



Barb Borleske: "Primulina 'MB Dark and Stormy' is going through its second bloom cycle. Seems to be a late winter early spring bloomer, although the buds actually began to form several months ago, before the MAAVS Convention. This is a cross between *Primulina atropurpurea* and *Primulina pseudoyungfuensis*., and was a collaborative effort between Mary Schaeffer and myself."



Barb Borleske's update: "This is the second flower to open on my new hybrid, *Primulina 'KB Goldy Lox'*. The seed pod is a cross with *P. 'Mineko'*. I want to try to self the flowers to see what results."

In February's issue from Barb Borleske: "The yellow tinged flower is a seedling from a cross using one of my seedlings with Karyn Cichocki's *Primulina leprosa* that was made at the 2023 MAAVS convention. Both plants were in flower in the same class, and after judging, Karyn put pollen from her flower on a flower on my plant. I only got 3 tiny seedlings but I am so excited to get one seedling flower with yellow in it. The tentative name is *P. 'Goldy Lox'*."

Str. subgenus *Streptocarpella linguatus*

Dale Martens from Gesneriphiles

I've never had a gesneriad grow so fast. I sowed seeds of *Streptocarpus* subgenus S *treptocarpella linguatus* **December 1, 2024**. About 3 weeks later I took a toothpick and lifted each and put it back in the same container. I took a photo December 29 before transplanting to fresh soil in a different container.




January 7: I took a photo to show there was growth in a week's time. As usual, I blew on the seedlings and tapped the container. **January 12:** I was tremendously shocked to see a surge of growth.

January 30: the plants were growing so fast I transplanted 2 or 3 into Solo cups. **February 9:** I took photos of first flowers. I read that this species grows in a wet tropical biome in Madagascar, so they've been in a dome situation this whole time. I promote transplanting often to stimulate growth, but I am guessing this particular species has a fast track from seed to bloom naturally.

This is a good time to enthusiastically promote membership in The Gesneriad Society with a huge benefit of being able to order a fantastic variety of seeds (including the species in my photos). I got this species at the last convention and sowed its seeds. In addition, this coming 2025 convention June 29 to July 5, in Parsippany, NJ will focus on *Streptocarpus* with Dirk Bellstedt's talk plus we'll listen to a panel discussion, "Growing *Streptocarpus*".

Gesneriads Gather in the Garden State

The 2025 Convention Team is looking forward to our gathering at The Gesneriad Society's 68th Annual Convention to celebrate our favorite plants. Mark your calendars for **June 29 to July 5, 2025**, and join us at the Sheraton Parsippany Hotel in north-central New Jersey.

We will gather for our **third “recent” convention in New Jersey**: the first in 1988 in New Brunswick; the second in 2002 in Morristown; and now in 2025 in Parsippany. This part of New Jersey is familiar to many of our Gesneriad Society members who have gathered nearby at the Frelinghuysen Arboretum where the local gesneriad chapter members have held gesneriad shows and sales since the late 1970s. Who could forget the Flamingo-Fests?

The convention program will give us many opportunities to gather and share our passion for gesneriads. Exhibitors from across the continent will be entering a **large variety of plants and other entries in the flower show**. We shall also have a **large selection of plants for sale** from commercial and individual growers offering plants, tubers, rhizomes, and cuttings that cannot be found elsewhere. You're sure to find many new additions for your collection. Silent and live auctions also offer unique opportunities for acquiring rare treasures. We shall have **lectures, moderated discussions, and panels of gesneriad growers** to share their

experiences. There are programs to interest all. There will be a **judging school** for new and experienced judges to improve their knowledge of gesneriads. Numerous **volunteer opportunities** abound to help all contribute to our Society, and this is a great way to meet and make new friends!

Register ASAP! Early entry to plant sales on Wednesday night from 8-8:30pm is for convention registrants only and is based on your registration number. Plant sales will be open to the public on Friday and Saturday, but the best selection is available for convention registrants earlier.

If you have never been to a Gesneriad Society Convention before, we invite you to **join us in New Jersey!** Bring a wish list of plants, your plant questions, your auction donations, a show entry or several – and be prepared to come away with new friends, your questions answered, and new additions to your plant collection!

Sheraton Parsippany Hotel

199 Smith Road, Parsippany, New Jersey 07054

Our castle-themed hotel is in a park-like setting with a walking path around a lake. The smoke-free hotel has an indoor and an outdoor seasonal pool, business center, fitness center, and spa. Our contracted guest rooms have mini-refrigerators and complimentary WiFi. Parking at the hotel is complimentary for guests and visitors.

Our convention hotel is located about 24 miles from Newark Liberty Airport. The hotel currently has no airport shuttle service, but other transportation options will be pursued and information posted on our website as convention nears.

Our convention rate at the Sheraton Parsippany for traditional rooms (1 king or 2 double beds) is **\$149 including a hot and cold buffet breakfast** (for 2 per room). Add \$10 for triple and \$20 for quad occupancies. For other room options (larger or superior rooms or suites) visit the hotel website or contact <jkatzenste@aol.com>.

To guarantee convention rates, reservations must be received by June 23, 2025 (or earlier if our contracted room block has been filled by that date). Rooms are subject to applicable taxes (currently 14.625%). Check-in time is 4pm and check-out time is 11am. Rates are in effect three days before and three days after our convention week so plan to come early and stay late to enjoy all that the area has to offer.

Amuse Restaurant serves breakfast Monday to Friday from 6:30-10:30am and on Saturday and Sunday from 7-11am. Amuse Bar is open for dinner from 4-11pm.

Important Changes for Hotel Meals in 2025

Breakfast – Note that a complete buffet breakfast is included in the \$149 Sheraton Hotel room rate. Hotel hours for breakfast currently are 6:30-10:30am weekdays and 7:00 to 11:00am weekends.

Lunch – Note that the Sheraton Hotel restaurant does not currently provide any lunch service so all convention attendees will need to provide their own lunches. Options include many local eateries (short car or Uber distances); order-in for delivery to the hotel; earlier purchased lunch items can be kept in the mini-refrigerators in all hotel rooms; lunch can be skipped after eating a large breakfast, etc.
