"Walther Pistols and Rifles", an excellent book and the only one of it's kind as it deals exclusively with Walther pistols and rifles. It starts with Model # 1 and takes you right up to the current make. Written by W.H.B. Smith who authored the famous book "Small Arms of the World", the book gives an insight on the structure of the Walther complex and some of the history of the company. Of paramount importance, the book devotes separate chapters to each model and pictures some of the ultra-rare Walthers not even seen by the most advanced collectors, such as the "KPK" and the final wartime P-38, the early Armeé model, the early HP model. The final wartime model was known as the Hi-Power model but never got into production. It was made mainly with stampings and had a revolving barrel locking system. Also the book has chapters devoted to the military P-38, the models PP and PPK. THIS BOOK IS NO LONGER IN PRINT. The publisher tells me that to reprint the book at today's high cost of labor and paper, the book would have to sell at \$ 12.00, so they discontinued the book. I have what I think is the last 50 copies in the U.S. These books are sure to be collectors pieces themselves in a few years. Some folks are ordering 2 copies, one to read and the other to keep as a collectors piece. Now, when my 50 books are gone, THERE WILL BE NO MORE, NO PLACE.
