## THE PARSON'S TALE

Martin Rinkart was a Lutheran pastor who lived and ministered in the city of Eilenburg, Germany in the early 1600s. While the Pilgrims in Massachusetts colony were only just arriving, Europe was engaged in one of the longest and bloodiest conflicts the world had yet seen, *The Thirty Years War*. The city of Eilenburg was overrun three times in the course of those years. According to certain records in 1637 there was an outbreak of disease, and Pastor Martin was the only minister surviving in the city. During that year he performed around 4000 funerals. That is around 75 funerals a week, every week for a year. Among the funerals Pastor Martin officiated was one for his wife. He was living through who can only be called hell. It was from this hell of disease, war, and fear that Pastor Martin penned the words that we remember him for today.

*Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices,  
Who wondrous things has done, in Whom this world rejoices;  
Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way  
With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.*

*O may this bounteous God through all our life be near us,  
with ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us,  
to keep us in his grace, and guide us when perplexed,  
and free us from all ills of this world in the next.*

In this story the hungry are fed, the weary are comforted, and all fears are laid to rest, because God's people are ready to rise to the occasion.

Pastor Martin knew this was true a long, long time ago. Now is the time for each of us to live into this truth more and more.

**MOMENTS IN HISTORY**  
**FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, MEDFORD**  
**May Moments**

**1820** After much interest by a few friends who were in favor of a Baptist church in Medford in 1818 and 1819, the first baptism took place in the Mystic River on May 3. (This is one of the oldest bits of our church history.)

**1973** The Monday Evening Bible Classes ended because Pastor Herman Gerrish moved to Maine.

**1975** Special recognition was made of Marjorie Skillin's more than 20 years of service in various capacities of Christian Education-not only here at FBC, but also in the Adoniram Judson Association, and in the Boston Baptist Bible Sunday School Association.

**1976** Geneva Curry, one of our women, was honored at House Party (a statewide American Baptist Women's event) in May of 1976. Geneva was one of three women who in **1947**, were the "architects" of the Scholarship Fund for the benefit of Massachusetts Baptist girls.

**1978** "Alive in Christ" was the theme adopted at the May planning session. This was used as motivation for all programs and church projects for the year. Also in May, after their successful trip to West Virginia, the Youth Alliance sponsored an "Evening of Appreciation" for the church community for the congregation's support for the trip.

**1994** For the second time the Women's Federation and the Zeta Alpha Sunday School class combined to present a May Mother and Daughter Banquet. Rev. Jean Duecker rededicated the officers of both groups. Carmela and Jennifer Quick led devotions, and we were entertained by a barber shop quartet of terrifically good, harmonizing voices.

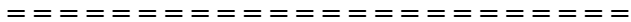

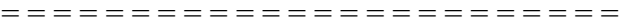

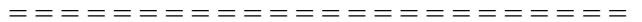
**UNITED BAPTIST WOMEN OF MEDFORD NEWS**

## DONATING TO FBC USING YOUR BANK'S AUTOMATIC BILL PAY

It's simple and it's free! Even though your pledge donations to **First Baptist Church** aren't technically "bills," you can still set it up to have your bank send one-time or recurring gifts to **FBC**. **Here are some guidelines to help you get this set up with your bank.**

1. Follow the directions on your bank's website to set up a new bill or payee
2. If given a choice, choose to pay a company rather than a person.
3. In the space for "Company Name" enter: **First Baptist Church**.
4. In the space for "Company Address" enter:  
Attn: Financial Secretary  
34 Oakland Street  
Medford, MA 02155
5. In the space for "Company Phone Number" enter: 781.396.3811
6. In the space for "Account Number" enter your first initial and your last name, for example: MRASURE
7. After you have set up First Baptist Church as a biller, it is added to your list of bills or payees and you can select it at any time and enter a payment amount and a payment date
8. You will also have the option of setting up automatic or recurring payments (this adds greater convenience but is not recommended if there is a risk of overdrawing from your account)

Bill Pay is usually a free service of your checking account, but some banks charge a monthly fee for their bill pay service which can be waived depending on account balance, etc.

The church is not charged any fees for receiving a donation through your bank's bill pay service, so what you donate is what will appear on your annual giving statements.

We need to revitalize our Mission, Outreach and Social Concern (MOSC) Board. Presently there are two members: Marie Paul and Chuck Shepherd. In order to do the work necessary to spread the word about the four annual offerings: America for Christ, World Mission, Retired Minister and Missionary and One Great Hour of Sharing, to continue our work with the Medford Family Shelter on Central Ave, to decide about where our mission dollars will be donated, and many other things, we need to recruit people who have a heart for mission.

For the time being, the Board of Christian Education has been taking on the MOSC duties. Barbara Drauschke has information about being a TABCOM Mission Advocate, from a workshop she attended in January.
