





FROM PETER HISCHIER to JOE WOTKA: In response to your latest comments about the use of caliber .22 pistols in the death camps, let me make the following brief observations. First, Pery Broad had an American father, spoke English, and was interrogated by British Army Intelligence, so I believe that his "original" statements were in English. A German language version you just presented is thus a translation which a German-speaking friend tells me contains many mistakes. Second, in the "Naked Puppets", page 91, it states that the 3 executioners "hid their already loaded weapons behind their backs..." and this could only be done with pistols. Third, Mr. Wielgus now provides a new reference from another book "The Auschwitz Chronicle", page 74, with the words "The SS men kill them with shots from a short, small-caliber gun" which is the description of a .22 pistol. Fourth, you have revealed that Auschwitz Commandant Hoes used the phrase "a small caliber revolver" to kill inmates, and this is a reference to a .22 caliber hand gun. I would note that the British (his interrogators) often refer to all forms of pistols as "revolvers". Fifth, John Pearson has provided references to several Walther caliber .22 pistols that are documented as having come from various death camps. I believe that taken together these facts offer clear proof that caliber .22 pistols were used to kill inmates in the death camps. I am sure that other types of guns and many other methods were also used to kill in the death camps. I now feel that this issue has been resolved and I plan on making no further comments on this topic.
