## **Tree Species Descriptions**

American Arborvitae: A medium growing upright evergreen shrub which grows about 40' at maturity. An excellent windbreak.

<u>Austrian Pine:</u> A rugged fast growing tree well adapted to adverse growing conditions. Dense growth is dark green and needles are rigid. Mature height 50'.

<u>Colorado Blue Spruce:</u> A slower, but most popular conifer. Narrow to broad pyramidal outline with horizontal stiff branches. Needles range from dark green to silver blue. Excellent for ornamental and windbreak plantings. Mature height is 40-60'.

Eastern White Pine: A tall tree with relatively few and horizontal large limbs. Needles are 2-4" long, slender. Cones slender 3-10" long. Bark is dark. Height is 80-110' and 2-3' diameter.

Norway Spruce: One of the fastest growing spruce trees. Slender trunk with short drooping branches forming a very narrow pyramidal shape. Used for windbreaks, grows on most sites except where soil is water-soaked. Mature height is 80-100'.

Arrowwood Viburnum: A multi-stemmed, rounded shrub with creamy white late spring or early summer flowers. Leaves are lustrous, dark green in summer changing to yellow to glossy red and reddishpurple in the fall. Flowers are followed by ½" blueblack berries that ripen in early fall.

<u>Black Chokeberry:</u> A dependable small to medium sized shrub with upright, mounded habit. Small clusters of white flowers in spring are followed by glossy black fruit. Dark green foliage turns reddishpurple in the fall.

<u>Black Cherry:</u> Moderate to rapid grower that will reach 50-60'. Clusters of white flowers from April to June. Fruit will appear June to November as dark purple, small clusters of berries.

<u>Black Walnut:</u> A valuable timber tree for veneer and furniture wood. Unlike other hardwood it grows well in most locations. Has delicious nuts.

Pin Oak: Pyramidal tree with glossy dark green leaves that change to bronze or red in the fall. Dried, brown leaves remain on the tree for much of the winter. Light brown acorns provide food for a wide range of animals. Prefers moist, rich, acidic, well-drained soil. Will tolerate clay soil and standing water for a short period. Mature height 40-50'.























Black Gum: Features a straight trunk with unique bark that forms deep fissures with age. The trees typically reach 9–15 meters (30–50 feet) or more in height. The simple glossy leaves are entire to slightly toothed or wavy and are usually elliptic in shape.

Red Bud: Extremely popular small landscape tree that grows to 25-35'. Clusters of rosy pink flowers appear in April. Reddish-purple leaves change to dark green then to yellow.

<u>Sugar Maple:</u> A large ornamental shade tree. Small red flowers in spring and brilliant red fall colors. Tolerates wet, swampy areas or lime soil.

Swamp White Oak: A rapid growing tree with a mature height of 60-70'. The crown shape and bicolored leaves (dark above, lighter beneath) are attractive features; fall color is yellow, with occasional red-purple. The trees can grown well in areas that are dry, poorly drained and wet, or even occasionally flooded, and they will tolerate significant soil compaction.





<u>Butterfly/Hummingbird Packet:</u> Each packet contains 10—13 annual and perennial varieties. This is designed to attract both butterfly and hummingbirds.
