What types of candy can we expect to steal from our children's trick-or-treating bags this year? A new study just might have the answer.

CandyStore.com, an online candy retailer specializing in wholesale and bulk orders, has once again attempted to determine the "most popular" Halloween candies by state, based largely on historical sales data from 15 years' worth of Halloweens. The site's analysts say they also consulted with "major" candy manufacturers and distributors to fine-tune the findings - some of which came as a surprise to CandyStore's own executives.

"It's insane that every single state is not Reese's Cups," said Ben George, the marketing director of CandyStore.com, in a statement shared with Nexstar. "That alone is shocking enough, but some of the actual favorites from each state defy rational taste bud-ology."

The results of the study suggest that parents of trick-or-treaters can expect to find plenty of Reese's Cups, Skittles and M&M's (the top-selling candies in the U.S., overall) to surreptitiously steal from their children when their little backs are turned.

But which candies, specifically, are the "most popular" in your neck of the woods? Candy-Store has a state-by-state breakdown of top-purchased candies from its platform. Have a look at the chocolates, sweets and confections you can plan to pilfer from your little ones after they fall asleep on Oct. 31:





Each year thousands of American women of every age, race, and demographic enter a pageant. From toddlers to teens and from mothers to grandmothers, what is it that drives women to get coaching, special music, expensive gowns and costumes - not to mention entry fees - to put themselves under the scrutiny of judges and their peers? And for what? A crown or a trophy? A sash or just bragging rights?

"We dropped the 'beauty' word from most pageants," said Mary McIntosh, 2015 Ms. Missouri Senior. "Many of us who have entered multiple pageants realize that it is more than physical beauty that makes pageants appealing to women."

McIntosh, who has judged, coached and mentored other pageant participants believes that inner beauty and confidence are influencing factors in being successful in today's world of pageants. "I hadn't considered being in a pageant until my youngest daughter, Caitlin, entered Miss Teen All American." She coached her 14-year-old to a state fair second runner-up title. Along the way, she met several girls and women who were involved with the USA circuit. "My daughter went on to win Miss Teen Missouri and was the interview winner at Miss Teen USA, then became Miss Gateway St. Louis."

There are many organizations within the pageant system. For example, the Ms. Missouri Senior Pageant is the qualifier for the Ms. Senior America Pageant - but there are others.

United States of America Pageants is a large corporation with several subsets. United States of America's Teen is for young women 13 to 17 years of age. But there are also other divisions, such as United States of America's Miss (ages 18-28), United States of America's Ms. (29 years and over), United States of America's Mrs. (18+ and married). It's a corporation "designed to encourage women to strive to achieve their hopes,

dreams, goals and aspirations, while making them feel confident and beautiful inside and out." According to their website, they believe the true definition of beauty is "the unique set of combinations that make you, YOU!"

Most pageants for women under 18 years old abandoned a swim-wear competition many years ago, but still have evening gowns, onstage questions and even fitness wear as part of their criteria. Some of these pageants are huge money-makers for the corporations that sponsor them.

Linda Franchini, who was the 2018 2nd runner up in the Ms. Missouri Senior Pageant is a very successful winner in many of the national systems. "It takes time and money to do this," said Franchini, who was recently named Ms. All American Classic Tourism. Each pageant comes with an entry fee, and

sometimes special gowns and costumes are required. "I have to say it's really fun to participate in these events. I love the sisterhood. I love getting ready. I love having a goal."

Just like any other competitive sport, there are various tournaments and competitions that are available to enter each year. "I play the flute for my talent and enjoy preparing for the pageants," said Franchini. "You get to know other participants when you compete regularly. It becomes like a game. Sometimes you win and sometimes you don't. But it's the participation that makes it fun, and each time you try, it makes you better.'

The Miss America organization is by far, the largest pageant corporation in the United States. Within this system there are many local and state divisions to qualify for Miss America (ages 17-26) and Miss America's Outstanding Teen (ages 13-18). The Miss America Corporation boasts that it is scholarship-driven, and thousands of young women enter each year hoping to get their college tuition paid for. McIntosh and her daughter, Kerri, have served as administrators for the Miss Missouri America pageant, and she coached several young women who are now enjoying full college scholarships.

The Miss USA Corporation not only encompasses the Miss USA pageant, but also the Miss Teen USA and Miss Universe Pageant. A national franchise, corporations that manage the various state pageants earn

generous profits for their franchise holders as some of the entry fees can exceed \$2,500 plus wardrobe expenses.

Mary McIntosh admits she never really thought she would personally do a pageant. "I had fun training the girls and cheering them on," she says. It was her husband who told her about the Ms. Missouri Senior Pageant for women over 60. He said. "Let's do it." and she did. She loves to sing, and that was the part that really pulled her in. "It's kind of interesting how the tables were turned and both of my daughters helped train me.' McIntosh won on her first try.





L'Arche St. Louis has purchased an 11,000-square-foot building in Brentwood, MO at 9445 Litzsinger Road to serve as the nonprofit's new headquarters, allowing for expanded services and support of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. 



Brentwood Ranks Among the Best Districts in Missouri

The Brentwood School District ranks No. 5 among all public school districts in Missouri for academic excellence and No. 11 for the best places to teach in the state, according to the 2023 Niche K-12 School and District Rankings. The district earned an A+ overall rating, based on Niche's compilation of statistics and opinions from students and families.

Brentwood's schools also received top marks, with all K-12 buildings earning an A or better overall rating.

"Brentwood is committed to helping students succeed not only in academics, but also in life," said Superintendent Dr. Brian Lane. "Our teachers, support staff and administrators work hard each day to provide all students with the innovative instruction, personalized learning and social-emotional support they need to be successful."

Niche is a website that analyzes public data and reviews to produce comprehensive rankings, report cards and profiles of schools, universities and neighborhoods. The website ranks more than 10,000 school districts nationwide, based on rigorous analysis of key statistics from the U.S. Department of Education and millions of reviews from students and families.

Ranking factors include state test scores, college readiness, graduation rates, SAT and ACT scores, teacher quality, public school district ratings and more.

Brentwood High School Earns 2022 College Success Award



For the third time in four years, Brentwood High School has been recognized by GreatSchools as one of the top high schools in Missouri for preparing students to enroll and succeed in college.

The nonprofit website released its 2022 College Success Awards list on Sept. 22, and BHS was one 78 high schools in the state and 1,742 nationwide to receive the honor. BHS also earned the award in 2019 and 2020. The remediation metrics capture the percentage of students needing remediation for college either for two-year or fouryear institutions. Measures of college persistence are for the percentage of students returning for a second year at both two-year and four-year institutions.

"At Brentwood High School, we make it a priority to embed college and career readiness into our curriculum at each grade level," said College and Career Counselor Emily Diaz. "As early as freshman year, our students are introduced to a variety of postsecondary options and how they can best prepare for the pathway of their choice. We are proud of our college and career culture, but the most rewarding part is when our students find success in life after high school."

McGrath Elementary School Principal Announces Retirement

After 27 years in public education, McGrath Elementary School Principal Dr. Cindy Neu will retire at the end of the 2022-23 school year.

"My experiences have been phenomenal with our wonderful staff, delightful children and amazing community," said Dr. Neu. "While change is tough, it is time to slow things down,





spend more time with my family, and seek other adventures I have been itching to try."

Dr. Neu began her career in the Webster Groves School District as a sixth grade communication arts and world cultures teacher. After 10 years in the classroom, she transitioned to an administrative role as the district's science and social studies curriculum coordinator.

Five years later, she was named the assistant principal at Avery Elementary School, earning Assistant Principal of the Year honors from the St. Louis Suburban Region of the Missouri Association of Elementary School Principals in 2013.

Later that year, Dr. Neu moved 1.7 miles down the road to McGrath, where she has served as the school's principal for the last 10 years.

"Dr. Neu is a tremendous leader," said Superintendent of Schools Dr. Brian Lane. "Her energy and passion for helping students, engaging families and supporting staff have made a lasting impression on our entire school community." revenue is generated from local taxes, and the primary way to increase our tax revenue without increasing the burden on residents is through property taxes on new construction.

According to the developer's projections, this project would generate \$51.6 million in new revenue for the Brentwood School District over a 25-year period. However, these figures are contingent on the successful completion of all three phases of the project and a 90% abatement of property taxes until the year 2036. In addition, the 490 tax-abated residential units would increase our enrollment without providing enough money to educate each new student annually for 10 years.

Our community has always been a strong supporter of public education and the Brentwood School District. It recognizes the value of high-quality teachers and staff, small class sizes and personalized learning experiences for all students. Using property taxes to fund economic development incentives would impact all of these qualities that make our district such a great place for students to learn and grow.

We want to see our community thrive without compromising the high-quality education our community has come to expect from the Brentwood School District. We encourage the City of Brentwood to continue negotiations with Green Street Real Estate Ventures, and we welcome the opportunity to be engaged throughout the process so that our students have a voice in the future of their education.

"Brentwood High School teachers and staff work hard every day to provide students with personalized instruction, challenging curriculum and postsecondary opportunities," said Principal Dr. Ed Johnson. "We take great pride in the work we do to prepare our students for their futures, whatever path they choose."

The objective of the College Success Award is to recognize public high schools that have demonstrated successful track records of graduating students who enroll in two- or four-year colleges, are prepared for college-level coursework, and continue on to their second year. Award winners are determined by evaluating school-level data in the following categories:

• College Preparation, which includes the percentage of students from a four-year cohort who graduate from high school as well as measures of College Entrance Exam (ACT or SAT) performance.

• College Enrollment, which includes school-level metrics that vary by state. Some states report this data as "Percent Enrolled In Any Postsecondary Institution Within 12 Months After Graduation," others as "Percent Enrolled In Any Institution Of Higher Learning In The Last 0-16 Months."

• College Performance, which includes remediation and persistence metrics, which also vary in availability by state.

Brentwood School District Statement on the Proposed Green Street Development Project

The Brentwood School District shares the City of Brentwood's excitement regarding the Brentwood Bound development project proposed by Green Street Real Estate Ventures. This \$400 million mixed-use, multi-phased project would transform 40 acres along Manchester Road by adding 23 new commercial and residential properties over the next decade.

To help jump-start this project, the city is considering economic development incentives, often referred to as tax abatements, to reduce or eliminate the amount of property taxes paid by the developer on new construction and major development improvements. The developer has proposed a 90% abatement of property taxes for the first 10 years of the project, which includes 477 non-age-restricted apartments and 13 townhomes.

What does this mean for the Brentwood School District?

A school district carries the greatest financial burden when property taxes are used to fund economic development incentives. Approximately 93% of the Brentwood School District's







Make requests (such as scheduling a household bulk item pickup or a vacation check) or submit concerns (such as a missed trash pickup or a possible code violation) through the MyGov request tracking system via the home page of brentwoodmo.org.

Click on the "Report a Concern" icon, choose a category and subcategory, complete the additional information and submit your request.

If you include your contact information, you'll receive feedback when the request is received and updates as the request is investigated by City of Brentwood staff.

RECYCLING TIPS

Labels may remain on cans and bottles.

Glass is usually broken during collection or transit, so the lids may be on or off the bottles.

Metal lids may remain with metal cans or be separated, since magnets collect the steel products.

Recycling centers prefer that you leave the plastic cap on a plastic bottle so that the caps do not fall out of the conveyor system.

Medication Disposal

Deposit acceptable items directly into the medication disposal drop box located inside the Police Department lobby. Medication drop-off hours are 8 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday.


Over 220 pages of illustrations and descriptions of life in St. Louis in the late 1800's. The preliminary drawings for this work were made early in the spring of 1874. After a careful consideration of the subject, it was determined to locate the point of view so that the city would be seen from the southeast, believing that to be the most advantageous in all respects. Accordingly, the point of site was established on the Illinois side of the river, looking to the northwest, and at sufficient altitude to overlook the roofs of ordinary houses into the streets.

A careful perspective, which required a surface of three hundred square feet, was then erected from a correct survey of the city, extending northward from Arsenal Island to the Water Works, a distance of about ten miles, on the river front; and from the Insane Asylum on the southwest to the Cemeteries on the northwest.


Every foot of the vast territory within these limits has been carefully examined and topographically drawn in perspective, by Mr. C. N. Dry and his assistants, and the faithfulness and accuracy with which this work has been done an examination of the pages will attest. Absolute truth and accuracy in the representation of the territory has been the standard and in no cases have additions or alterations been made unless the same were actually in course of construction. In a few cases, important public and private edifices that are not yet finished are shown completed, and as they will appear when done.

All the buildings within the limits of the survey in July, 1875, are shown; and a very large number of those executed or commenced since that date have been also introduced, the pages having been constantly corrected up to the last possible moment before publication.






Cyber Security: Protecting Our Increasingly Digital Life

Avoid shopping on public Wi-Fis. It may be convenient when you're away from home and on the go, but not as secure as a password protected Wi-Fi or your home network. Save your online shopping, banking, or sensitive transactions for a secure connection, preferably when you're back at your house.

Monitor your credit score. The credit union offers free credit file monitoring access in both Online and Mobile Banking services. With protective measures in place, such as free daily refreshed credit scores, monthly credit reports and alerts, helping to stop fraud just got a whole lot easier. 

Preston House B & B



Smoky Valley Distillery

After spending a couple days in Abilene, KS we spent the night in the small charming town of Marquette. Our lodging was at the 1905 Preston House B&B. The house has (5 Bedrooms/2 Baths), a large kitchen, a diningroom, 2 living rooms and large porches up and down stairs; two floors with bedrooms on the main level, as well as, upstairs. The house can also be rented for Quilting clubs and classes. We met up with our hosts, Stan and Michele Strohe at their Smoky Valley Distillery. The young couple left their careers as medical equipment distributor and retired teacher to move to this small town of 500. We got a tour of town on Stan's golf cart...seems like people there like to use them instead of driving a vehicle.

Marquette is also the home of historic Kansas Motorcycle Museum. You can't miss it since there is a full size motorcycle mural on the side of the brick building. There are over 100 motorcycles displayed. The museum is primarily run by volunteers. It was founded in 2003 by motorcycle racer "Stan the Man Engdahl." He was a local racing legend 1940's - 1990's and five time National Racing Champion. FREE admission, donations accepted. We left Marquette and drove to the Swedish town of Lindsborg. We discovered the Spanish had come here to find the "lost cities of gold." The land is flat except for one hill that was topped with a stone "castle-like fortress." It was named Coronado Heights for the explorer who did not find gold. A couple miles down the road was a preserved earthen home, one of the first existing prairie dwellings known as the Hoglund Dugout. In 1871 the family of Gustaf and Maria Hoglund lived here with their eight children. Later he built a frame house over the dugout. The dugout was about 6 ft. x 12 ft. They used their wagon as a roof; they all lived in the dugout for two years. Along the drive into Lindsborg we saw an old wooden homestead sitting in the field.

Lindsborg is known as Little Sweden USA. Our first stop after we checked into our hotel and had dinner was at the Hemslojd Gift Shop. We were told it would be easy to find since there was a giant Swedish Dala horse in front of the shop. The Dala Horse is hand carved and hand painted in a variety of bright colors and hand painted with the familiar Scandinavian lettering. We bought a small red and white horse ornament to hang on our Christmas tree this year. Skills on how to create and paint them have been passed down for generations and is considered a living folk tradition of Sweden.

Lindsborg is a very attractive small town with brick streets and a beautiful Queen Anne Victorian B&B.

There are several quaint shops on the main street. Small World Gallery has hand-made jewelry and paintings. Lester Raymer's Red Barn Studio is filled with several mediums of art. It is also an artist-in-residence place.

The next day we headed for McPherson. We photographed about six or seven murals that were painted on buildings, including a giant Coca Cola sign on the side of the Opera House. I wanted to check out the bronze statue near the limestone courthouse of General McPherson. I was named after my paternal grandmother Susannah McPherson, but through my research I discovered we weren't related to the general. The Opera House opened in 1889, and renovated in 2010. Entertainment now includes live bands, movies and local community theater. We visited the McPherson Museum and Arts Foundation and saw Mammoth bones and other fossils. There is a photo wall devoted to the famous Globe Refiners Basketball Team. Besides the history of the winning team and their story of winning the first gold medal in their sport at the 1936 Games in Berlin
