Their peasant-led, nature-embracing procession into Jerusalem stands in stark contrast and defiant opposition to the imperial procession of Pontius Pilate into the city that same week. In reenacting this procession ourselves, we join Jesus and his disciples in their commitment to live in a way that opposes the way of empire.





GOSPEL Luke 19:28-40

#### Glory to you, O Lord.

Having said this, Jesus went ahead with the ascent to Jerusalem. <sup>29</sup> Approaching Bethphage and Bethany, near what is called the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of the disciples with these instructions: <sup>30</sup> "Go into the village ahead of you. Upon entering it, you'll find a tethered colt that no one has yet ridden. Untie it and lead it back. <sup>31</sup> If anyone should ask you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Rabbi needs it.'" <sup>32</sup> They departed on their errand and found things just as Jesus had said. <sup>33</sup> As they untied the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you doing that?" <sup>34</sup> They explained that the Rabbi needed it. <sup>35</sup> Then the disciples led the animal to Jesus and, laying their cloaks on it, helped him mount. <sup>36</sup> People spread their cloaks on the roadway as Jesus rode along. <sup>37</sup> As they reached the descent from the Mount of Olives, the entire crowd of disciples joined them and began to rejoice and praise God loudly for the display of power they had seen, saying, <sup>38</sup> "Blessed is the One who comes in the name of our God! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest!" <sup>39</sup> Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" <sup>40</sup> Jesus replied, "I tell you, if they were to keep silent, the very stones would cry out!"
