The younger Boomers continue to show their generosity—thanks!



IRA Charitable Rollovers

For alumni who are retired or are nearing retirement, it may be time in your financial life for "Required Minimum Distributions" from your IRA. Below is an option suggested by Roger Mjoen (A Γ 790). Please consider making an **IRA Charitable Rollover** to one of the Alpha-gamma Zeta's charitable 501(c)(3) endowment/ scholarship funds administered by the USD Foundation.

IRA Distribution to Tax Saving Solution

If you have an IRA, you may be concerned about Required Minimum Distributions. You have been saving all your life, and now the government is forcing you to take money from it. But you have choices!

Required Minimum Distribution Changes

The rules for IRAs have changed in recent years, and you need to know your options. Discover a way to avoid or reduce paying income tax on your IRA's required distribution. You can also create a new income stream with your IRA, as there is no cost or obligation.

The IRA Charitable Rollover Was Created in 2006

It was made permanent by Congress in 2015. This giving plan is available for IRA owners who are over age $70\frac{1}{2}$. It is a direct transfer from an IRA to a public charity.

Prior to the IRA Charitable Rollover:

- Some individuals would take withdrawals from their IRAs,
- report the distribution as taxable income,
- make a cash gift to charity,
- obtain the required receipts for charitable gifts over \$250,
- and take a deduction on their tax return.

Not only was this process rather cumbersome, it also resulted in increased adjusted gross income. With higher income, you may have paid more income tax on Social Security or paid a *higher Medicare Part B premium. That is why an IRA charitable rollover may be a great option for you!*

The IRA Charitable Rollover is Very Simple:

- An IRA owner who has reached the age of 70¹/₂ may transfer up to \$100,000 per year.
- The transfer is made directly from the IRA to a qualified public charity.
- The IRA rollover is not taxable on your income tax return, so there is no need for a tax deduction.
- The rollover must occur prior to yearend, so ask your IRA administration now!
- It is a simple and effective way to make a charitable gift.

We have seven charitable 501(c)(3) endowment/scholarship funds (listed in order of creation) administered by the USD Foundation, with their total amounts as of May 31, 2024 (including endowment, spendable earnings, and available for future use).

According to Jeff Esbenshade, who has managed our scholarships at USD for decades, by law every foundation must pay out 4.5% of their assets annually. We award about \$30,000 in scholarships each year to our undergraduate members. The USD Foundation charges 1.5% annual management fee. The total value of the USD Foundation is

over \$300 million and has a net return of over 9% for the past 10 years. We hold the second largest Greek organization endowment at USD (Alpha Phis are first). Nick Bratvold is our current Scholarship Committee chairman.

Smart Guys—Are we Returning to Our Roots?

After maintaining our alumni directory for the last four years or so, I've started to notice certain trends. One of the things I noticed was that many of our Founding Fathers later earned advanced degrees, such as M.D.s, Ph.D.s and J.D.s. Those guys were smart! And they worked hard, with a keen interest in furthering their education. Many went on to teach at colleges and universities.

A much smaller percentage of the population obtained higher education prior to World War II, and the advent of the G.I. Bill that enabled many more to obtain post-secondary education.

In visiting with brothers from the late 1960s and early 1970s, I learned that many brothers who might not have considered college decided to go to avoid the draft during the Vietnam War.




But it got me thinking about how our brotherhood has changed over it's 108 -year history, and continues to evolve.

The cur-

rent Active Chapter achieved the highest Grade Point Average (GPA) among Greek chapters this last semester (Spring 2024) with a chapter average of 3.50!

I can't recall in living memory a Lambda Chi GPA that high—or any Greek house, for that matter. A 3.50 would have even beat the Thetas of the 1990s (your author's era)!

In fact, many of them went on to grad school to extend their college deferments. But many ended up serving our country anyway, and we've sought to honor all military veterans on our website, which shows a spike in servicemen during the late 1960s and early 1970s.



In fact, all of the fraternities today have some smart guys. The lowest GPA last semester were the Tekes, with a 2.87. That would have been one of the highest fraternity GPAs in the 1990s.

The percentage of brothers graduating in each decade who received advanced degrees such as M.D.s, Ph.D.s, Ed.D.s, J.D.s, D.O.s, O.D.s, D.D.S.s, etc. (We do not have records of master's degrees.)

*There are still six years left in the 2020s, and many advanced degrees are earned four years after graduating with a bachelor's degree.


It made me wonder—are we seeing a return to the val-

ues and types of men who founded our chapter? I decided to crunch the numbers, with the information our directory contains.

It turns out that the earliest brothers were indeed high achievers, with about 14% of them obtaining advanced degrees. But it was actually the brothers who graduated in the 1970s who had the most—about 16% of them earned advanced degrees.



The number seems to be rising again the 2020s isn't even

half over, and of course most advanced degrees are earned years after a bachelor's degree.

It is also interesting to compare the total number of initiates each decade. There was a large bump in the Post-War years, probably due to the G.I. Bill paying for returning servicemen's higher education. We then saw the Baby Boomers' bulge come through, with the spike of graduates in the 1970s and 1980s. The early 2000s was a difficult time for our chapter, with two membership reviews, in addition to slowing demographics.

Today, it appears that we are once again returning to smaller class sizes, as our chapter had in the early 20th Century, but with seemingly more serious students.



The General Assembly is the legislative body that deliberates and votes on proposals to change our laws and




that elects members of the Grand High Zeta. The Stead Leadership Seminar is an educational experience designed to help our men grow and develop, both personally and professionally.
