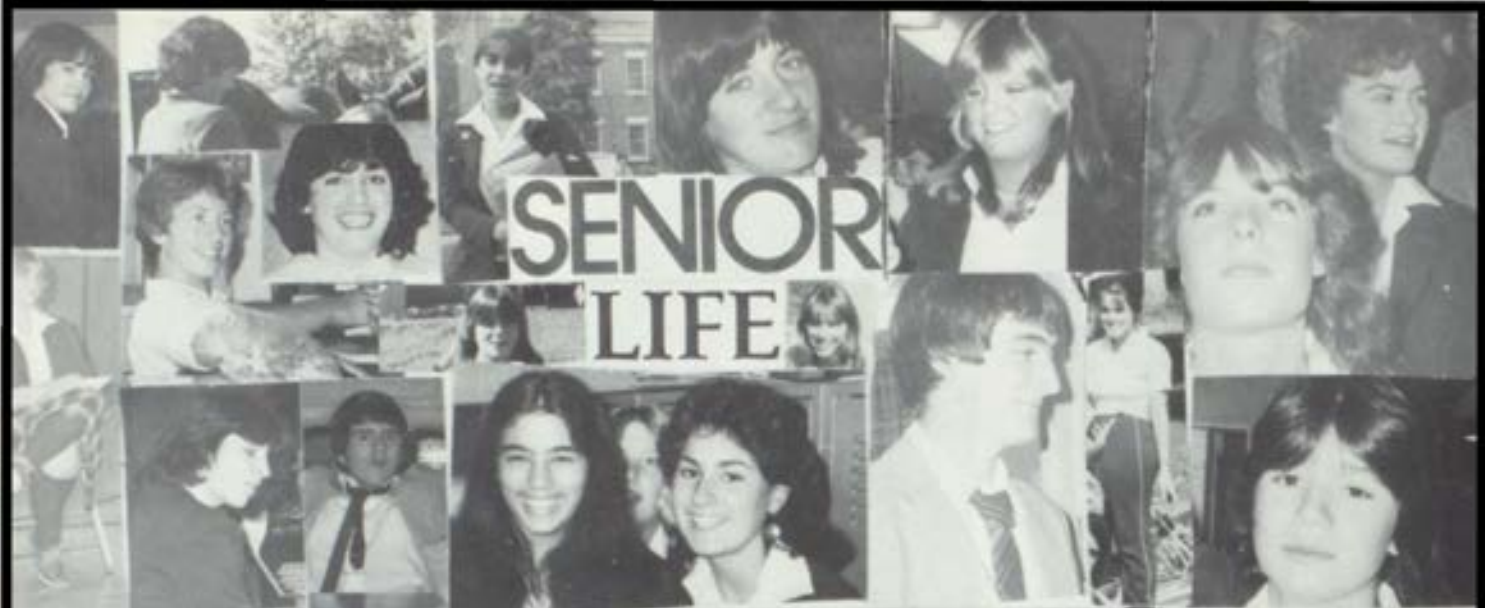

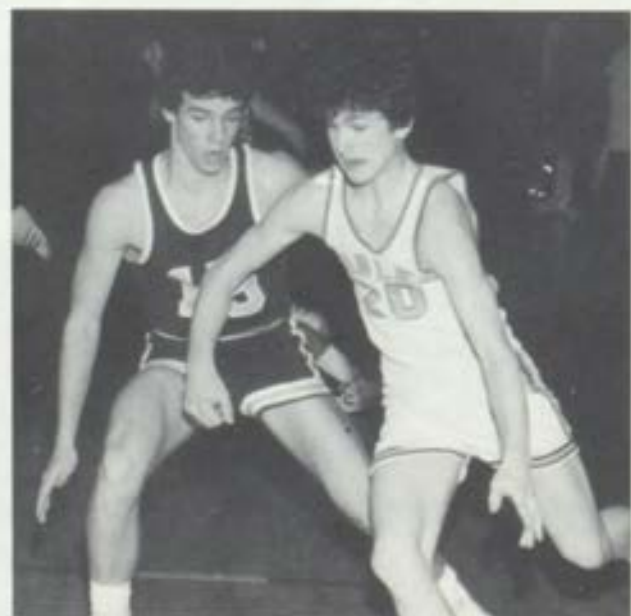
