Cornerstone children's home is a registered and operational program under FULAA lifeline international, with registration certificate number 12551, as an indigenous organization operating now in Uganda. Fulaa lifeline international has the following sub projects in the areas of their operations in Children home, Education, Health and Agriculture.

VISION

A ministry of compassion and concern to make a difference in the lives of orphans and disaster affected communities through Christ

MISSION

Fulaa works to maintain concern to support disaster victims such as refugees, internally displaced persons and Christian charity workers through humanitarian aids such as emergency relief, rehabilitation and post disaster development.

GOAL.

Making a difference in the lives of disaster victims and persecuted Christian's and charity workers.

FULAA AGRICULTURE PROJECT

Fulaa lifeline International Agricultural project is located in Adjumani Hill - Indriani Village Pakele Sub-county in Adjumani District covering a total land size of 500 Acres as one of the Organization's Sustainability programs alongside Cornerstone Nursery and primary school and in future Children's homes Clinic all are to support the Children's Home.

WHY INVESTMENT IN THE AGRICULTURAL PROJECT BY FULAA LIFELINE

Subsistence agriculture is the main supply of food, with micro-scale trading being the chief source of monetary income for the majority of families in Adjumani District where Cornerstone Children's home is and where over 85% of the refugees population lives. Food prices in the markets have doubled coupled with Bad weather, pests and diseases affecting most of the crops this year as well as dry spelt, and now with the COVID-19 and Country lockdown , so we foresee hunger in the coming year 2021.

Therefore, there is need to open both food crop production, Animal Husbandry and fruit tree growing for the children's home in order to supplement on the food funding that comes from Fulaa Board.

Project Goals and Objectives

Fulaa lifeline has the following as the main goals and objectives of this project:

Goal Short-Term:

Is to improve Food security to Cornerstone children's home and host communities.

Goal Long-Term:

Maximize health benefits of the Cornerstone Children's home and reduce poverty level in the project communities.

Objectives:

- Increase food availability for the Children with improved diets.
- Foster Training for the children with practical Agricultural skills
- To reduce economic risks, caused due to the natural hazards, of the targeted communities of Adjumani District
- To build capacities of the targeted communities in identification, production, financing and marketing of potential agricultural and non-agricultural products.
- To promote business-oriented community-based organization undertaking collective production and marketing techniques for long-term sustainability.

Project Results:

At the end of the project period, the following results are expected to be achieved after the intervention:

- Improved quality of life of Cornerstone Children's home and people in our project communities.
- Morbidity reduced-reduced lack of food related diseases.
- Increased awareness and knowledge among the communities on the impact of natural disasters on economic sustainability

- Effective participatory mechanisms adopted by the communities to reduce the impact of natural disasters on economic livelihoods by planting more trees
- Increased capacity of the communities in production, management and marketing of agricultural and non-agricultural products, including micro-enterprises.
- Economically-viable and sustainable community-based organizations are managed by the communities for successful production and marketing."

WHAT HAVE WE DONE SO FAR?

The following are the main project activities done and to be done in the near future:

Purchase of land for Crop production

The Organization have targeted 500 Acres of land in Adjumani Hill -Indriani Village –Pakele Subcounty - Adjumani District and so far procured 25 Acres of land where crop production has started on.

Land clearing/ preparation

The total land cleared already is 12 acreage and we target to clear 15 acreage for this year and the process of land opening is taking place as reflected below;

Mobilization of Farming crops, tools and labor

All farming crops, tools and labor have been mobilized ranging from the cassava, Groundnuts, Maize, Simsim, Beans and fruit trees and non- fruit trees as well as tools power saw, Hoes, pangas, Axes, etc

We plan to do regular weeding 3 times for the crops and the pruning to both the fruit trees and non-fruit trees in order to get high yield production. And we hope to build a store to handle harvest and we need one boda boda tri-cycle for transportation of food and easy movement.

MONITOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ACTIVITIES.

The Program Director together with the team in the office carries out monitoring and evaluation of the work done by the farm manager and the field staffs.

The following are measures to be taken to ensure sustainability: Cornerstone Children's home staff would be formed in all the beneficiary communities to take absolute responsibility for the facilities to be provided. Capacity building training would be provided to the Children on Crop Production for proper management of the facilities with Technical Assistance from Sub-County Livelihood Officer. Other sources of funding shall vigorously be pursued by Fulaa Lifeline to source funding to continue with the project activities in project communities and other communities in our project are.

OTHER URGENT NEEDS AT THE FARM

Tractor and Ox-Plough for tilling the land for opening more land. We have seen human labors are becoming scarce in the area and the amount of work is huge which require a big work force.

Clean Drinking water remains' a very big challenge for the farm because mothers and Children move almost half a kilometer looking for stream water for drinking. There is need for urgent borehole to provide clean drinking water as indicated in the pictorial below.
