September Meeting: Bugs and Poisons

The first meeting of the bonsai season was informative and well attended. President Dave Soho outlined the plans for club activities for the coming months, including a Boxwood dig at the end of September, the Bonsai Basics class, and the GSBF Convention in October.

Following the business meeting, Dr. Beth Teviot-dale, from UC Davis Department of Plant Pathology, discussed the common insect and fungal pathogens that damage bonsai. Dr. Teviotdale provided color images of infected plants and the pathogens. She emphasized the need to prevent fungal infestations by keeping trees relatively drier and otherwise healthy. The Big Fresno Fair and Bonsai

The Fresno Fair will be going on October 4th through the 15th. Several members of the FBS will display trees and provide demonstrations to the visitors to discuss the art of bonsai. Please stop by the Floriculture building if you are at the fair and join us.

Bonsai Friends,

Once again this year we were able to purchase a number of large, field-grown Kyushu junipers. They have been wired once for movement. The largest measures 34 inches high with a 3-inch diameter at its base. There are both large trees and smaller ones. The prices for these trees range from \$165 to \$500. There are also some shohin size (or one size larger), and the prices for those trees are \$35 to \$85. Other trees from this group will be used in a workshop with Ted Matson at the GSBF Convention in Riverside the last part of October.

David Nguy has again committed to two workshops in December. He has committed himself to work with the participants and their trees until the trees are finished.

The workshop for the larger trees will be on Saturday, December 9, beginning at 9:00am and may take eight hours, but longer if needed. The class will be limited to 6 participants.

The workshop for the smaller trees will be on Sunday, December 10, also beginning at 9:00am, and David said that this class should take perhaps 4-6 hours, but, again, longer if needed. This class is limited to 12 participants.

This will be a convention-quality workshop with the leading juniper artist in California.

Trees will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Contact us about payment for your tree and a deposit on the workshop fee, which will depend on the number of participants each day. Based on the interest that has already been exhibited, we think trees will go quickly. If you're interested, come check them out here at our nursery as soon as you can; but, we will not be available until October 10. Remember to call to make sure we're at the nursery.

Linda will be providing a great lunch, drinks, and snacks. They will be available for a cost of \$7, or you can bring a sack lunch.
