### **Bonsai Almanac for January**

January is the month of unpleasant tasks in bonsai. Clean off those benches and remove dead leaves and debris from the soil surface.

It is the time to sieve and blend soil for repotting. Pots will need to be scrubbed with Sandflex or other coarse textures to remove lime deposits.

Now is the time to study the design of each tree and carefully consider the branch structure, trunk line and particularly the potting position and angle, if it is to be repotted.

Make a list of the trees that you intend to repot.

This is a good time to apply dormant spray for sleeping insect eggs, on pines, junipers and elms.

Junipers may be pruned this late and multi-flush pines (Black and Red Pines) may still be needle pulled and buds selected.
