What Happens to the Animal Soul?

Being labeled "Oversensitive" at a very young age, Animal Communicator Danielle Mackinnon found her calling after her beloved dog, Bella, passed away. She realized her life purpose was not only to work with animals, but to help them work with people. Here is how she explains what happens to the Animal's soul when they pass away.

Hi, my name is Danielle Mackinnon, I'm an animal communicator, that means animal psychic. This means that I talk to animals that have crossed over as well as animals that are here psychically connecting in with them using my intuition as my everyday job. I am going share with you what the animals have shared with me about what really happens to the soul of an animal when that animal dies.

HOW DO I KNOW WHAT HAPPENS TO THE ANIMAL SOUL?

First of all, everything that I'm sharing with you is from the point of view of the animal in my intuitive connections with the animal. This isn't something I heard somewhere. It isn't something I read in a book. It isn't something that some teacher taught me. It's what the animals have shown me again and again in my

connections with them. I can't give you physical "proof" because I have not died and come back to tell you what it's all like, I can only tell you what the animals tell me.

THE DYING PROCESS

The first thing that you need to know about the soul of an animal is that even when the animal is in their body, during their lifetime, they are very connected to their soul. Their soul comes with them when they embody into this lifetime. When they've completed their journey here, (meaning they have completed teaching whatever they came here to teach in their animal bodies) they *decide* that it's time to cross over. Yes they decide this!

THE DECISION

When they decide that they're going to cross over, there's a whole process that happens because the spirit and the soul need to disconnect from the body. Yes, animal souls leave the body or at least start the process before the actual crossing over happens. Here's how that physical process occurs. In this physical process we've got an animal body and then we've got the soul and the spirit enmeshed together. What has to happen is those two need to disconnect so that the physical body can die and the soul

and the spirit can continue on as they're going to continue on.

So what actually starts happening is we've got this physical body and the spirit/soul starts to back out of the bum of the animal in order to start releasing from the physical body. When I connect with an animal that is getting ready to cross over, I can see an outline of the spirit part way in the body (depending on how far along in the crossing over process the animal is).

So, funny-enough, the spirit backs out of the bum. You can kind of see this as it goes all the way along. Even right before the animal actually crosses over, you could see often psychically see a little bit of that energy still in the physical body using intuition.

THE PUSH: HOW THE ANIMAL LEAVES THEIR BODY ONCE AND FOR ALL

Once that spirit actually releases from the body, sometimes this comes with a big energy push. Euthanasia is an example. If you're getting help from the vet, some animals go through a big resistance. They'll start freaking out and going crazy. That is the energetic push that is sometimes needed to get the

Nutrition Corner

FEEDING A HORSE WITH PPID (Cushings Disease)

Pituitary Pars Intermedia Dysfunction (PPID) is caused by a tumor or enlargement of the pituitary gland resulting in an inability to control hormones produced by the pituitary gland. Horses with a history of obesity, metabolic issues, and changes in insulin resistance have a higher chance of developing PPID. Additionally, stress from diet and environment can cause hormone imbalances that can lead to PPID. PPID is a non-reversible disease and will progress if not properly managed.

Horses with PPID may show clinical signs or symptoms that include a long shaggy coat outside of winter, a potbelly and/or fat pouches, or experience laminitis. Other symptoms include, but are not limited to, excessive sweating, increased water consumption, excessive urination, lethargy, poor athletic performance, infertility, muscle wasting, delayed wound healing and increased susceptibility to infections. Middle-aged and older horses are more likely to suffer from these symptoms.

One of the most significant steps you can take to help your PPID horse is to develop a feeding program that

meets their nutritional needs. When caught early, providing preventative care, adjusting nutritional choices, and offering appropriate exercise can all help to ensure your horse has a comfortable life. Your veterinarian may also recommend medication as part of your horse's treatment plan.

Provide your horse a diet fortified with vitamins, minerals and high levels of antioxidants. These micronutrients are crucial to your horse's overall well-being because they aid in digestion, nutrient absorption and support their immune system. Be mindful of your horse's caloric intake, specifically sugar and starch levels — or NSC levels, when creating a balanced feeding program.

Horses suffering from PPID can benefit from a diet lower in starches and sugars. Horses with PPID may be prone to insulin sugar intake levels below 20% NSC, and in extreme cases as resistance and high blood sugar. It is recommended to keep their starch and low as 10%.

'BLACK LIVES MATTER' HORSE MYSTERIOUSLY DIES DURING ROUTINE PROCEDURE WHILE IN CARE OF WHITE VETS

A racing horse named "Black Lives Matter," who first went viral on social media in January after he won his first race at the Sam Houston Derby trials in Houston, has died. The stallion mysteriously died without explanation at an equestrian clinic, after his owners, the Hatley family from Oak Cliff, dropped the animal off in perfect condition.



Colonial Horse Genome

Sequenced

GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA—According to a statement released by the University of Florida, researchers have sequenced the mitochondrial genome of a sixteenth-century horse using DNA extracted from a tooth discovered at the Spanish colonial site of Puerto Real in what is now Haiti. He discovered that the closest living relatives of the 500-year-old Puerto Real horse are not horses living today on the Iberian Peninsula, but rather wild horses that roam the island of Assateague off the coast of Maryland and Virginia.

DODGE COUNTY, Wis. (WMTV) - A woman was seriously hurt after getting bucked off a horse in the Town of Lowell Friday. CLR Fire and Rescue officials said the 20-year-old was found lying in a pasture by her mother around 6:30 p.m. CLR Fire Chief Eric Howlett said due to the severity of her injuries and the location of the incident, a medical helicopter was needed. She was taken by Med Flight to UW Hospital in Madison with severe injuries. The scene was cleared around 8 p.m.



Loneliest wild horse on Outer Banks finds its happy ending after months of wandering

A lonely wild horse has been wandering North Carolina's Outer Banks, and the story of her months-long search for companionship has been breaking hearts on social media. The saga of 2-year-old Alma came to light in June, when the Corolla Wild Horse Fund noted on social media that it had gotten multiple calls about a "lost" horse with wounds on her face. As weeks passed, fund officials posted updates, revealing Alma had walked miles up the coast by herself with no clear destination in mind. However, things changed July 20, when the fund confirmed Alma had been seen in the company of other wild horses. Among them was a male, Renzi, who is close to her age, the fund reported. "We knew she would figure it out. She's with stallion Cowboy, mares Daisy and Shala, and Shala's 3-year-old son Renzi," the fund wrote.



Baseball legend Chipper Jones is selling his gorgeous Georgia horse mansion for \$15 million

The ranch is in Canton, Georgia, about 45 minutes north of Atlanta, where Jones played all 19 seasons of his Hall of Fame career with the Braves. The property has over 23,000 square feet of living space, including a guest house. Jones purchased the property in 2018 for \$9.25 million. The world-class equestrian facilities include four horse stalls and the horse arena even has seating for people to watch.



Berkeley Co. horse euthanized after testing positive for blood-borne illness

BERKELEY COUNTY S.C. (WCSC) - A state veterinarian confirmed that three horses have tested positive for a blood-borne illness called infectious anemia (EIA). The first horse was from Berkeley County, and the two contact cases were in Barnwell County. State Veterinarian Michael Neault says the horse in Berkeley County has been euthanized. Clemson University's Livestock Poultry Health, which Neault directs, is talking with the owners of the two infected Barnwell County horses about their options.

WILD HORSES WERE ABUNDANT in the Americas until about 13,000 years ago. Luckily, they had already spread around the world by the time they became extinct within their native land. Thanks to the Spanish conquistadors from whom they escaped in 16th century, horses returned to the continent, though they're now considered feral instead of wild.

Corolla, North Carolina is one of the best places to see the Banker horse, a rare breed that descended from the escaped Spanish stock. The Banker strain of the Colonial Spanish Mustang lives on the barrier islands of the Outer Banks. It's one of the oldest horse breeds in the United States.

They're a small, hardy stock—so small, they should technically be classified as ponies and not horses. Their short backs and low tails make them distinctly different from other types of American mustangs. Because of their relative isolation, the Banker horses around Corolla haven't had a chance to mix with other breeds and dilute their Spanish lineage.

How the horses actually arrived in the area is still a bit of a mystery. Some suspect they swam ashore after surviving shipwrecks. Others think they were simply left behind when the Spanish conquistadors abandoned their North Carolina colonies. The mysterious origin story adds to their allure.

Horse tours are one of the main economic activities in Corolla. Because of the hordes of visitors each week hoping to catch a glimpse of the herd, authorities became concerned about the well-being of the few hundred feral horses roaming about the area. There are now beach patrols in charge of educating people about the equines and how to coexist with them. It's illegal for anyone to come within 50 feet of the horses.

Know Before You Go

The GPS coordinates and address lead to The Corolla Wild Horse Fund. The best way to enjoy viewing wild horses is with an off-road vehicle. However, it is not recommended that visitors do it on their own, as they often get too close to wild horses, and even sometimes hit them and kill them. Take a guided tour instead. There are eight tour operators, most popular being Wild Horse Adventure Tour.

spirit right out of the body. Once the spirit actually does detach from the body, the body can finally, fully die. The spirit is still there, the soul is still there, it's all intact, but detached.

HOW ANIMALS SHARE THEIR CROSSING OVER WITH ANIMAL COMMUNICATORS

What's really cool about what happens to the animal soul is what animals show me about the afterward. They often share psychic visuals of looking down from above on the moment of their passing. Maybe I see a person from above, with this kind of hair, a sofa... I'll describe the scene accurately because the animal had that separation and awareness.

AWARENESS

When you're wondering what happens when the animal leaves their body, it can feel scary. Hopefully this article is helping you feel closer to your pet that is on the Other Side. We are still connected to our animals once they cross over. They're still watching over us. They're still aware of us, they're even right in the moment of crossing seeing what's going on. I get a lot of questions from people about their pets! Someone may say to me, "My cat is my soulmate. I just want to see him again!" Others ask me animal reincarnation, dog reincarnation, and cat reincarnation. The answer, as I've been told intuitively by animals is both exciting and a great opportunity. To start, with one important caveat, animals do reincarnate. Just like humans, animals reincarnate as part of our soul family groups. This means the animals in your life now, have very likely been in your life before, as an animal (not as a human).

CAN ANIMAL SOULS REINCARNATE AS HUMAN OR VICE VERSA?

Interestingly, animal souls stay as animal souls and human souls stay are human souls. There isn't any cross-reincarnation. I haven't met any animals who indicated they had been a human in any past lifetime – or that they were striving to reincarnate as a human at some point in the future. There does not seem to be any cross-reincarnating. Since animals have mastered Unconditional love and humans have not – animals have told me they would be going backwards if they were to reincarnate as a human.

THAT REINCARNATION CATCH

With this whole animal reincarnation thing, there is one big sticking point though. In my experience as an animal communicator, from what the animals have shared with me, they don't reincarnate BACK into our same lifetime. In other words, my dog Clifford, isn't going to reincarnate and come back as my new dog, Tuukka. When I tell people this many ask, "But how could this be? My Muffy acts so much like my childhood cat Farrah – they do the same funny little things – it HAS to be her!" In the majority of these cases, the animal on the Other Side is actually assisting the new animal – and in many cases training the new animal to be in this human's life or to take over the soul contract. This is why the similar personality traits arise.

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE ANIMAL'S SOUL CONTRACTS WITH REINCARNATION?

To answer the second part of the question you first must know what animal soul contracts are. They are agreements that animal souls make with human souls to help the human soul evolve (and master Unconditional Love). When the animal soul reincarnates, since the soul is coming into a human's DIFFERENT lifetime, the contract would also be different – although, it would likely be related. For example, if the horse soul was helping the human soul believe in herself in this lifetime, in the next lifetime the animal soul might be helping the same human soul develop incredible confidence. Animal souls are so much more complex and special that even most animal lovers give them credit for. If you've been wondering, "Do animals reincarnate?" What do you think now? Do you feel like your pet has been with you before?

SIGNS FROM PETS IN THE AFTERLIFE

I wanted to talk about this because so many people miss their dear dog, their cat, their horse, their hamster, their guinea pig, their fish that has crossed over and they don't know what to look for in terms of messages and signs. Our animals that have crossed over they're always sending us messages and signs. They want nothing more than for us to believe they're

there. For us to maybe even sense that they're there. So they're constantly giving us messages of, "Hello, I'm here. Hello, I love you," things like that. But if you don't know what to look for you can just kind of overlook the messages or not believe the messages. So, hopefully, these signs are going to help you trust these messages that, I bet, your animal is already sending you.

6. SAY MY NAME SAY MY NAME

The first way you can get signs from pets in the afterlife that they're visiting is through your animal's name. My dog's name, when she was alive, she was Bella. She still is Bella even though she's on the other side. She'll often let me know she's around and say, "Hi," through her name. So for example, we'll be watching TV and I hear about a "Bella" on TV. And then I'm reading packaging at the grocery store and the brand is Bella. And then I get something in the mail and I see there's the word Bella is on it. Three times I'll hear or see her name. Now, those three things have nothing to do with each other. They're all in the same day or they're all in the same short period of time. It's my Bella's way of saying, "I'm here, I love you." It's not a warning. It's not, "Watch out, Bella's in trouble." It's nothing like that. It's Bella simply letting me know, "Hey, I'm around, I love you." That's all she's doing. And so often that's all they're doing. They just want you to clue into their love.

5. SMELLY ANIMALS

The second common way that signs from pets in the afterlife is actually through smell. My dog Bella, when she was alive, was a Chocolate lab. She was also a smelly chocolate lab because she loved being a dirty dog. She didn't like baths, but she loved swimming in the swamp, and the pond and all these other places, so those things create a distinct Bella smell (that I loved). Sometimes now, when I'm sitting at my desk in my office the Bella smell just wafts by. That's it, it just wafts by. It's just Bella's way of letting me know, "Hey, I'm here." Your animal on the other side could send their body smell or the smell of their favorite toy. Your pet could send the smell of poop! They choose whatever it is that you're going to most associate with them to get their message that will make you remember them and think of them. Again, they're just letting you know they're around. They're just letting you know, "Hey, I'm here."

4. WOOF WOOF!

The number three out of six (plus our bonus) in this signs from pets in the afterlife series is all about animal sounds. So, let's say you're doing something that has nothing to do with your animal. Perhaps you're watching TV, or you're vacuuming, or you're sitting in the backyard. Whatever thing you're doing, suddenly you feel like you just heard your cat's meow behind you. Or your dog's bark. Or you heard the sound that your horse's hoofs made on the hay. It really couldn't be real, right? My dog's not barking behind me, my dog has crossed over. There's no hay in my backyard. And yet, I heard it... You have to trust it. Sounds are another little hello from your beloved pet on the other side – and it's a sign they love to provide for us. When your pets give you the sound sign, they're just wanting you to think of them. So when this happens, think of them and remember their love. Think of them and feel the, "Aw, yay, cool, I love you." Just that. It's all they're asking you to do.

3. SURPRISE!

Let's say you're, again, hanging out in your backyard. You have nothing to do with your deceased animal right now. Maybe you're playing ping-pong or mowing the lawn. For no reason whatsoever you suddenly find yourself thinking of the animal that you love that's crossed over. I know this one's hard to believe because you think you're just thinking of your pet on the Other Side. But often the animal kind of pushes into our thoughts right there so that we remember them and think of them. When your pet on the Other Side pushes into your thoughts, it's never in a negative way. You're thinking lovingly. You're thinking, "Oh, I miss her, I miss him." But it just came from nowhere. So for example, maybe I'm playing ping-pong out in the backyard, but I don't associate my dog Bella with ping-pong. And yet, Bella popped into my head. Those pop-into-your-head moments, they really count!

2. EYE CANDY

Here's sign number five of six. This sign happens when you see your pet that's crossed over out of the corner of your eye, or a quick flash and you turn your head to look and nothing is there. There's no dog there, there's no horse there. There's no

mouse running across the room. But right out of the corner of your eye it really felt like your animal was there and you saw her or him.

EYE CANDY FOR LIVING ANIMALS

Animals do this also when they're alive too, although they do it more often from the Other Side. They send you their energy so you feel like they're there. You keep feeling like you're seeing them with you in your peripheral vision. For example, right now, I don't have my living dog with me because I'm in a hotel. I could be looking at a photo of an unrelated scene (a forest for example). Somehow, I'll feel like I see her in the picture. And then I look closely at the photo and realize, "Oh, no, she's not there. That's not even a dog what I'm seeing." But that's my dog saying hello. Animals on the Other Side do the same thing with photographs or showing up out of the corner of your eye. And they do it way more often. Perhaps you're walking down the hallway and then... "Wait, what?" You think you saw them! They weren't there physically – but they were there. This is one of the signs from pets in the afterlife you have to really work on trusting. It's not your eyes playing tricks on you. It's your animal tapping into you so that your animal can give you this feeling of closeness and say, "Hey, we're still together." And here's the kind of cool thing about these visual signs: our animals are really hanging out with us and this is your proof! So maybe with my physical eye I didn't see her, but my third eye is seeing her because she is around. She is saying hello. She is checking in on me. So it's kind of a fun one to trust, but a lot of people if they don't know that that's a way that a sign works, they don't trust it.

1 SWEET DREAMS

Sign number six for how animals communicate, send messages, and visit us from the other side is through dreams. Finally you get a little control around your signs! The other five signs were signs that would just come to you. This sign is different. For dreams there's a whole little process.

THE PROCESS

- 1 When you go to bed think of your animal. For me, I would think of Bella.
- 2 Ask your animal to visit you in your dreams tonight. For me, I would then say, "Bella, will you please come visit me tonight."

It might take a few nights for this to happen so don't be discouraged if it doesn't happen the first night, especially, if you're deeply in grief. But ask your animal to visit you. Eventually, (probably after a few nights) you'll have this crazy, wonderful, surreal dream with your animal. When you wake up and you're like, "I feel like we were just hanging out together!" With a dream visitation from your pet that has crossed the Rainbow Bridge, it feels so good and yet it feels almost unreal. Asking for a visitation is easy and doable for everybody who has an animal on the other side. Your success with it will depend on how thoroughly enmeshed in the grief you are. Did you know that your animal, when they cross over gets busy? Animals who have passed over actually start arranging the next animal or pet to come into your life! So, when a new animal comes into your life, whenever that is, (right away or five years down the road), your has directly influenced this! Yes, the new animal in your life is actually sent from the animal that has crossed over. And that new animal is a message in itself!
