- Luger, Serial #50069, 7.65mm. Here is the rarest and the most beautiful of ALL Lugers, the one and only 1902 Carbine as shown on pages 66 & 67. With the long, 11-3/4" tapered barrel, the graceful rifle type forepiece, dished toggle knobs, ramped rear sight, this is the FIRST Luger to have the stock lug. Old style extractor and flat "S" shaped recoil spring. This fine Luger has all matching serials. Magazine was not serialised in this model. In addition, the original stock with matching serials is included with the pistol. 98% PLUS original blue, the pistol has a high percentage of the original "gold" color on the bright parts, a fine bright bore, the grips are very good as is the magazines and the pistol is in excellent mechanical condition. These fine Lugers were originally designed for hunting, accounting for the barrel length and the beautifully checkered forepiece. The shoulder stock is in very good condition and as stated above, the serials match the pistol. The butt plate of the shoulder stock is made of horn and shows two small worm holes, not uncommon on these butt plates, but the holes do not detract from the appearance or value of the pistol. It isn't often these carbines are found on the market as most are tied up in private collections. This one is a beauty. This one has the extra recoil spring under the forepiece, often found missing in these pieces. The shoulder stock is shown on page 260 of Luger Variations. The former owner of the stock will Air Mail the stock to the buyer, carefully packed and fully insured. Price of pistol with stock, \$ 850.00. If you want the pistol ONLY, without the stock, the price is \$ 800.00. This price is down \$ 50.00 from my last list and if not sold from this list, I may keep this carbine for myself, since it is unusually nice and not "doggy" as many I have run across. Better get on the phone.
2. Here is Luger, Serial #10816, 7.65mm, the RARE 1900 American Eagle Luger with the metal backed grips that take the telescoping stock-holster. This scarce variation is shown on page 295, the telescoping stock-holster is shown on page 262 and acts as both a shoulder stock and holster for the pistol. The pistol comes complete with the stock-holster and the stock-holster will be Air Mailed to the buyer of the pistol, well packed and fully insured. Better than 90% of the original blue, wear only appears on the grip straps. All matching serials except the mag and of course these magazine end pieces were NOT serialised in this model. Bore is fair to good, excellent grips, in fine mechanical condition, the American spread eagle is over the chamber, sharp and bright. All original the pistol has the characteristics that distinguish the 1900 American Eagle Luger, with the 4-3/4" slender graceful barrel, squeeze grip safety, narrow trigger and wide trigger guard, flat extractor, "dished" toggle knobs and flat "S" shaped recoil spring. The stock holster is in the usual condition of these accessories, with a brown patina overall and a fine surface rust on the belt clip. Pistol and stock, \$ 400.00. Pistol ONLY, without stock, \$ 350.00. These are RARE and not often found on the market. Phone NOW.
3. Luger, Serial #56634, 7.65mm. This is the unusual looking and VERY desirable 1929 Swiss Luger as shown on pages 180 & 181. Here is the ONLY basic change in the Luger profile since it's inception from 1900 to 1944. The unusual front grip strap that is made in a straight line, the toggle knobs, locking bolt, magazine release and thumb safety made without checkering, and the step-down chamber makes of this Luger, the only one of it's kind. Like the 1924 Bern Swiss Luger, this pistol was made entirely in Switzerland, by the Swiss in their Bern Arsenal. In the finest condition I have seen this model, it is MINT throughout, finish, mechanically, and in the bore and grips. Stamped "P-51" on the left side of the chamber, this denotes the pistol was released for public sale in 1951. It has the Swiss Cross and Shield on the front toggle, the full serial on the rear toggle and left side rail, as well as around the "bell" of the barrel. All matching and in pristine condition throughout, here is a Luger that would grace the most meticulous of collections. If YOU are the collector who won't settle for anything but the BEST, then this Luger is for YOU. Here indeed is the SCARCE Luger at it's finest. Of course it is in mint mechanical condition too. Folks, I can only repeat what I said on my last list. Just like you can't buy a Cadillac at Ford prices, neither can you expect to buy a quality pistol at cut rate prices. The "bargain" Luger usually turns out to be a bargain for the seller, not the buyer and if the seller doesn't give you a guarantee, you are stuck with something you don't want and can't get your money back, so remember, it pays to deal with the respectable dealer who treats you as he wants to be treated.

4. Luger, Serial #19792, 7.65mm. Here is the 1906 Bern Swiss or more commonly called the 1924 Bern Swiss as it was first manufactured at the Bern Arsenal in that year. Shown on pages 112 & 113, this fine Luger is distinguished by the flat grips, the squeeze grip safety, the graceful looking 4 - 3/4" barrel and the toggle marking "Waffenfabrik Bern" on the front toggle. The flat, bordered grips make this a fine looking pistol and is the ONLY Luger made with this type grips. In near mint condition throughout, this fine pistol has at least 90% original blue, excellent grips, all matching serials (mags on this model NOT serialised) very good magazine and in perfect mechanical condition. Bore is beautifully bright. The gold on the bright parts is almost all intact. Generally recognised as the finest Lugers made, this Swiss is no exception and would make a wonderful addition to the finest collection. Not many Swiss Lugers get out of the country, which makes them scarce as most are avidly held in private collections. An excellent specimen of the first ALL SWISS made Luger. You may find one cheaper but you WON'T find one finer at my price. \$ 275.00
5. Luger, Serial #5256n. Here is the 1906 Swiss Commercial Luger in the popular 7.65mm caliber and shown on pages 82 & 83. This is NOT a so-called Swiss "rework" but is a Swiss Commercial and bears the Swiss Cross and Sunburst over the chamber and the word "Germany" on the right siderail. Like the other 1906 Commercial Lugers as described on pages 78 & 79, DWM did not spare quality when they made these pistols. All matching serials, the magazine is un-numbered which is proper for this model. 98% original blue, bright and shiny bore, like a mirror and the grips are very good. Good magazine and in excellent mechanical condition. Not many of these Commercial Swiss Lugers to be found. The serial number is also found on the left side of the chamber. Here is a real buy for those of you who appreciate beauty. Price, \$ 225.00
6. Luger, Serial #1591, 9mm. Here is the early "S" date coded Krieghoff Luger as shown on pages 222 & 223. The early Krieghoff S dated Luger had the walnut grips (see photo on page 222) as does this one. The serial alone gives proof of the early manufacture. The front toggle bears the anchor and the letters "HK" with the word "SUHL". The anchor was Krieghoff's trade mark, the HK meaning Hiram Krieghoff and the word Suhl denoting the pistol was made in the Krieghoff plant in Suhl, Germany. These Krieghoff's have a distinctive blue, NOT a black. This one has about 90% blue, very good grips, very good magazine, all matching serials except the magazine but the mag bears the Krieghoff proofs. In excellent mechanical condition, the bore is good, showing some wear. I made an error in pricing this one on my last list. It should have read \$ 175.00 instead of \$ 225.00 and the lists were all printed before I found the error. So the price is \$ 175.00 and my apologies to the folks who got list # 101.
7. Luger, Serial #29767, 7.65mm/ This is the 1906 American Eagle Luger as shown on pages 86-87 and is distinguished by the American spread eagle over the chamber, squeeze grip safety and the slenier 4 - 3/4" barrel. This Luger is about the best buy in this listing. It has about 70% original blue, all matching serials except the magazine, but mag is proper for this one and the grips are good, but worn. Bore is fair with sharp rifling, dark grooves. In very good mechanical condition, the first \$ 125.00 gets this Luger. Bet you can't beat that price.
8. Luger, Serial #8856, 9mm. Here is one for you folks who like shiny pistols. This is the 1914 (1914) model Naval Luger as shown on pages 134 & 135 and has been nickel plated many years ago. Serials don't all match on this one, but it is all nickelled and the bore is very good with some very light scattered pitting in the grooves. Has the 6" barrel and 100-200 meter rear sight. Very good grips and magazine and in excellent mechanical condition. If this were blue and all matching serials, it would sell at around \$ 200.00 but my price for this long distance, accurate shooter is only \$ 125.00. Don't get hurt in the rush, ORDER NOW.

9. Luger, Serial #52334, 9mm. Now this one is the 1908 Commercial Luger as shown on pages 118 and 119. This one is especially desirable as it was made without the holdopen device, not usually found on the commercial. This one has about 90% original blue, but some idiot has reblued the locking bolt and the sideplate shows a polished appearance. Still, it has all matching serials except the mag, but mag is proper with wooden end piece. Good bore with sharp rifling, darkness in the grooves. These models were made without the stock lug. Good grips, good magazine and in real nice mechanical condition, I would say excellent. Since only 4,000 of these early commercials were made, few are found on the market. \$ 95.00

10. Luger, Serial #5388, 9mm. Here is the 1908 Model, military, Third Issue as shown on pages 126 and 127. This one is an old arsenal reblued and made without the stock lug and holdopen device. Dated 1911 over the chamber, it has all matching serials except the magazine, but mag is the proper type with wooden end piece. About 99% blue, mag is in good condition, the bore is bright showing some use. Very good grips and in excellent mechanical condition. With ordinary care, a Luger will never wear out, and here is one over 55 years old to prove it. Not often one runs into this date Luger. Made by DWM, of course and the price is just \$ 85.00
11. Luger, Serial #8340, 9mm. Here is the Mauser Banner Luger, with the famed Mauser Banner on the front toggle, and dated 1941 over the chamber. Shown on pages 198 & 199, this is the military model and is distinguished by the sear safety, a flat strip of metal that fits over the top of the sideplate and down into the top of the sear. This prevents the pistol from being fired with the sideplate removed. All matching serials, possibly the magazine is matching too as it is the FXO (Haenel-Schmeisser) make with black plastic end piece. These mags were issued with this year date pistol and of course the plastic end pieces were NOT serialized. About 90% original blue, these Banner Lugers were treated with a VERY light coat of blue. Good bore that shows some use, very good grips and magazine and in excellent mechanical condition. The Mauser Banner Luger is always a popular piece for the collection and many collectors gather these pistols by year dates. Price on this one, \$ 120.00
12. Luger, Serial #3500, 9mm. Here is the "byf" coded Luger, made by Mauser and dated "41" over the chamber. Shown on pages 218 & 219, this model is one of the few Lugers made that has the "P.08" stamped on the side of the frame, and was issued with black checkered plastic grips. About 85% original blue, most of the wear shows on the grip straps. The pistol has all matching serials, the mag is the FXO with black plastic end piece and may possibly be original to the pistol. Bright shiny bore, very good magazine and excellent grips. A very good Luger with many years of good service left in it. Price is \$ 90.00
13. Luger, Serial #6311, 9mm. Now here is one Luger you won't find in the book. In the last bitter months of the war, the Nazi's, with their factories destroyed or crippled, their steel and other supplies dwindling, used every method they could to keep their arms in condition. Thus, weapons sent back to the makeshift arsenals were often pieced together with parts from another arm. This pistol is basically an S/42 Luger, with mixed serials. The sideplate, however, shows the ingenuity of the Germans in time of great shortages, as does the ejector. The sideplate is an experimental type, simple in construction, yet efficient in operation, the ONLY such sideplate I have seen and I have seen hundreds and hundreds of Lugers. The ejector, apparently being broken is of 2 piece construction and works very well. I have fired this pistol and I can say it works as efficiently as any other Luger. Good finish, bright bore, very good grips and mechanically very good, this is a prime example of a desperate nation trying to stave off defeat by using ingenious means to repair their weapons. Price is \$ 75.00
14. Luger, Serial #2104, 9mm. This one is the 1908 Bulgarian Luger as shown on pages 120 & 121 and probably one of the scarcest variations to be found. Several features distinguish this odd Luger, notably the lanyard loop is at the BOTTOM of the backstrap, the only such Luger so made, the safety markings are in Bulgarian as is the extractor, the front toggle bears the rampant Bulgarian lion within a shield, surmounted by the Bulgarian crown. The chamber bears the DWM monogram. The Bulgarian lion also appears on the right side of the chamber. Reblued, with mixed serials, the pistol is nonetheless ALL Bulgarian, frame, toggle and receiver. The grips are good, left one has a small chip out near the safety thumb piece, mag is good and the bore is bright. In very good mechanical condition. If this pistol were all matching and original finish, it would sell for \$ 400.00, but my price is just \$ 125.00
15. Luger, Serial #6039, 9mm. Here is the S/42 "K" dated Luger with the big "K" over the chamber, this letter indicating in code that it was made in 1934, by Mauser. Shown on pages 188-189, the pistol has been nicely reblued, has all matching serials including the magazine, but I suspect the magazine has been restamped to match the pistol. Parts have the scriptic "S" as is proper in this model, very good grips and magazine and in very good mechanical shape. It is price VERY low for a K date Luger. Make it yours for just \$ 110.00

16. Luger, Serial #7896, 9mm. This is the Mauser Banner Luger, with the famed Mauser Banner on the front toggle as shown on pages 198 & 199. The pistol has all matching serials and the mag may also be original as it is the Haenel-Schmeisser FXO type with black plastic end piece as issued with this year model. Dated 1941 over the chamber, it has about 90% original blue, a bright bore showing a bit of wear, very good grips and magazine. The blue wear shows mostly along the barrel, holster wear. The pistol has the sear safety. A very nice looking Luger at a sensible price on today's market. \$ 125.00
17. Luger, Serial #5672, 9mm. Here is the "S/42" code Luger, made by Mauser and dated 1936 over the chamber, as shown on pages 194 & 195. The bright parts still have some of the "gold" color, the pistol has all matching serials except the magazine. The magazine and grips are very good, the bore has some minor roughness in places that could possibly be scrubbed out or a few rounds fired through the barrel would clean it up some. About 95% original blue and in excellent mechanical condition. Price is just \$ 75.00
18. Luger, Serial #5716, 9mm. Here is the "42" code Luger, made by Mauser and dated 1939 over the chamber. All matching serials except the toggle, the pistol has KRIEGERHOFF brown plastic grips a beautifully bright bore, very good magazine and in top mechanical condition. A nice shooter for the man who loves to shoot the Luger but doesn't want to invest much. Price, \$ 65.00
19. Luger, Serial #3965, 9mm. Here is the 1920 Military by DWM and dated 1920 over the chamber, a VERY scarce military date and shown on pages 146 & 147. About 95% original blue, very good grips and magazine, all serials match except the magazine but mag is proper with wooden end piece, bore is good with sharp rifling, darkness in the grooves and the pistol is in excellent mechanical condition. Few of these dated DWM Lugers are seen with the 1920 date. A nice one priced sensibly, for your collection. Price, \$ 75.00
20. Luger, Serial #7460, 9mm. This one is the Mauser Banner Luger, dated 1939 over the chamber and bearing the famous Mauser Banner on the front toggle. Shown on pages 198 & 199, this is the military model with all matching serials except the magazine, but mag is proper, with the aluminum end piece. About 85% original blue with most wear showing along barrel and grips. Very good grips and magazine, the bore is bright, showing some wear. In excellent mechanical condition, a good buy at just \$ 110.00
21. Luger, Serial #4144, 9mm. Here is the "42" code Luger, made by Mauser and shown on pages 202 and 203. Dated 1940 over the chamber, the pistol has all matching serials and the magazine may also be original as it has the Haenel-Schmeisser FXO magazine with black plastic end piece as issued with this model luger. Very good grips, about 90% original blue, very good magazine, the bore is good, with sharp rifling, dark grooves. Lots of shooting left in this Luger yet. In excellent mechanical condition and priced sensibly at just \$ 80.00
22. Luger, Serial #1761, 9mm. This one is the "S/42" code Luger, made by Mauser and dated 1936 over the chamber. Shown on pages 194 & 195, this Luger has about 90% original blue, wearing a bit thin in places, all matching serials except the magazine. Mag is the FXO type with the aluminum end piece and in good condition. Very good grips, the bore is poor. Put a new barrel on this one and have a dandy shooter. In excellent mechanical shape, the price is a low, low \$ 60.00
23. Luger, Serial #7980, 9mm. Here is the "byr" coded Luger, made by Mauser and dated 42 over the chamber. 90% plus original blue, all matching serials except the magazine, mag is good and is the FXO type with aluminum end piece. Excellent grips of black plastic as issued and the bore is about good, sharp rifling with dark grooves. A nice looker. \$ 75.00
24. Luger, Serial #5767, 9mm. This is the "G" date Luger, with the large "G" over the chamber, denoting the pistol as a 1935 Mauser make. An S/42, this model followed the "K" date luger and in 1936, Mauser started using the numeral dating. This pistol has all matching serials except the magazine, but the mag bears G date proofs. About 85% original blue, wearing thin it has excellent grips, very good magazine, poor bore. In excellent mechanical condition, the G and K dated Lugers are becoming scarce and hard to find. This one, \$ 75.00. Page 192
25. Luger, Serial #4745, 9mm. Here is the Mauser Banner Luger, dated 1939 over the chamber and with the Mauser Banner on the front toggle. All matching serials except the magazine, but mag is proper with aluminum end piece. About 90% original blue, with most wear showing on the grip straps, very good grips and magazine, bright bore showing a bit of wear and in the most excellent mechanical shape. Has the sear safety. A dandy at \$ 110.00
26. Luger, Serial #3813, 9mm. Here is the "42" code Luger, made by Mauser and shown on pages 202 & 203. Nicely reblued, all serials match, except magazine, very good grips and mag, the bore is excellent. No serials on barrel. A fine shooter and in excellent mechanical condition. If you can beat this price, let me know. Just \$ 65.00

7. Luger, Serial #6252, 7.65mm. Here is one that isn't in the book. It shows no markings on the top of the toggle, apparently removed. It seems obvious it once was an Erfurt Luger. All the serials match except the mag, the trigger guard bears Arabic cyrillic that I am told, means "Police". The left side of the chamber is numbered in the military style, the right side bears commercial Crown over N proofs on the chamber, breech block and front toggle. The bore is 7.65 (.30 caliber), the barrel bearing a Crown over N and the letter 7.6m/m. History of this pistol is unknown but can be assumed it was used for Police purposes in the near east. Looks like an old arsenal reblue with about 95% finish, good but worn grips, good magazine with aluminum end piece, an odd Parkerized like case, a little gold left on the bright parts, beautifully bright bore, in excellent mechanical condition. Here is a real mystery piece, an excellent shooter and rare conversational piece. Price is \$ 75.00
28. Luger, Serial #2964, 9mm. This one is the S/42 "K" date Luger as shown on pages 188 & 189 and made by Mauser in 1934. All serials match on this one, except the magazine, but mag is proper with aluminum end piece. D&L finish reblue, it has good grips, good magazine, the bore is bright but beginning to show wear. In excellent mechanical condition, you will not find another "K" date Luger at this price. Has the big "K" over the chamber and various parts are marked with the "S". Price just \$ 85.00
29. Luger, Serial #258, 9mm. Here is the 1914 Erfurt Luger military, with the crown and Erfurt on the front toggle and dated 1917 over the chamber. MILITARY P-38 PISTOLS

Before I start listing the military P-38 pistols, I thought maybe you might be interested in making an acquaintance with the different manufacturers of this pistol. Wartime codes assigned to the various makers are as follows: Those with slide marked "480" and "AC" were made by Walther, the originator of the P-38; slides marked "SWW" and "byf" were made by Mauser and slide markings carrying the "cyq" markings were made by Spreuerke, an arsenal directly controlled by the Nazi's in Spandau-Berlin. The P-38 is a double action pistol, very similar in action to a revolver, as by pulling the trigger, it draws back the hammer and lets it fall, in one movement, just as does the double action revolver.
