

A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans.

<sup>18</sup>I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. <sup>19</sup>For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; <sup>20</sup>for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup>that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup>We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; <sup>23</sup>and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. <sup>24</sup>For in hope we were saved. If you were in church last Sunday, you heard that the Synod has made an inquiry to St. Paul's in Evanston. This is basically a "notice of intent" to explore a possible shared pastor scenario with them. Their council will now discuss this. Ours will too when we meet Wednesday, October 9th. We are open to feedback from the congregation, and the Call Committee will continue to host questions and thoughts at coffee hour after church.

If both councils are open to this, there is a process for us to go through to determine the best way to proceed. The Synod has identified a pastor to lead the process. It would involve a series of meetings with leaders from both congregations who would be responsible for mapping what and how this could look like.

This discernment is an important step which many in our congregation have noted and spoken to. Please share your thoughts with Chad and Mylene so all your thoughts, aspirations, hopes and concerns are included.
