PRESENTATION

Pastor: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. Pastor: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Baker in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: We do.

Pastor: People of God, do you promise to support Baker and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

Congregation: We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Together, we now profess our faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

People of God, do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? **I renounce them.**

Do you believe in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT


The Lord be with you. And also with you. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

I invite you to assume a posture of prayer. You may sit, stand, or kneel; fold your hands or turn them upward; close your eyes or lift them to the altar.

We pray for all whom we know facing the challenge of change, whether by choice or whether imposed by outside forces, those who are bereaved, those who are facing illness, those whose age and stage in life presents challenges that are unknown.

Silence is kept.

Lord God, breathe your faith, your hope and your love into the lives of this people and this community so that, together, we may journey on with you, the God of all. **Amen.**







THIS WEEK'S BIBLE STORY

Genesis 12:1-9

¹Now God said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. ²I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. ³I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

⁴So Abram went, as God had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. ⁵Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had gathered, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, ⁶Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. ⁷Then God appeared to Abram, and said, "To your offspring I will give this land."
