


Our Mission

November 13, 2021 FBS Demonstration and Workshop with Steve Iwaki

members participated on the third Saturday in September. The collection has a large number of junipers, which were the primary focus of the day. This was a great chance to learn about cleaning foliage pads, wire removal and general maintenance work.



Some of these trees are very large and having three or four sets of hands at once really speeds up the work. While we all have trees to work on, the opportunity to work on high-caliber trees in the development as well as the refinement stage is a great learning oppor-



tunity. Curatorial team members are there to guide the work and talk about the techniques we are using at the CBC to maintain a consistent pattern for handling the trees. Come out and join us on the third Saturday from 9 AM —Noon.


