

READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Acts 16:16-34

<sup>16</sup> Once when we were going to prayer, we met a household worker who was possessed by a spirit of divination, and who made a great deal of money for her employers through its fortune telling. <sup>17</sup> She began to follow Paul and the rest of us, shouting, "These are faithful followers of the Most High God, who proclaim to you the way of salvation!" <sup>18</sup> She did this for many days. Finally one day Paul lost his temper, and turned around and said to the spirit, "In the name of Jesus Christ I command you to leave this woman!" It left her that moment.

<sup>19</sup> When her employers saw that their profitable operation was now hopelessly dead, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them before the authorities in the public square. <sup>20</sup> They brought them to the chief magistrates and said, "These people are Jews and are disturbing the peace <sup>21</sup> by advocating practices which are unlawful for us Romans to accept or practice." <sup>22</sup> The crowd joined in the attack on them, and the magistrates stripped them and ordered them to be flogged. <sup>23</sup> They were whipped many times and thrown into prison, and the jailer was told to keep a close watch on them. <sup>24</sup> So, following these instructions, the warden threw them into the innermost cell of the prison and chained their feet to a stake.


<sup>25</sup> About midnight, Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God as the other prisoners listened. <sup>26</sup> Suddenly a severe earthquake shook the place, rocking the prison to its foundation. Immediately all the doors flew open, and everyone's chains were pulled loose. <sup>27</sup> When the jailer woke up and found the doors wide open, he drew a sword and was about to commit suicide, presuming that the prisoners had escaped. <sup>28</sup> But Paul shouted, "Don't harm yourself! We're all still here." <sup>29</sup> The jailer called for a light, then rushed in and fell trembling at the feet of Paul and Silas, and, <sup>30</sup> after a brief interval, led them out and asked them, "What must I do to be saved?" <sup>31</sup> They answered, "Believe in Jesus the Savior, and you will be saved—you and everyone in your household." <sup>32</sup> They proceeded to preach the word of God to the jailer and his whole household.

<sup>33</sup> At that late hour of the night he took them in and bathed their wounds; then he and the whole household were baptized. <sup>34</sup> He led them up into his house, spread a table before them, and the whole family joyfully celebrated their newfound faith in God.

<sup>44</sup> Then Jesus said to them, "Remember the words I spoke when I was still with you: everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the psalms had to be fulfilled." <sup>45</sup> Then Jesus opened their minds to the understanding of the scriptures, <sup>46</sup> saying, "That is why the scriptures say that the Messiah must suffer and rise from the dead on the third day. <sup>47</sup> In the Messiah's name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup> You are witnesses of all this. <sup>49</sup> "Take note: I am sending forth what God has promised to you. 
Those worshipping online are invited to raise their bread and wine along with the pastor to be blessed.


#### COMMUNION

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



As part of Wilmette's Sesquicentennial Celebration, the Sesquicentennial Planning Committee is observing Memorial Day (May 30) by conducting a special Unity March and Ceremony to honor the 110 Wilmette men and women who died while serving their country in time of war. Representatives from Wilmette's civic, service, governmental, religious, business, and other organizations/groups are invited to participate in the march and attend the ceremony. Pastor Allison will be leading a group from St. John's in marching together. If you'd like to march, please meet at the St. Joseph's parking lot at 9:30 am on Monday, May 30. The 0.9-mile march will begin at 10:30 am and conclude at Village Hall. The ceremony will begin at 11:30 am on the green in front of Village Hall. Wilmette native Michael Rogers, retired Naval Admiral and former head of the nation's cyber security, will deliver the Memorial Day speech.

#### **Evanston's Interfaith Reparations Effort & Community Launch Event**
