Our Mission

The purpose of the Fresno Bonsai Society is to expand the knowledge and skills of Bonsai within its members while offering opportunities for appreciation of this art form to the broader community. We do this through the inspiration of the beauty of the natural world and the rich cultural heritage of

Bonsai.

The 47th Annual FBS Spring Bonsai Exhibit is just a bit more than a month away. At the March 14th meeting, we learned that this year's event will be a bit different. The Exhibit will be held April 18 and 19th, in the Shinzen Garden at Woodward Park in conjunction with the Annual Blossom Festival in the Garden. The hours of the bonsai exhibit and festival have been changed to 11 AM to 5 PM.

The set up will occur at 4PM on Friday, April 17th.

The Spring Exhibit will be the April meeting. There will <u>not</u> be a meeting on April 11th.

This year, however, the bonsai display will be on the far side of the Koi pond on the east side of the garden, near the new construction site of the Clark Bonsai Collection. FBS members may park in the service yard on the east side of the park, adjacent to Friant Road and enter through the gait. All members are strongly encouraged to show one or more trees in the exhibit, including the Bonsai Basics group.

If you plan to show one or more trees, it is important that you email Dwayne Berrett with the information about each tree to be displayed, so that she can produce a placard. She needs the species of the tree, the years in training, and the age of the tree. Her email address is dberrett@me.com or call her at 284 3649 if you do not have email. The deadline for having these placards made in April 11!

All club members are encouraged to donate at least one bonsai to be sold at the plant sale for the benefit of the club.

If you would like to sell bonsai, other tree material or plants at the Spring Exhibit, please label the item with your name or initials and your asking price. The consignment fee for items sold at the plant sale is 20%. A bento box lunch with drink will be available both days and will cost \$12. Night time security has not been arranged at the time of this writing.

Continues to Progress

The perimeter fence of the new exhibit area of the CBCS, with it's shingled roof and gates, is now in place. The contours of the landscape and pathways have been formed. The first bench in the reserve area has been assembled.

Many of the landscape trees, including the first portion of a ginkgo forest, are in the ground.

By the end of March, the irrigation system should be taking shape, under the direction of Ray Thieme and Gene Nelson. The goal is to have the irrigation system and security system functioning by mid-April so that the trees can be move to Woodward Park.

The tentative plan calls for a "soft opening" with local officials, Shinzen leaders, and local bonsai supporters in mid July and the Grand Opening October 16th.

Curator Bob Hilvers has expressed appreciation to the several members of the FBS who worked so hard and gave so much of their time to accomplish this.

Bonsai Society.




Please Note

Ted started each session with a brief discussion about styles of shohin bonsai and how to select appropriate species and raw material. Those participants who did not bring trees, and some who did, then entered the growing areas to "ooooh and aaaaugh" over the great material Ed has to offer. Then the hands-on class began.

Several participants commented on the great



quantity and quality of the pre-bonsai trees that Ed has developed.

Everyone complemented Linda on a wonderful lunch and her gracious hospitality.

There was talk of a follow-up workshop in the Fall this year. We are hoping that this becomes a regular biannual event to compliment the monthly Shohin Study Group that Steve DaSilva has organized.

The Artisan's Cup Bonsai Competition

September 25-27

The Artisan's Cup is the first juried competition of bonsai in North America. It will be he open to professionals and amateurs but only by invitation base upon photographic selection. This may well be the finest display of bonsai art ever in the United States. The exhibition will be displayed at the Portland Museum of Art in downtown Portland Oregon on September 25-27.

The judges will include some of the greatest names in contemporary bonsai: Boon Manakitivipar, Dave DeGroot, Colin Lewis, Walter Pall and Peter Warren.

Special hotel rates for attendees are being negotiated currently.

Several members of the Fresno Bonsai Society have expressed their plans to attend.

If you do plan to make the trip, please inform Mike Saul of you travel plans. We plan to reserve a guided bus tour for the FBS participants to visit the Portland Bonsai Village during the exhibition.

The Portland Bonsai Village is a Bonus Feature of the Artisan's Cup

The Portland Bonsai Village is a group of bonsai professionals who have gathered in in a community, similar to the Omiya Bonsai Village near Tokyo, Japan. The Village includes internationally known bonsai talents including Ryan Neal, Randy Knight, Matt Reel, Austin Heitzman and Michael Hagedorn. There are also pot makers, stand makers, nurseries and yamadori tree collectors in the Village.

In the future, the plan is to develop an intensive training course in the bonsai gardens, a co-op to sell bonsai pots and stands produced in Portland, and a dormitory to provide long term housing for students and apprentices in the Village.


Guided bus tours will be available from downtown Portland, during the Artisan's Cup, to the Village.





- Set up time for the bonsai will be from 9:30 AM to 10:30 AM on Saturday April 18th.
- Access to the Bonsai Display will be through the Service Gate on the East side of the park by the Maintenance Yard ONLY.
- Traffic through the Service Entrance will be heavy, so arrive at 9:30 AM (vendors will arrive at 10AM.)
- Bring Sale Plants on Friday, labeled with your initials, species and price.
- Security will be provided Friday and Saturday nights

HARRY HIRAO ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FROM GSBF

The purpose of the **Harry Hirao Annual Scholarship (HHAS)** is to provide a onetime grant of \$1,500.00 to a worthy bonsai enthusiast. This money must be used for educational purposes in the art of bonsai within one year of receiving the scholarship. The recipient cannot use these funds to acquire bonsai, pots, tools, books, or other physical items; it is to be used to further education in bonsai by studying with a recognized bonsai artist.

An application must be submitted no later than midnight on July 15 to receive consideration. The application is to be submitted to the Editor of the Golden Statements designate George Haas at 707-762-9154 or email <u>gwhaas@comcast.net</u>.

The application must include, at a minimum, the following information:

- 1. Name, address, phone number, and e-mail address of the applicant.
- 2. Primary bonsai club and club membership history.
- 3. How many years of bonsai experience.
- 4. In 500 words or less, applicant will describe their bonsai educational goals and why they should receive the HHAS.
- 5. A brief description of how the funds will be used, and the person with whom the applicant will study.

6. If awarded the HHAS, applicant agrees that all funds awarded will be expended prior to the following annual convention.

7. Applicant will cooperate with and submit at least one article to the Golden Statements describing activities while using the HHAS funds, such as: demonstrations, workshops conducted or lectures given, and other actions with the bonsai teacher that increase skill and knowledge of bonsai. The deadline for submission of this article is July 20th following receipt of the scholarship.

8. Verification by the applicant's Club President of member in good standing with a GSBF Club.

SELECTION PROCESS HHAS Scholarship Committee will review all timely applications and verify eligibility. The selection committee will be made up of the GSBF President, Vice President, two board members appointed by the President, and the editor of Golden Statements. The selection committee's decision is final and the award shall be given at the annual GSBF convention. If no application is deemed worthy, the committee reserves the right to not award the scholarship for that year.
