H2Ohio Update

The Ohio Department of Agriculture has notified the SWCD that the H2Ohio program will be moving forward with \$50 million in incentive funds available to producers for implementation of the Best Management Practices (BMPs) included in Governor DeWine's H2Ohio Program

H2Ohio funding for BMP's will begin in crop year 2021. The SWCD staff will contact current H2Ohio applicants and work with producers to update all applications to reflect BMPs for crop years 2021, 2022, and 2023, with future year incentives contingent on the availability of funds.

H2Ohio Program Timeline

June 1 to August 14—SWCD will revise program applications to reflect BMP's for crop year 2021 with projections for years two and three. All applications must be complete by August 14.

September 1 to October 31—ODA will evaluate program applications and notify program participants of approval of Voluntary Management Plans (VNMP)

for 2020 and 2021 practices.

June 1 to Year End—Participants develop and submit VNMPs. Final plans must be approved by December 31, 2020. VNMP's must be approved prior to implementation of an H2Ohio eligible practice.

Fall 2020 BMPs

- Conservation Crop Rotation (both small grains and forages)
- Phosphorus Placement
- Variable Rate Phosphorus Application
- Drainage Water Management structures can be installed if the required surveys and engineering plans have been completed. Payments will be completed for crop years 2022 and 2023.

All H2Ohio BMP's can be implemented beginning Spring 2021, practices will continue to be implemented through summer and must be completed no later than fall of 2021.

Bonus Payment Highlight of 2020 Lake Erie CREP

Do you have a ditch or stream running through your farm that needs a filter strip? How about that one area that's hard to farm because it's always wet? The Van Wert Soil and Water Conservation District is ready to help you evaluate how your bottom line and Lake Erie's water quality can benefit by signing up for this program.

CREP is a federal conservation partnership with the state of Ohio designed to address agriculturerelated environmental concerns. Participants receive financial incentives from USDA and the state of Ohio to voluntarily enroll environmentally sensitive cropland or pastureland in contracts for a period of 15 years. In return for annual rental payments and financial incentives, participants convert the land to native grasses, trees and other conservation vegetation. New for 2020 is the \$200 bonus offered by the state of Ohio for all newly-enrolled filter strip and riparian area practices. The sign-up

period for newly acres goes from Jan 1, 2020 thru September 30, 2020. For current CREP participants with expiring contracts, reenrolling and expanding the width of filter strips or riparian areas will earn you the bonus dollars on those new added acres all the while expanding the environmental protection of these practices. Landowners who want to extend their LE CREP contracts, have until August 21, 2020.

Students Ask A Lot of Questions By: Tammy Campbell, Ed. Coord.

I often have students ask questions that I do not have time to answer in the classroom but always do my very best to answer. The latest questions have been coming in the form of hands and look at the "GERMS" plastic and our environment. I have worked on a new presentation called Plastic and OUR Water. This presentation shows students how plastics get in our water and has a short lab to go with the presentation on how hard it can be to get plastic out of beach sand. We will then talk pens When You Flush?. I about how they think you would be able to get plastic out of our water. This topic gives the students a chance to think about our water and brainstorm ideas. I always try to adjust to the students and current events.

One of my favorite presentations has always been **Don't Pass the Germs** and how very appropriate this talk is in the face of COVID-19. This presentation has a short story with the introduction of correct hand washing. The students are then given "GERMS" which really is a glow in the dark hand lotion. They rub the lotion on their under a black light. Off the students go to wash their hands and then back to see if all the "GERMS" went down the drain. This is a great lesson and fun for their own wetland and add anithe students.

I am also working on a presentation called What Haphave realized most students do not understand that you must have two sets of pipes in your home. This presentation talks about clean water in and used water out of their home. We talk about the differences of this water in and out depending on if you live in a village/city and if you live in the country. This topic is one the students find interesting because they have never thought about it and it

pertains to them every day. This presentation goes well with other presentations for Jr. High such as Erosion and the Enviroscape.

Wetlands presentation and lab is new for next year. I have a short presentation on wetlands and a wetland lab for the students. Students will make mals. We will add different amounts of water and they will watch their wetland and observe what happens. If time allows the class will also do a quick lab on watersheds and how a water shed works. This presentation would go well with the Enviroscape presentation.
