The next meeting of the FBS will be Saturday, February 13th, at 9 AM, in the Reserve Area of the Clark Bonsai Collection in Shinzen Garden.

During the business meeting we will have a sign up sheet for various responsibilities for both the Fresno Home & Garden Show (March 4-6) and the Shinzen Gardens Annual Spring Blossom Festival (March 19th). Dave Soho is the chairman for the Home & Garden Show activities. He has outlined plans for a large demonstration at noon each day and mini-demos through out the day at our display. In addition, the club will sell bonsai and plants at both events. Members of the FBS will all be asked to donate plants or small bonsai for the club sale at these events. These plant sales will be our major fundraiser the year. We will have a much larger bonsai display this year and there will be a need for volunteers to serve as docents for the exhibit. Jennifer Waite will be our liaison with the event. Two weeks later, we will exhibit trees again and conduct a plant sale at the Blossom Festival. This will be a one day event this year, unlike the past.

Please bring the bonsai you plan to exhibit in these two events, to the club meeting on February 13th for help with touch up and advice with display. We will try to pair trees with stands borrowed from other members it possible.

We will also discuss a possible field trip to one of the bonsai garden fundraisers in northern or southern California at the end of February.

As always, bring a tree to work on or for advice. See you there!

January meeting of FBS

The FBS met at the Woodward Park Public Library last month (this was graciously arranged by Dwayne Berrett.)

The first agenda item was our Spring Show at the Fresno Home & Garden Show, March 4-6. Jennifer Waite will be our liaison with the show and Dave Soho will be the chairman for the event. Set up will start on Tuesday March 1st. We will have twenty five tables. Whether or not we will have a plant sale at this event is undecided. Jennifer suggested that low cost plants would likely be much more popular at the Home & Garden Show.

The FBS will provide our traditional bonsai exhibit just two weeks later at the Shinzen Spring Blossom Festival. This will be Saturday, March 19th from 10AM till 4 PM. Peter Schaffert will be the chairman for the Blossom Festival.

Bob Hilvers, curator for the Clark Bonsai Collection at Shinzen discuss the Winter Silhouette Exhibition to open that weekend at Woodward Park. Several members of the FBS will loan deciduous bonsai for that exhibit. He also announced the orientation for volunteers at the CBCS that following weekend. February Bonsai Basics Study Group

The Bonsai Basics and Intermediates will meet at the home of Prof. Howard and Mary Ann Latimer on Saturday, February 20th at 9 AM. The address is 4534 East Rialto Avenue, in Fresno.

The discussion will focus on soil mixes, soil additives, and repotting. Some bonsai will be repotted. In addition, students are encouraged to bring trees for discussion and guidance.

Bonsai Almanac for February

February is beginning of repotting season in our climate zone. Deciduous trees should be repotted first and conifers later. Ume and Japanese maples are done first. There is a danger to deciduous species if repotted after the buds have opened. Too early is better than too late. (Trident maples, however, may be safely repotted as long as the new leaves are red.) Once trees are repotted, be careful to protect them from a sudden hard freeze in winter months.

Trident maples will tolerate very aggressive root pruning. Do NOT bare root conifers. Old soil from conifers should gradually be removed over 2-3 repottings.

After repotting, trees should be left out in the sun (contrary to old advice) as heat from the sun will stimulate root growth and may produce shorter internodes.


Species should be sprayed with dormant spray, except spruce, azalea, and those just repotted.

If a deciduous bonsai begins to sprout or blossom, it should be placed out in direct sun. If left in shade, it will produce longer internodes. This is undesirable as the tree will loose it's compactness.

It is too early to fertilize. Iron-tone, and other soil additives may be added. Gypsum is suggested for Black Pines if the local water is alkaline.

Fruit bearing species may be pruned after blossoms have dropped.

Cuttings for propagation may be started in late February and grafting on deciduous species should start this month. This is the final month to graft pines and other conifers.

The FBS Another Day

The Fresno Bonsai Society was formed in the late 1960s. We were visiting Nee Hai Bonsai Nursery last month and owner, Grey Anderson, brought out his personal scrapbook. He showed us some fascinating clippings from the early FBS newsletters and the Fresno Bee.

The image at the left of a rock planting was on the front page of the FBS newsletter (then called "Bonsai-tana") from September 1977. Grey was the newsletter editor and later president of the club. The newsletter was typed on a typewriter (not even electric) and reproduced on a mimeograph device (for those old enough to recall the method and the odor of ether.)

During that same period, in his early days as a bonsai nurseryman, Grey also hosted a local television show about bonsai! The photo below portraits his TV show, with it's rather austere back round. Stardom still eludes Pete Schaffert!
