

MONITORING PLAN FOR BUFFER COMPLIANCE TRACKING

§103F.48 RIPARIAN PROTECTION AND WATER QUALITY PRACTICES

1. COMPLIANCE TRACKING OF ALL PARCELS SUBJECT TO THE BUFFER LAW

All parcels in the county are to be reviewed within a 3 year timeframe. East Polk SWCD will review 1/3 of all parcels subject to the Buffer Law annually. Attached is a map defining East Polk SWCD's monitoring regions. (Attachment A)

2. RANDOM SPOT CHECKS

Random spot checks will be done in addition to the tracking of all parcels within a 3 year span. These checks may be conducted via aerial photo review or on-site review depending on availability of updated aerial photos and the practice that is being checked/access to farms. A combination of both aerial and on-site review may also be used. The East Polk SWCD will conduct <u>25-50 parcels</u> on a random spot check each year outside of the scheduled area. Additionally, the SWCD will review parcels of emphasis more frequently. Parcels of emphasis may include:

- Previously non-compliant
- No-till/Conservation tillage or cover crop alternative practice plans
- Variable width buffers
- Other Alternative Practice Plans
- Cost-share funded projects (years 1,3,9 of contract)
- Parcels of further emphasis (indicators of potential violation)

3. PROCESS TO HANDLE COMPLAINTS

Public complaints regarding non-compliant parcels with the Buffer Law, received by East Polk SWCD, will be addressed/investigated by all means available to SWCD technical staff, which may include aerial photo review, direct landowner contact, and on-site visit. The party initiating the complaint will be kept anonymous. In cases where the SWCD efforts to achieve parcel compliance by voluntary means prove exhausted, non-compliant parcel owners will be referred to Polk County Planning and Zoning for enforcement proceedings under provision MN §103B.101 and adopted Polk County Ordinances.
