### Sinningia harleyi 483

This plant was grown from seed from the Brazil seed fund. I have had it for several years. It has proven to be resilient, coming out of dormancy when I thought it was history.

Barb S. Sinningia harleyi 483 plant in bloom!

After being neglected in a medicine cup pot for who knows how long, I repotted it last June. It has now rewarded me with this beautiful mass of blooms.

According to Sinningia and Friends (<u>www.burwur.net</u>), this species is most closely related to *S. nordestina* and recently discovered species *S. sp.* 'Catoles' It is indeterminate, as evidenced by the rambling 46" stem, even under LED lights. It has been grown on a wick to survive my erratic watering habit. *S. harleyi* is native to Brazil, growing among rocks in semi-shaded areas. It comes in red and pink forms. Mine appears to be the pink form. If still alive in the spring, I will see how it does outside with my other summer sinningias.


