The Fresno Bonsai Society will break new ground this year as we dramatically expand our display and activities at the Fresno Home & Garden Show, March 4th through 6th, at the Fresno Fair Grounds. Our annual bonsai show will be a three day event at this event and this will substitute for our monthly meeting. If you were not at the February meeting and plan to display one or more bonsai in the H&G Show, please notify Dave Soho (530-722-7132) with the number of trees, species, and years in training for each of the trees you plan to show. Every member of the FBS, from beginners to veterans, is asked to display at least one tree. Pre-bonsai, trees with clamps, guide wires, wiring, and all phases of development are needed for the "Bonsai-in-Training" table. Mr. Soho plans to show trees in all stages of training as part of a greatly expanded exhibit this year. He has also arranged for multiple mini-demonstrations of styling techniques through out the three days.

Set up for the show will be Thursday, March 3rd from3-6 PM. Help with setup and tear down on Sunday will be crucial. Set up must be complete by Thursday evening. The exhibit area at the H&G show will be much larger this year.

The Shohin Study group will be asked to provide a Shohin display.

In addition, volunteers are needed to serve as docents in the exhibit from 11AM to 7PM Friday, 10AM to 7PM Saturday, and 10AM to 6PM Sunday. Please contact Peter Schaffert (559 960-5028) if you have not already signed up to help with exhibit those hours.


Bonsai Basics members are asked to display at least one tree in the Home & Garden Show.

February Meeting of the FBS

The February meeting was held in the Clovis Botanical Garden. This was an excellent venue with comfortable seating, guiet, and access to water. The business meeting focused on the Home & Garden Show Exhibit, the Blossom Festival, propagation of tree material for future classes and sales, and the April Fundraiser for the Clark Bonsai Collection, including the giant auction of Ray Thieme's collection. President Pete Schaffert confirmed the Ted Matson Workshop on Sunday April 10th. Harold Mitchell announced that Bonsai Basics would be moved to the fourth Saturday of March and April to accommodate the Blossom Festival and Fundraiser. Bob Hilvers outlined plans for the Koennai No Bonsai, the fundraiser for the Clark Bonsai Collection April 16-17. The meeting adjourned to begin teaching bonsai skills.





Bonsai Almanac for March

March brings us to the end of the primary repotting season. Generally, pines, junipers and other conifers are repotted during this month, as many of the deciduous trees have already begun to leaf out.

As the weather warms, trees which are subject to infestations should be sprayed with dormant spray in order to kill eggs which may have wintered in the crevices of bark and roots. Elms should be sprayed for scale insects and scale junipers need a Spring bath to ward off spider mites in particular.

As temperatures and breezes are unpredictable, trees should be checked for moisture daily. Water as needed.


Deciduous species who are starting to leaf out should be moved into the bright sun, if they were shaded during the winter, in order to prevent weak leaf development.

Spring moss may interfere with water and should be removed if so.

Conifers, which have not been transplanted within the last month may now be fertilized. Trace elements, like iron supplements can be given in dilute solutions.

Deciduous trees which have not yet leafed out may be thread grafted now.

For flowering or fruiting bonsai, once 80% of the buds have blossomed, all the flowers and remaining buds should be removed to prevent the tree from dissipating too much strength on fruit. A few buds may be left on fruiting trees for decorative purposes.
