Initially, the fledging council confronted several obstacles, the most important among them was finding a home. The first meetings were



Poor acoustics, cost inefficiency of heating and cooling, and other issues soon became burdensome, so the council moved into the basement of the Parish house. With heavy spring rains, water pooled across the basement floor, forcing the members to gather upstairs and share the building with the religion education classes. To accommodate all, ex-Greenville K of C Charter tensive carpentry work required the removal of a wall between the kitchen and living room. However, this was to be a temporary solution since the membership numbers were increasing monthly and there was insufficient seating space.




A short time later, major renovation of the former rectory converted the building into offices for the pastor and secretary as well as several classrooms. This necessitated a complete remodeling of the "white house" to provide a new home for the pastor and perhaps an occasional visiting priest. Once again, the Knights had to seek a meeting place.

Fortunately, a Posch family bequest provided answers to many prays of the parishioners. A new, spacious, multi-purpose building was erected. Rental for small events with dining facilities, restrooms, and a meeting room were now available. The new building also included an excellent frying room for the annual chicken and fish dinners, and plenty of stor-











age for items and equipment.
