




#### **COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION**





# THIS WEEK'S BIBLE STORY

Joshua 24:1-3a, 14-27

<sup>1</sup>Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and summoned the elders, the heads, the judges, and the officers of Israel; and they presented themselves before God. <sup>2</sup>And Joshua said to all the people, "Thus says Yahweh, the God of Israel: Long ago your ancestors—Terah and his sons Abraham and Nahor—lived beyond the Euphrates and served other gods. <sup>3</sup>Then I took your father Abraham from beyond the River and led him through all the land of Canaan and made his offspring many.

<sup>14</sup>Now therefore revere Yahweh, and serve Yahweh in sincerity and in faithfulness; put away the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve Yahweh. <sup>15</sup>Now if you are unwilling to serve Yahweh, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served in the region beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my household, we will serve Yahweh."

<sup>16</sup>Then the people answered, "Far be it from us that we should forsake Yahweh to serve other gods; <sup>17</sup>for it is Yahweh our God who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, and who did those great signs in our sight. Yahweh protected us along all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; <sup>18</sup>and Yahweh drove out before us all the peoples, the Amorites who lived in the land. Therefore we also will serve Yahweh, for Yahweh is our God."

<sup>19</sup>But Joshua said to the people, "You cannot serve Yahweh, for Yahweh is a holy God. Yahweh is a jealous God; Yahweh will not forgive your transgressions or your sins. <sup>20</sup>If you forsake Yahweh and serve foreign gods, then Yahweh will turn and do you harm, and consume you, after having done you good." <sup>21</sup>And the people said to Joshua, "No, we will serve Yahweh!" <sup>22</sup>Then Joshua said to the people, "You are witnesses against yourselves that you have chosen to serve Yahweh." And they said, "We are witnesses." <sup>22</sup>Joshua said, "Then put away the foreign gods that are among you, and incline your hearts to Yahweh, the God of Israel." <sup>24</sup>The people said to Joshua, "Yahweh our God we will serve, and Yahweh we will obey." <sup>25</sup>So Joshua made a covenant with the people that day, and made statutes and ordinances for them at Shechem. <sup>26</sup>Joshua wrote these words in the book of the law of God; and he took a large stone, and set it up there under the oak in the sanctuary of Yahweh. <sup>27</sup>Joshua said to all the people, "See, this stone shall

be a witness against us; for it has heard all the words of Yahweh spoken to us; therefore it shall be a witness against you, if you deal falsely with your God."
