THE PARSON'S TALE

My heart swelled with inordinate pride as our Church Corporation recently held is first hybrid meeting on January 24th. A small group gathered socially distanced— in the Sanctuary and a much larger group gathered on Zoom. Through the wonders of modern technology and the tireless work of the AV Booth, we were able to see and hear each other, to deliberate on church business, and to vote.

This experience—which was truly thrilling for me—prompted me to reflect on how quaint this accomplishment will seem to those who make up the First Baptist Church in twenty-five or fifty years from now. What was a giant technological leap for us, for them will seem elementary. I think it will be as twee as the long defunct gaslight fixtures we still have in the sanctuary and other places around the building—a reminder that a generation or two ago our resources and abilities were markedly different.

In 1910 the great American Baptist thinker, Walter Rauschenbusch, published his volume *Prayers of the Social Awakening*. Near the end of this book, he included a "Prayer for Those Who Come After Us." In this spirit, I would like you to join me in praying with Rev. Rauschenbusch for those who will inherit the church and the world we are building for them.

O GOD, we pray thee for those who come after us, for our children and the children of our friends, and for all the young lives that are marching up from

the gates of birth, pure and eager, with the morning sunshine on their faces. We remember with a pang that these will live in the world we are making for them.

We are wasting the resources of the earth in our headlong greed, and they will suffer want. We are building sunless houses and joyless cities for our profit, and they must dwell therein. We are making the burden heavy and the pace of work pitiless, and they will fall wan and sobbing by the wayside. We are poisoning the air of our land by our lies and our uncleanness, and they will breathe it.

O God, ... [h]elp us to break the ancient force of evil by a holy and steadfast will and to endow our children with purer blood and nobler thoughts. Grant us grace to leave the earth fairer than we found it; to build upon it cities of God in which the cry of needless pain shall cease; and to put the yoke of Christ upon our business life that it may serve and not destroy.

Lift the veil of the future and show us the generation to come as it will be if blighted by our guilt, that our lust may be cooled and we may walk in the fear of the Eternal. Grant us a vision of the far-off years as they may be if redeemed by the sons of God, that we may take heart and do battle for thy children and ours.

MOMENTS IN HISTORY FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, MEDFORD February Moments

1948 During the first Youth Week, the various church offices were taken over by the young people and they were included in the officer's Council meeting. The week was concluded with a Candlelight Communion and Consecration Service.

1964 Boston East Baptist Bible School Association had their convention here at FBC during Youth Week. June Carlson was Youth Pastor and Richard Ryti was Associate Youth Pastor this year. There was a banquet with Rev. Robert Miller as the speaker. Dr. Orlando Tibbetts was the speaker at the Youth Communion Service, which, it was noted by the Historian, was well attended by youth, but poorly by adults.

1985 On February 10, the Director of the Department of Special Needs Ministries, TABCOM, Rev. Roger MacDonald, was our guest, and spoke on "Opening Windows."

1982 The Rev. Robert Willett, who inaugurated Youth Week, when he was our Minister of Education, paid us a surprise visit on the first Sunday of Youth Week. Irene Purdy and Kimberly Tillis were the Youth Pastors and they spoke that day on, "What My Faith Means to Me." On the second Sunday of Youth Week this year the message was "I Take Communion Because...," led by the youth with members of the congregation taking part by speaking informally during the service.

1990 A new steel bulkhead door to the basement of 34 Oakland Street was completed, only one of many, many accomplishments of our Property Committee over the years. A few of our young people attended Winter Camp at Grotonwood.

2020 Dr. Nancy Crandall announced her retirement as Organist and Choir Director, effective at the end of the choir season in early June.




EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBER FOR FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

GATHERING AT THE LORD'S TABLE ON FEBRUARY 7

On Sunday, February 7th, we will gather around the table for Holy Communion. Communion will be distributed in sterile, pre-packaged, single serve cups.

For those worshipping virtually, there are two ways to participate in Holy Communion AFTER the service.

+ The pastors will be available in front of the church on Oakland Street from Noon to 12:30 to distribute the elements from the Table.
+ The Deacons or Communion Ministers will bring the elements from the Table to your house.
+ If you have registered to attend the in-person service, you do not need to reserve Communion.

DONATING TO FBC USING YOUR BANK'S AUTOMATIC BILL

It's simple and it's free! Even though your pledge donations to **First Baptist Church** aren't technically "bills," you can still set it up to have your bank send one-time or recurring gifts to **FBC**. **Here are some guidelines to help you get this set up with your bank**.

1. Follow the directions on your bank's website

to set up a new bill or payee

2. If given a choice, choose to pay a company rather than a person.

3. In the space for "Company Name" enter: **First Baptist Church**

4. In the space for "Company Address" enter:

Attn: Financial Secretary 34 Oakland Street Medford, MA 02155

5. In the space for "Company Phone Number" enter: 781.396.3811

6. In the space for "Account Number" enter your first initial and your last name, for example: MRASURE

7. After you have set up First Baptist Church as a biller, it is added to your list of bills or payees and you can select it at any time and enter a payment amount and a payment date8. You will also have the option of setting up automatic or recurring payments (this adds greater convenience but is not recommended if there is a risk of overdrawing from your account)

Bill Pay is usually a free service of your checking account, but some banks charge a monthly fee for their bill pay service which can be waived depending on account balance, etc.

The church is not charged any fees for receiving a donation through your bank's bill pay service, so what you donate is what will appear on your annual giving statements.

We finished the year with a positive cash balance. Having received a PPP loan from the federal government was instrumental in enabling us to close out the year in the black. The loan has been forgiven since it was used for salaries. However, we face challenges in the coming year with the closing of Oakland Park Children's Center at the end of June. This has been a significant source of income. The Property and Finance Committees are looking for other potential renters.
