In-Person Learning at St. Mary Magdalen



Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of St. Louis are making plans for returning to in-person learning. Saint Mary Magdalen Catholic School will be returning on August 20 and prioritizing the health of the children. Saint Mary Magdalen has been working diligently over the summer to clean and disinfect all areas of the school for the safe return of the children.

A Coronavirus operations/safety plan handbook has been developed outlining all of the precautions that will be set in place. Mrs. Wiseman, Principal of Saint Mary Magdalen, teachers and parents from the medical field were in collaboration to insure the safety of the children. Before the start of the school day children and staff will complete a health screening

and will have their temperatures taken before entering the building. The classrooms have been set up for social distancing, masks will be worn and grades will be staying with their cohorts. The school building will be constantly disinfected throughout the day and non-essential people will not be allowed to enter the building. Knowing children are starved to be in a

community and have interaction with others, Saint Mary Magdalen feels face to face education is the best way to continue to bring the mission of our church and our school to our families while keeping healthy and safe. We are excited to bring the students back to Saint Mary Magdalen knowing their safety and health are our number one priority.

MISSOURI BOTANICAL GARDEN JAPANESE FESTIVAL CANCELLED FOR 2020
Garden will still hold special activities Labor Day Weekend

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Missouri Botanical Garden and its partners have decided to cancel the 2020 Japanese Festival for the first time in its 44-year history.

Since 1977, the Garden has proudly hosted this unique event in one of the largest Japanese gardens in North America. The festival, held on Labor Day weekend, is a prolific collaboration with several local Japanese-American organizations and provides authentic Japanese music, art, dance, food and entertainment for thousands of visitors each year.

While the typical Japanese Festival will not be held this year, the Garden will still host some special activities on Labor Day Weekend. The Garden will offer extended hours throughout the weekend, with last entry at 7 p.m.

The private Teahouse Island of the Japanese Garden will be open for guided public tours on Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. Normally closed to the public, visitors can see the Garden’s soan, the farm hut-style teahouse, which was a gift from Missouri’s sister state of Nagano prefecture in Japan. Originally built in Japan, the teahouse was reassembled on-site by Japanese craftsmen and dedicated during a Shinto ceremony in 1977. Visitors can also see a snow-viewing lantern, yukimi-doro, a gift from St. Louis’ sister city of Suwa, Japan. Teahouse Island tour tickets are \$10 in addition to Garden admission. The maximum group size per tour is 10 people.

On Saturday and Sunday evenings, the Garden will offer Candlelight Walks and Toro Nagashi, a lantern ceremony held in partnership with the St. Louis-Suwa Sister Cities Committee. Late summer in Japan means Obon, the festival when spirits of the dead return to spend time with the living. The Toro Nagashi ceremony celebrates this. Lanterns are inscribed with the names of those deceased, then lit and set afloat as a way of accompanying the spirits as they depart for another year. Entry is at 7:30 p.m. and lanterns will be launched just after 8 p.m. Tickets will be available online only and capacity is limited to 250 people each night. Tickets will include the cost of the lantern, which guest will receive upon arrival.

“For the first time in more than four decades, the decision to cancel the Garden’s Japanese Festival was a difficult one, but necessary in light of the current situation,” said Dave Lowry, Japanese Activities Committee Chairman. “The Japanese Activities Committee hopes the lantern release will be a suitable way to commemorate those who have been lost to us this year. We look forward to next year’s festival.”

The Missouri Botanical Garden is located at 4344 Shaw Blvd. in south St. Louis, accessible from Interstate 44 at the Vandeventer exit and from Interstate 64 at the Kingshighway North and South exit. Free parking is available on site and two blocks west at the corner of Shaw and Vandeventer.

Bayer Fund Artists-in-Training Program 2020 Auditions

The Bayer Fund Artists-in-Training Program (AIT) is designed to identify, coach, and encourage promising young high school singers both on and offstage. This nationally acclaimed program provides rigorous vocal training meant to supplement in-school music education classes, and also teaches lifelong lessons about goal-setting, hard work, and perseverance.

AIT offers seven months of college-level voice lessons to approximately 20 high school students in the St. Louis community, who are selected through an open and free audition process. Students will also experience performances and programming by Opera Theatre of Saint Louis, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, the St. Louis Black Repertory Theatre, the Repertory Theatre of St. Louis, Jazz St. Louis, Dance St. Louis, and more.

In addition to students’ weekly vocal lessons, Opera Theatre hires internationally and nationally recognized artists to work with AIT students during seasonal residencies. Visiting artists have included operatic legends such as Martina Arroyo, Harolyn Blackwell, Christine Brewer, Vinson Cole, Denyce Graves, Kathleen Kaun, Erie Mills, George Shirley, Marietta Simpson, Everett McCorvey, Sylvia McNair, and Barbara Smith Conrad.

Each year culminates with a public Spring Recital, at which AIT’s talented young singers are awarded more than \$13,000 in scholarships for college or further vocal study. This inspiring event is one of the highlights of Opera Theatre’s annual calendar.

Auditions will take place online via Zoom.

Who May Audition

Students entering grades 10–12 for the 2020–2021 school year with a current GPA of 2.5 or higher, who are currently participating in high school choirs or other vocal programs.

Weekly Vocal Lessons

Lessons are 45 minutes in length and take place after school either online or at one of four locations: SIU – Edwardsville, Washington University, Webster University, or the University of Missouri – St. Louis. Teachers will be assigned. Transportation is available to those who qualify for assistance.

Tuition

Tuition is \$850. This includes costs for private lessons, master classes, extracurricular activities, and two overnight retreats. Payment plans are available, and financial aid is offered to those who qualify. For more questions about financial aid, please call (314) 963-4251 or email mfisher@opera-stl.org.

Audition Preparation

Students must prepare two selections from any of the following: opera, art song, musical theater, spiritual, or folk song. These selections should showcase the student’s vocal range and capabilities. Students must be prepared to start over, repeat a section, or not finish a prepared selection. Students are strongly encouraged to use pre-recorded piano accompaniment for their audition selections. Auditions are closed to everyone except members of the audition panel. Prior to their audition, students must supply a typed paragraph describing why they should be considered for this program, a copy of their most recent report card.

CMT, Metro Transit and SCCTD Seek to Increase Transit Usage as Residents Visit STL Attractions this Summer



As local communities continue to reopen, Citizens for Modern Transit (CMT), Metro Transit and St. Clair County Transit District (SCCTD) today launched the Board, Explore & Win campaign to reinforce how easy it is to utilize the region’s safe, reliable and robust public transportation system to access hundreds of St. Louis’ hottest attractions. From Tuesday, July 14, through Monday, August 31, individuals visiting St. Louis area destinations via MetroLink or MetroBus can log their trip at www.cmt-stl.org by entering their name, email address, venue visited and route taken. Each trip they track equals an entry to win a weekly prize package for restaurants and other venues accessible via public transit.

To aid in these summer adventures, a St. Louis Transit Passport has been released. It serves as a 2020 guide to exploring some of the top, local tourist destinations and provides instructions on how to get to each via transit. “As the region reopens, more and more people are getting out and visiting area attractions,” commented Kimberly Cella, Executive Director of Citizens for Modern Transit. “In doing so, we want to remind people that MetroLink and MetroBus can safely get you where you want to go.”

Metro Transit continues to execute enhanced cleaning and disinfecting protocols, provide personal protective equipment for front-line team members, and require that all riders wear face masks while riding on Metro Transit vehicles. The transit agency installed 38 hand-washing stations along the system, launched a contactless mobile fare payment via the Transit application, added polycarbonate shields on 425 buses and posted signage to encourage individuals to follow CDC guidelines.

K-12 Virtual Learning for 1st Quarter

On July 29, the Board of Education voted to conduct all K-12 academic programs virtually for the first quarter of the school year. Currently, the Brentwood Early Childhood Center is expected to remain open and in-service for our families at the start of the school year. As we have stated regularly, our plans for the Fall of 2020 have been constantly evolving based on the latest information regarding the pandemic. Since our last communication, we have been in ongoing communication with health officials while we’ve reviewed feedback from our community and collaborated with other area districts.

The number of positive COVID-19 cases continues to rise in our region. In order to ensure we are doing everything we can to protect our students, staff, and families from this pandemic, we have made the difficult decision to begin the school year completely virtually. Virtual learning will take place for all of the first quarter, but we will continue to evaluate if it is safe to reopen at the beginning of the second quarter.

Additionally, the Board of Education voted to change the first day of student instruction to Thursday, August 27th. While other districts have delayed the start of school until after Labor Day, we feel the additional 3 days to work with teachers and families on the transition to virtual learning will be sufficient in having a successful start to the school year. The school year will now begin on August 27th and virtual learning will continue through Friday, October 23rd. Prior to this date, the Board of Education will determine if it is safe to have students return to campus at the end of the first quarter.

Brentwood will still offer two academic programs for students. All along, we’ve made plans for possible closures of our traditional, on campus program due to the number of COVID cases. Under our current circumstances and the repeated recommendations of the County Executive to provide virtual learning, the traditional program will be offered virtually at the start of school. Families will still have the option to select full-time distance learning for the semester. The full-time virtual program and its details can be explored on our website at bit.ly/bsdreentry.

For families who still wish to participate in the traditional program, students will learn virtually with Brentwood educators for the first quarter. Assuming it is safe to return to in-person classes at the end of the first quarter, these students will return to in-person instruction in our buildings with all of our health and safety precautions in place. The full-time distance students will continue their program for the duration of the semester.

I want to be clear that virtual learning in our traditional program will look different than it did at the end of the last school year. Last year, we were responding to a crisis and our primary goal was to offer a sense of normalcy for students. Looking ahead, our students who are learning at home will have a more structured virtual learning experience with greater tools in place to keep students engaged and learning. We will continue to communicate with you as we approach the start of the 2020-2021 school year, including information about resources available to the community. Though the year ahead will look different in many ways, we look forward to serving our families and the entire community. We are committed to fulfilling our mission of seeing each child and supporting them on their individual pathways while keeping our community safe.

Facilities Update

With the successful passage of Proposition E, we are turning our attention to the next phase of our elementary facilities planning work. The Elementary Facilities Planning Committee for the 2020-2021 school year has begun its work to discuss facilities needs for the renovated Mark Twain Elementary and rebuilt McGrath Elementary.

The Elementary Facilities Planning Committee is composed of Brentwood School District Board of Education members, the superintendent, the director of facilities, and parents. Additionally, staff members from each elementary building will be selected to serve on the committee. Ittner, the district’s architectural consultant, will also be a part of this committee to provide advice and guidance.

The Elementary Facilities Planning Committee will work with the Board of Education and district leadership to help guide the design process of updated elementary and early childhood facilities using the funds from Proposition E.

The committee will be responsible for engaging other members of the community, soliciting feedback, studying data, and ultimately providing recommendations for how to meet the needs of current and future early childhood and elementary students in terms of facilities.

Additionally, construction is continuing with a focus on preparing student learning areas in preparation for students’ return in the Fall when it is safe to host students for in-person learning again.

Here is an overview of the timeline for the remainder of the summer into the fall:

- Classrooms, with one or two exceptions, will be complete by the end of August 2020.
- The new addition with commons and library is slated for completion in Fall, likely September or October 2020.
- The middle and high School offices will be completed by October 2020.
- Landscaping will be one of the final touches and is expected to be complete by November 2020.
- New elevators will be completed by November 2020.

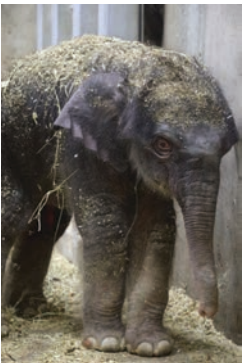

Great Dining At The Lake

We celebrated our 20th anniversary by having dinner at the Lake with radio friends Casey Van Allen and his wife Stephanie, and another couple. Casey suggested a newly renovated hotel and conference center, the Regalia. Their restaurant, The Royal Catch. can be summed up in three words, it was great. The restaurant sits off the main entrance and is separated from the lobby with two walls of bubbling water from floor to ceiling. The bubble walls also change colors and that offer a very relaxing atmosphere. The other two walls are the back bar, and windows that open to the outside. The overall appearance has a bit of an avant-garde look without being all plastic and chrome. I would call it comfortable modern. Suzi, our waitress, knew the menu and the wine list, and was very congenial without being overbearing. We were



all very happy with her service. Because of the virus, we were all given a one use, paper menu which I thought was a nice touch. We started with crispy fried calamari, caprese, and garlic mussels. The caprese was a beautiful arrangement of tomatoes and buffalo mozzarella with a balsamic reduction. It was just as tasty as it was pretty. I had the garlic mussels sautéed with garlic, white wine and wonton strips. It was totally delicious. For entrees, Casey had the bone-in pork chops. They were “Frenched” and marinated in, and served with a bacon jam. I was envious. Stephanie split an order of the daily special, a fresh seafood pasta with the other lady in our party, and it was more than enough for two. I doubt that I could have finished a full order. Sue ordered the pecan encrusted sea bass with a melted white cheese topping and served with asparagus. It was firm and flaky, just pure perfection. The other gentleman and I ordered a rib eye and



a strip steak respectively. I ordered mine medium rare and it was perfectly cooked. The steaks were served with a baked potato that covered half of the plate. The potato was



perfectly baked. No one had room for any desserts. On the lighter side, the menu also includes a number of sandwiches such as an “Impossible” burger, a portobello mushroom cheesesteak, a royal grilled cheese and more. The wine list is more than adequate and very reasonably priced. Most wines are available by the glass, or bottle. The bar is stocked with top shelf brands and the cocktails we had all had a “good pour” at a decent price. By the end of the month their new cigar and bourbon bar will open with a state-of-the-art ventilation system that will make it seem like a smoke free environment. We were given a tour of the room which includes fine leather chairs and couches, and an antique bar from an old Missouri saloon. It is stocked with some incredibly rare and unique bourbons. I can’t wait to sample some of their offerings. We will definitely return to the Regalia’s Royal Catch restaurant. It was a great dining experience in a casual, unpretentious atmosphere that is suitable for any occasion. Reservations are suggested for weekend dining. Museums in Atlanta Georgia

There are a lot of museums to visit in Atlanta and you will need a few days to visit them.



The Fernbank Museum was founded in the late 1800s. Emily Harrison was a naturalist who preserved 65 acres. Fernbank Museum may be the only natural history museum



to “grow” out of a forest. As an adult, Harrison dreamed of maintaining the forest as a school in the woods. Atlanta’s largest IMAX screen has a selection of traveling exhibits and unique science. In 2001, Fernbank became the first museum to display the world’s largest dinosaur display, “Giants of the Mesozoic.” In 2009, Fernbank added a dinosaur plaza near the museum’s entrance displaying “Lophorhothon atopus” with three bronze dinosaur statues.



The Michael C. Carlos Museum is an art museum located in Atlanta on the historical quadrangle of Emory University’s main campus. The Carlos Museum has the largest ancient art collections in the Southeast, including objects from ancient Egypt, Greece, Rome, the Near East and the ancient Americas.



This is one of the oldest museums in Georgia, the museum’s collection date back to 1876. Atlanta businessman, Michael C. Carlos donated over \$20million to create a permanent home for the museum, which opened in 1985. The museum was renamed to the Emory University Museum of Art and Archaeology. The museum’s collections comprise more than 16,000 works, and the facility attracts 120,000 visitors annually.

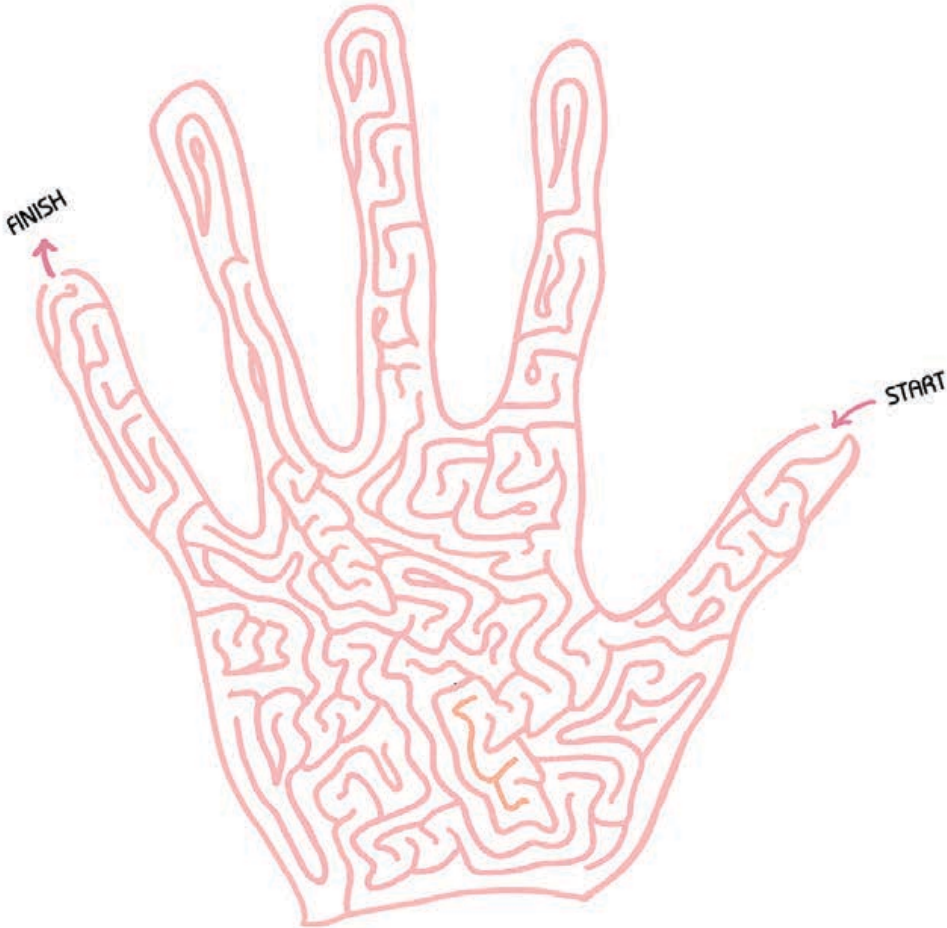

City of Brentwood Updates Related to COVID-19

The City of Brentwood continues to monitor developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic. We will continue to follow guidance provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), St. Louis County Department of Public Health, and other authorities, to protect the well-being of the public and our employees.

Visit www.stlcorona.com for additional information and resources. **The following information is accurate as of August 3, 2020: Brentwood City Hall is open to the public by appointment only. Please call 314.962.4800 to make an appointment.** Visitors who need to drop off items for Planning & Development or other departments may place the items in the designated bin inside the main entrance to City Hall (the entrance that faces Brentwood Boulevard).

- Entry by members of the public into City Hall is by appointment only.
- Any member of the public requesting entry to City Hall must fill out the St. Louis County Public Health information sheet and have their temperature taken.
 - o Anyone symptomatic (per the Public Health form) or with a temperature equal to or greater than 100.4 F (38 C) will be denied entry into City Hall.
- Anyone granted entry into City Hall will be required to wear a mask and will be offered gloves and asked to use hand sanitizer.
- Anyone refusing to adhere to these guidelines will be asked to leave and referred to the Brentwood Police Department.
- Public restroom usage at City Hall is at the user's own risk.

HOW TO CONTACT THE CITY

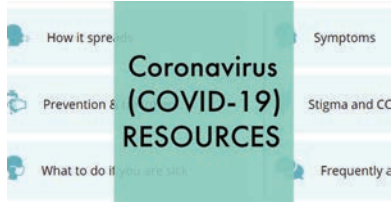
Social distancing has been shown to dramatically reduce the spread of the coronavirus from person to person. Help protect yourself and others by frequently washing your hands and using hand sanitizer, maintaining at least 6 feet of distance from others when out in the public, coughing or sneezing into a tissue, and wearing a face mask covering your nose and mouth when you are out in the public. --

From St. Louis County Department of Public Health: Personal Protective Measures, Mask Up As communities and businesses are opening, many people are looking for ways to resume some daily activities as safely as possible. Wearing a mask protects yourself and others around you, and it has never been more important. It is critical that people continue to wear masks. While there is no way to ensure zero risk of infection, it is important to understand potential risks and how to adopt different types of prevention measures to protect yourself and to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. In general, the more closely you interact with others and the longer that interaction, the higher the risk of COVID-19 spread. Here are a few things to consider:

- How many people will you interact with?
 - o Interacting with more people raises your risk.
 - o Being in a group with people who aren't social distancing or wearing cloth face coverings increases your risk.
 - o Engaging with new people (e.g., those who don't live with you) also raises your risk.
 - o Some people have the virus and don't have any symptoms, and it is not yet known how often people without symptoms can transmit the virus to others.
- Can you keep 6 feet of space between you and others? Will you be outdoors or indoors?
 - o The closer you are to other people who may be infected, the greater your risk of getting sick.
 - o Keeping distance from other people is especially important for people who have an increased risk for severe illness.
 - o Indoor spaces are more risky than outdoor spaces where it might be harder to keep people apart and there's less ventilation.
- What's the length of time that you will be interacting with people?
 - o Spending more time with people who may be infected increases your risk of becoming infected.
 - o Spending more time with people increases their risk of becoming infected if there is any chance that you may already be infected.

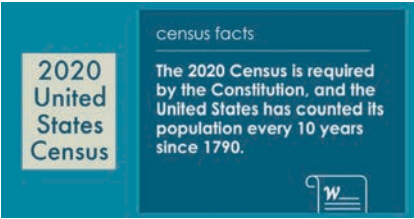
United States Census 2020

Shining Light on Solar Energy

Grow Solar St. Louis has kicked off its second year of the group-buy solar energy program organized by the Missouri Botanical Garden and Midwest Regional Energy Association in partnership with Washington University in St. Louis.

Grow Solar St. Louis uses the power of volume purchasing to reduce the upfront costs of installing solar. As more people join the program and decide to go solar, pricing becomes more affordable. Last year, 71 homes in the St. Louis region went solar, installing 424 KW of renewable energy throughout St. Louis City and County.

Over the next few months, the Garden and MREA will provide several free, hour-long virtual educational sessions for members of the public. These "Solar Power Hours" will give prospective participants information about how solar energy works, the financial costs and incentives, how solar group buy programs are effective and where to get started in the solar installation process.

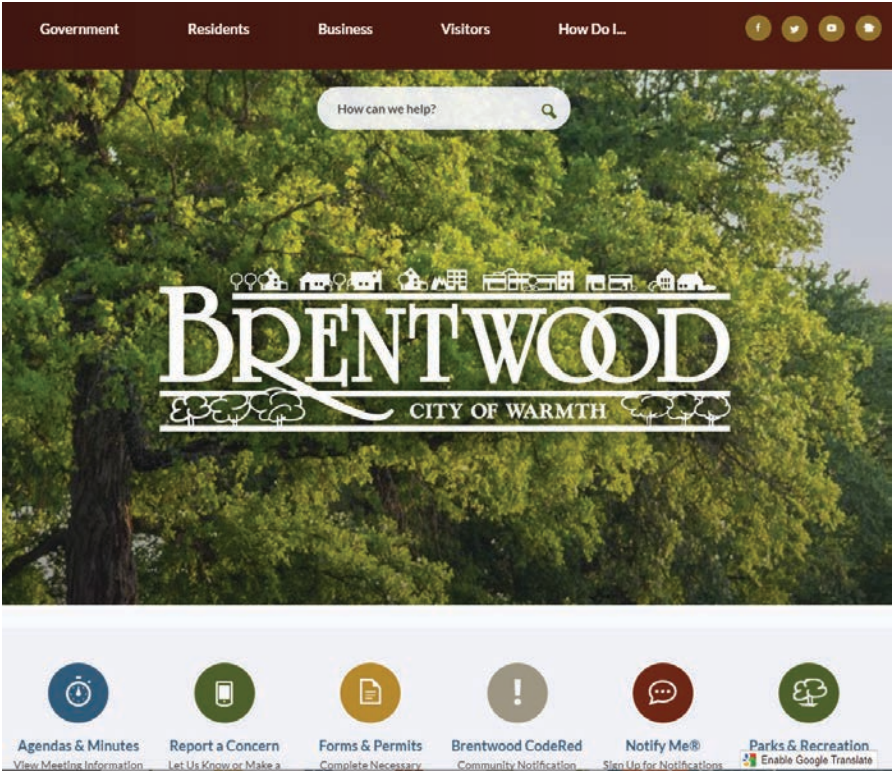

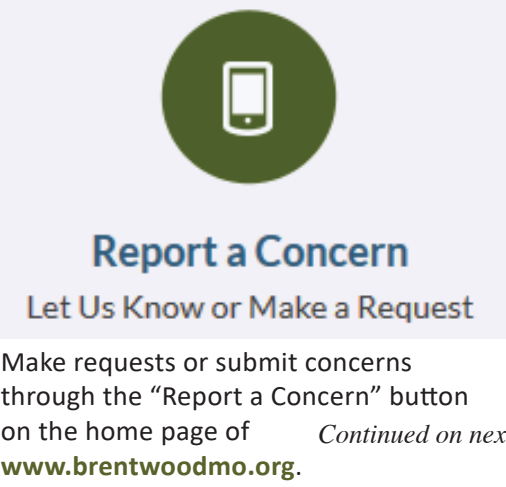

COCA SEEKS ARTIST(S) FOR MAJOR INSTALLATION

Commission to be Announced September 10, 2020

COCA - Center of Creative Arts - seeks to commission an artist or team of artists to create a large-scale, site-specific, participatory installation as part of the celebration of the upcoming completion of a multi-year Create our Future Campaign and opening of COCA's expanded campus, designed to scale COCA's impact and serve the St. Louis community as a house of the people. In place of a traditional ribbon-cutting ceremony, COCA sees a participatory project that ties our community together.

COCA will celebrate the grand opening with an installation entitled Common Ground to capture the themes of community, gratitude, celebration for how art connects us, and the importance of inclusive and welcoming shared spaces. Artist selection will be made August 28, 2020, to announce publicly on September 10, 2020. The artist(s) will be asked to work onsite and/or virtually with student artists and community participants beginning September 25, 2020, with the exhibition to run through November 15, 2020.

COCA's mission is to enrich lives and build community through the arts. With a commitment to equity and access, COCA serves as a regional hub for learning in and through the arts for all ages from all backgrounds. One of the most diverse cultural institutions in S. Louis, COCA serves over 50,000 students, audience members, arts and families from over 220 zip codes across the region each year. In all the work we do, COCA is committed to actively and intentionally operating as an anti-bias, anti-racist institution. As such, we know art is a powerful instrument for social justice. It is a means for people to share history, culture, and perspectives, celebrate differences, challenge assumptions, and find common ground.

Replacing a single large celebratory event and in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, a reimagined series of activities are planned to take place on site as well as virtually to commemorate COCA's opening of its expanded campus. The renovated mid-century original wing, designed in 1946 by renowned architect Erich Mendelsohn, the new wing, designed by Christner Inc. in partnership with Axi:Ome, and COCA's location will be celebrated. The art installation, Common Ground, is envisioned as providing a common thread to connect these varied grand opening experiences.

"As our city and country move forward through the pandemic, it is clear that the community needs opportunities for dialogue, expression, connection, and education," said Kelly Pollock, COCA's Executive Director. "The installation is a chance to innovate and amplify community participation in a time of continued distance. The title, Common Ground, recognizes our commitment to creating a home for all people with gratitude towards all those who contributed to this moment throughout COCA's history and the history of St. Louis."


