H2Ohio Update

Open Enrollment for new applications: H20hio will accept new applications starting September 15th through January 15th. In order to apply, you must provide a VNMP or CNMP. New practices under 2022 contract will not begin until March 15th. One exception is Small Grains. Your small grains crop must be harvested as a grain to be eligible for payment. (ONLY FOR NEW APPLICANTS) **Exciting Contracts:** You may now add acreages to your existing contract. Any changes must be approved by a technician and the SWCD Board. If the dollar amount exceeds 10% of original payment amount agreed upon, the contract must be sent to ODA (Ohio Department of AG) for approval.

Contracts that had VNMP's only until 2021 or 2022 will need to contact Kady to get a Farm Summary update by Jan. 15th.

Fall Reminders!

Manure inc. and Cons. Crop Rotations Practices: To get payment for these practices, this program requires cover crops or double crops to be planted by October 15th. To receive overwintering cover crop payment, at least 50% of your seeding mix must be overwinter-


Van Wert County Foundation spoke on AG + Philanthrophy, Farm Bureau, AG Credit and the Soil and

Education Update

Education coordinator, Tammy Campbell, has a wide variety of educational programs that she teaches to students in Van Wert County. Our most recent event was Cows and Plows that is put on at the Van Wert County Fairgrounds for all area 4th graders.

-The SWCD, in cooperation with Crestview Local Schools, Lincolnview Local Schools, St. Mary's Parochial and Van Wert City Schools presented a day-long session for students to acquaint them with the primary industry in the county, AGRICULTURE. Statewide Milkweed Pod Collection Runs Sept 1 -Oct. 30



Due to the drastic decline in monarch butterfly (Danaus plexippus) populations, the Ohio

Pollinator Habitat Initiative (OPHI) and local Soil & Water Conservation Districts are again seeking public involvement to collect common milkweed (Asclepias syriaca) seed ponds from established plants September 1 through October 30. This is an annual event and we hope you can participate!

The seeds will be used to establish new plantings and additional habitat for the monarch butterfly throughout the buckeye state. These future plantings will increase the food source for the caterpillar stage.

Seed pods from common milkweed should be collected

Due to the drastic decline ARE DRY AND BROWN-

GREY in color. If the center seam pops with gentle pressure, they can be picked. The seeds in green pods will not be viable and won't be able to be used. Be patient and don't collect too soon!

It is best to collect pods into paper bags. Avoid using plastic bags because they can allow mold to develop. It is recommended to wear disposable gloves when picking the handling pods. Ideally, it is recommended to leave at least 50 percent of the seed crop at a given site to allow for natural regrowth of the native population the next growing season. There are situations where total collection can occur. For example: If the field or area will be mowed

completely or the area will be converted for crop or development. A collection container is located outside the door of the Van Wert SWCD, 1185 Professional Drive, Van Wert.

Wind Break

Applications are being accepted for the 2022 season of the Northwest Ohio Windbreak program. This is an easy and costeffective method of planting potentially large windbreaks in a matter of hours. In order to be eligible for CREP cost share payments the potential windbreak must be on or adjacent to a field of at least 10 acres, and have a minimum row length of 250 feet. Typical species include Arborvitae, Norway Spruce, Eastern White Pine, several Oak species, and many others. Stop in the Van Wert SWCD for more information.
