

ARTICLE VII
Limitations

7.1 No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its officers, directors or other private persons, except that the corporation is authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article VI herein.

7.2 No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

7.3 Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles of incorporation, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c)(3) or 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

7.4 Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII
Distribution of Assets upon Dissolution

Upon dissolution or final liquidation, this corporation shall distribute its assets to another non-profit corporation situated in Clatsop County, Oregon which is organized for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of Clatsop County, Oregon, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for public purposes.

ARTICLE IX
Liability of Directors and Certain Officers

To the fullest extent that the Oregon Nonprofit Corporation Act, as it now exists or may be hereafter amended, permits the limitation or elimination of the liability of directors or uncompensated officers, a director or uncompensated officer of the corporation shall not be personally liable to the corporation for monetary damages resulting from acts or omissions committed as a director or uncompensated officer.
