
Dinner will be catered by Gibson's Barnyard BBQ and will begin at 6:00

Senate Bill 299 Cover Crop Program Available

Producers interested in planting cover crops are invited to check into the Senate Bill 299 Cover Crop Program. Producers with eligible cropland acreage, can sign up for the cover crop program and will receive \$25 per acre with a maximum of 80 acres for 3 years.

Van Wert SWCD will manage the program sign-up, verifica-

tion of eligibility and cover crop establishment. Producer must agree to install a cover crop on the same field for 3 consecutive years. Seeding must be established by November 1. SWCD will verify cover crop has been established and maintained until March 15, 2020 at which time the producer will receive payment.

The land cannot be currently enrolled in a USDA Farm Bill program for cover crops. The sign up is from now until September 1. This program is available on a first-come first-serve basis until program funds are no longer available.

The Van Wert SWCD will hold an election for District Board of Supervisors at the 70th Annual Meeting on Tuesday, August 6, at Council on Aging, 220 Fox Road, Van Wert, OH.

Two members will be elected for a three year term of office. County residents and landowners have three options for casting a ballot.

 Contact the office in writing 21 days prior to the election

- requesting an absentee ballot.
- 2. Cast a ballot at the District office by 3:30 p.m. August 5.
- 3. Cast a ballot at the Annual Meeting from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

To be eligible to vote, you must be of legal voting age (18 years) and reside or own land within the District.

Van Wert SWCD is a legal subdivision of state government that provides natural resource management assistance to county landowners and other units of local government. The District is funded by the Van Wert County Commissioners and county funds are supplemented by funding from the Ohio Department of Agriculture, Division of Soil and Water Conservation. The District is governed by a five member board of county residents.

Working Lands—Hay Buffer & Small Grain Programs

The Ohio Department of Agriculture, in partnership with Van Wert Soil & Water Conservation District continues to provide funding for assistance programs for farmers to help protect water quality in the western basin of Lake Erie. The sign-up period for these programs began June 17th. The funding for the program is through the passage of Ohio Senate Bill 299 which provided \$23.5 million for SWCD's for nutrient management programs.

Two programs being offered are the Ohio Working Lands Hay Buffer Program and the Ohio Working Lands Small Grains Program. The Ohio Working Lands Hay Buffer program established year-round vegetative cover on eligible cropland. The program promotes conversion, establishment, and maintenance of forage/hay land on certain cropland acres. These buffers act as another line of defense to filter surface water while allowing participants to harvest forage from the established areas. Payment is \$120 per acre per year for a 5 year period.

Also available is the Small Grains Program which is a voluntary program that will encourage producers to plant small grains such as wheat, barley, oats, or cereal rye on eligible cropland. Participants must plant and harvest small grains, land apply manure, and plant a cover crop to receive a cost-share payment to help offset operating costs. The program benefits the planting of small grains not only for the conservation benefits, but to provide livestock producers with a longer application window to land apply manure and nutrients. Payment is \$75 per acre cost share.

The goal of these programs is to reduce nutrients entering Ohio waterways to lessen harmful algal blooms in Lake Erie.
