Participant Code of Conduct

Each participant of the Diversity Ed **QT Camp 2023** is expected to adhere to the following:

- 1. Attend the FULL QT Camp and participate in ALL activities as outlined by QT Camp schedule and/or Camp Counselors.
- Miscellaneous / Extra Costs: Diversity Ed will be providing accommodation and meals for each participant at camp. However, any extra or outside costs will NOT be covered. This includes, but is not limited to, travel (coming to and leaving the Via Rail station in London, ON), early departure from the camp (due to illness, lack of interests, etc.).
- 3. Please reach out to inform Diversity Ed. of your travel arrangements, if you are local to Southwestern Ontario or can have your arranged transportation directly to the campgrounds, that is ideal. However, if you will be arriving by train to the Via Rail station in London, then please advise what time you will arrive at
- 4. so we can arrange your transportation from London to the campgrounds.
- 5. All youth are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that is respectful and ensures the safety of themselves, other participants and mentors, presenters, and staff. This includes following forum rules as outlined at any point, staff instructions, campus rules, local, provincial, and federal laws and bylaws, and directions of any emergency personnel.
- 6. Failure to complete and/or adhere to this code of conduct may result in being separated and/or denied taking part in the camp until travel arrangements can be made (at the participant's expense) to be sent home.
