MARCH MEETING OF THE FBS


Our general meeting last month was devoted to a group discussion of members trees...both horticultural and styling.


This was a wide-ranging and free discussion about members visions and plans.

Bonsai. This has been a popular activity with a more diverse group of participants! The spectrum from beginners to senior members seemed to enjoy it.




