The next meeting of the FBS will be Saturday, May 14th at 9 AM in the reserve area at the Clark Bonsai Collection in Shinzen, at Woodward Park. Remember to bring your club badge for entry into the park.



## **Haiku for Spring**


Winter was too cold.

## **Bonsai Almanac for May**

The scorching summer sun is coming soon. John Naka reminded us to continue to rotate our bonsai monthly. More importantly, watch species with tender leaves like Japanese maple, Hornbeams and Liquid Amber. On extremely hot days move them out of the direct light to filtered sun.

Watering must be more consistent but thoughtful to keep the soil moist but not soaked.

New shoots on deciduous trees may be cut back to 2 or 3 leaves if hardened off, in order to maintain shape. Juniper shoots may be cut back now for pad development and styling. Young black pines and vigorously growing old black pines may be decandled at the end of May or early June. Be aware that if decandling occurs early, the second growth candles will have more growing time and will be longer next spring. When pruning, start on the bottom branches first so you can gauge the appropriate length of the branches above.

Check on wires from last fall. Remove them if they are cutting into the rapidly growing branches.

Pomegranate, cotoneaster and pyracantha may still be transplanted.

Most species are growing rapidly and may be fertilized on a regular schedule. Consider rotating organ fertilizers on a schedule. Many of us add dilute fish emulsion weekly to a dry organic fertilizer like Grow Power Plus or Green King monthly.

Spider mites will be attacking juniper foliage and young pine needles soon. Consider Neem oil spray in the cool mornings every two weeks.
