

#### INTRODUCTION

Gun-collecting as a serious hobby or avocation seems to be reaching semi-epidemic proportions. Colts, Remingtons, S&W's, Winchesters, Mausers and so on all have their ardent partisans, but Luger collectors appear to constitute the fastest-growing branch of the fraternity.

In addition to the spontaneous appeal evoked by its superb handling and pointing qualities, the Luger's increasing and continuing popularity among collectors is assured. There are several reasons for this. In the first place the Luger enthusiast can frequently find a "collector's item" at "shooter" prices. Secondly, although many Luger variations are extremely scarce or genuinely rare, the new collector can still reasonably undertake to acquire a fairly representative assembly of the basic types. Finally, the Luger is intrinsically interesting because the definitive last word on its many variations has yet to be said, nor will it be for many years to come. Although the basic models are well known, the variations seem almost to be without limit. To the serious arms student and the avid collector the variations in themselves constitute an intriguing and stimulating challenge.

But while the many versions of the Luger contribute much to the collecting interest surrounding the gun, they can also be confusing and even intimidating to all but the most experienced. Fortunately, enlightenment and expert guidance are at hand in Fred Datig's carefully documented "The Luger Pistol," and Harry Jones' extensively illustrated and detailed "Luger Variations." These are the Luger collector's bibles, and both overflow with historical and descriptive information. If you collect Lugers, or are about to, both of these books are absolutely indispensable.

Why then this Identification Key? Simply to expedite a quick preliminary diagnosis or answer to "what is it?" The collector soon learns to distinguish between the various basic models, but the problem of identification is often complicated by the fact that a given model may have been produced in as many as twenty major and minor versions. Identification of a gun with one of the recognized Luger models or variations through the use of the Datig or Jones books often takes considerable time, precisely because both are so detailed and complete.

On the other hand, with this Key at least a tentative identification as to one of the 103 major or minor Luger variations should

require only about five minutes, often less. Nomenclature of the basic models and derived variations follows that suggested by Datig and Jones, with minor exceptions. After each identification a notation appears in parentheses, for example (J102), indicating the page in Jones' book where the gun is illustrated and described in detail, thus facilitating the final positive identification, or indicating points of variation.

#### TO USE THE KEY

To identify a Luger with the aid of this Key, the user makes a choice between one of two mutually-exclusive statements describing some feature of the gun. One will conform to the gun at hand, while the other will not. Acceptance of the correct statement directs the user to the next pair of descriptive statements, where the process is repeated until, by elimination, the final feature of the gun is confirmed and the identification is given.

EXAMPLE: The gun is a 9mm. Luger; it has a 4-inch barrel, undated and otherwise unmarked chamber, front toggle with the Mauser banner trademark, a stock lug, no grip safety. What is it?

We examine the first two descriptive choices. Choice 1a refers to guns with unmarked front toggles, and so it is immediately rejected because our gun carries the Mauser banner trademark. Choice 1b says "Front toggle marked with manufacturer's trademark; chamber unmarked or marked; cal. 7.65 or 9 mm., or.45 ACP; barrel length 3-5/8 — 20 inches; with or without stock lug and/or grip safety." These features cover those of the gun at hand so we accept this choice, which then directs us to proceed to 2.

Choice 2a describes guns bearing Mauser, Erfurt, or DWM markings, while choice 2b refers to guns marked otherwise. Choice 2a fits, and we follow directions to proceed to 3. Here the choice is between 3a, describing guns with the Mauser banner marking, or 3b which refers to guns carrying the Erfurt or DWM marks. Since the gun has the Mauser banner we follow 3a instructions to proceed to choice 4.

Choice 4a specifies guns having a grip safety but no stock lug, while 4b describes those lacking a grip safety but possessing the stock lug. The latter choice, 4b, is the one that fits our gun, so we follow instructions again and proceed to 6.

And here we hit pay dirt, since guns with unmarked chambers (6a) such as ours are distinguished from those which bear chamber markings (6b), and the gun is identified as a 1934 Mauser Commercial (J196), with a photograph of it to be found on page 196 of Jones' "Luger Variations."

It should be noted that a few identifications are followed by an asterisk in parentheses, (\*). These are variations not illustrated or described in Jones or Datig.

Note also that various .22 caliber versions and conversions of the Luger (for example, see J265, J267, J268, J270, J271, J272), and experimental models such as the machine pistol shown by Jones (p. 140) are not included in this Key, since they are not in any sense factory-standard. Omitted too are fervently-to-bedesired but thus far unauthenticated Lugers such as the 1914 Spandau, Venezuelan, Circle-HK 1934 Krieghoff, various 1900 and 1900/06 test models (see Datig, p. 200), Ethiopian, Finnish, Rumanian, "Baby" .32 ACP, etc., etc. These, and others may well exist, but as of the time of this writing they simply have not been verified.

Almost certainly the rapidly-growing interest in Lugers will result in the disclosure of variations not included here, or described by Jones and by Datig. On behalf of the collecting brother-hood at large, and for the sake of more complete and hence more useful future editions of this Key, the author would consider it a favor if he were supplied with a description and/or photograph(s) of any such "new" Luger.
