

Australians on Israel study tours funded by Jewish lobby groups 1978–present

Executive summary

This report compiles **documented** instances (1978–present) in which **Australian politicians** (federal and state) disclosed **Israel-related study visits / delegations** that were **sponsored, hosted, or materially supported** (in cash or in kind, such as flights, accommodation, ground transport, meals) by **Jewish community advocacy/lobby organisations**, most prominently the **Australia/Israel & Jewish Affairs Council (AIJAC)** via its **Rambam Israel Fellowship Program**. ¹

The results are **not exhaustive for the full 1978–present period**. Publicly searchable, digitised “register of interests” and travel-disclosure PDFs are uneven across jurisdictions and time; **the earliest clearly dated Israel visit located in accessible parliamentary-interest summaries during this research is November 2009 (Victoria)**. A contemporaneous archive record indicates AIJAC launched the Rambam Program in 2003 with the explicit purpose of facilitating “educational and fact-finding missions” to Israel for groups including parliamentarians. ²

Where disclosures provide full date ranges, those are reproduced. Where a disclosure records only a month/year, duration (“4-day trip”), or simply “travel to Israel” without dates, the table marks the missing details as **“unspecified”** and flags the limitation in the “Visit dates” field.

Methodology and inclusion criteria

The compilation prioritised **primary-source disclosures** in: - the Parliament of Australia ³ registers of interests (House and Senate statements/forms), ⁴ and
- the Parliament of Victoria ⁵ register-of-interests summary publications. ⁶

An entry was included only if a primary source **explicitly** indicated: - travel **to Israel** (or Israel/Palestinian territories), and
- sponsorship/hosting/support by a Jewish lobby/community organisation (e.g., AIJAC; occasionally additional named bodies in disclosures). ⁷

Entries that referenced a Jewish organisation but **did not specify Israel as the destination** (e.g., “land travel and hospitality by AIJAC” without location) were treated as **ambiguous** and excluded from the main table (documented in the limitations section). ⁸

Findings

Across the accessible disclosures reviewed, **AIJAC dominates sponsorship/hosting references**, frequently via the **Rambam Israel Fellowship Program**—a program AIJAC describes as annually sponsoring visits to Israel by selected politicians and other leaders. ¹

Disclosures vary in the *type* of support recorded: - Some specify **full or substantial support** (e.g., flights, accommodation, programme expenses). ⁹

- Others specify **in-kind components only** (e.g., ground transport, guide, some meals). ¹⁰

- Some state only that travel was “as a guest of” AIJAC or “trip to Israel... sponsored” by AIJAC, without dates or itemisation. ¹¹

The Victorian register summaries also show that disclosures can appear as **additions or deletions** in “variations” summaries, meaning the underlying trip may have occurred earlier but the summary document records the adjustment later. ¹²

Chronological table of documented visits

The table is ordered by **earliest disclosed/known visit date** per person (where the trip date is entirely unspecified, ordering uses the **date stated in the disclosure** where available, and is labelled as such).

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Gaps, ambiguities, and limitations

Although the requested timeframe begins in 1978, **publicly accessible, digitised registers and travel disclosures are incomplete for early decades**; this research found no reliably linkable primary-source entries (within the limits of accessible online records) before **2009**. The Victorian register summary documents explicitly cite the governing “Register of Interests” framework dating to 1978, but do not themselves supply a comprehensive, digitised, person-by-person back-catalogue to 1978. ⁶

Several disclosures (especially “summary of variations” documents) record **“delete” entries** (e.g., “hospitality and transport in Israel provided by AIJAC”) without stating the original travel date. Those trips are included above **only** where Israel is clearly stated; otherwise, they were treated as ambiguous.

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A number of AIJAC-related entries (for example, in Victorian summaries) state only “land travel and hospitality by AIJAC” **without specifying Israel**, and were therefore **excluded** from the main list to avoid inference. ⁹¹

For several federal disclosures, **trip dates are not provided** (e.g., “study tour to Israel” or “travel to Israel... as a guest of...”). In these cases the table records dates as **unspecified**, even where the *filing date* of the form is known, because filing dates are not always identical to travel dates. ⁹²

Finally, the user’s scope includes “public figures” beyond parliamentarians (e.g., journalists, advisers). While AIJAC’s program description and early press coverage indicate the Rambam Program was intended for such cohorts, this report **does not enumerate non-parliamentarians**, because comparable systematic disclosure registers and primary-source lists (1978–present) were not identifiable within the accessible parliamentary disclosure corpus used here. ⁹³
