Many of us have never traveled to Alaska.

Others remember our trip to Alaska, as being a 7day round-trip leaving from Seattle or Vancouver, visiting, Juneau, Skagway, Ketchikan and the inside passage.

We are offering tidbits of info in an effort to pique your interest in Alaska.

Alaska is the largest U.S. state by area—comprising more total area than Texas, California, and Montana combined. Known as "The Last Frontier," it features breathtaking landscapes like Denali National Park and Glacier Bay. It spans both the Eastern and Western Hemispheres and is famous for its abundant wildlife and remote wilderness.

Denali-Home to North America's tallest peak (Denali) and extensive grizzly and moose populations.

Mount McKinley, officially named Denali, is the highest peak in North America, located in Alaska's Denali National Park, standing at 20,310 feet. Known for its extreme cold, massive glaciers, and dramatic rise from its base, it's a major destination for climbers and tourists.

Taking a land tour of Alaska lets you venture deep into the remote interior, access majestic locations that large cruise ships cannot reach (like Denali National Park), and enjoy an immersive, flexible experience with up-close wildlife viewing.

Land tours offer better opportunities for spotting brown bears, moose, caribou, and wolves in their natural habitats.

Travel via the glass-domed cars of the Alaska Railroad or scenic motorcoaches, allowing you to relax while taking in the views.

Alaska is widely considered the salmon fishing mecca of the world, producing about 80% of the world's wild Pacific salmon.

Alaskan cuisine relies heavily on fresh seafood, wild game, and foraged ingredients. The most iconic staples include wild-caught king crab, flaky halibut, and five species of wild salmon. Local menus also feature unique indigenous and pioneer fare, such as reindeer sausage.

Salmon is an excellent and iconic food to eat in Alaska. The region offers some of the freshest wild-caught, sustainably managed salmon in the world, renowned for its superior flavor.

Hubbard Glacier & Wilderness Explorer

Hubbard Glacier, Alaska

OVERVIEW

Cruise remarkably close to Hubbard Glacier for the ultimate look at this huge river of ice that has the distinction of being North America's largest tidewater glacier. After boarding the boat directly from the cruise ship in the mouth of Disenchantment Bay, you will settle into the heated cabin with large windows that provide excellent viewing. The vessel also features a shallow draft, allowing it to easily cruise around the icebergs near the face of the glacier, which is hundreds of feet high above the waterline. Hubbard Glacier is nicknamed the Galloping Glacier because at times it advances several feet a day. Few natural sights are quite so spectacular as when large chunks of ice calve – or break off – from the glacier with a thundering roar. The naturalist guide will describe the glacier's characteristics in fascinating detail, as well as the wildlife, which includes harbor seals, bald eagles, orcas and even humpback whales.

HIGHLIGHTS

- See Hubbard Glacier up close from the comfort of a heated, expedition-style boat.
- Behold the sheer face of the glacier, which soars hundreds of feet above the waterline.
- Hear compelling commentary about Hubbard Glacier from the naturalist guide.
- Look for harbor seals, orcas and humpback whales, which inhabit the surrounding waters.

Whale And Marine Mammals Cruise

Icy Strait Point, Alaska

OVERVIEW

Watch humpback whales and other marine creatures cavorting in the nutrient-rich waters at Point Adolphus, one of Alaska's premier observation points. During the cruise, a naturalist will describe the diversity of animals that converge here each summer. They come primarily to feed in the waters that are extraordinarily rich in halibut, salmon and plankton. Point Adolphus is noted for having the highest concentration of humpback whales in the Alaskan panhandle, so be on the lookout for these majestic and intelligent creatures. You can expect them to be

breaching the water's surface, waving their flukes up and down as they dive, and feeding voraciously to fatten up for their winter migration south. You might also observe frolicking Dall's porpoises, Stellar sea lions, curious harbor seals and Orca whales. You may also see graceful bald eagles swooping down to grab fish in their talons, and perhaps even bears and deer in the surrounding wooded landscape.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Watch for humpback whales breaching the water's surface as they feed.
- Gain a deeper understanding of whales and other marine creatures from the naturalist.
- Look for playful porpoises, sea lions and harbor seals.
- Scan the sky for majestic bald eagles.
- Scour the shoreline for mammals such as bears and deer.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Wear warm layered clothing and flat comfortable shoes with non-slip soles.
- Bring waterproof outerwear if you expect to sit on the open-air observation deck.
- Don't forget binoculars and a camera.

Mendenhall Glacier & Whale Quest

Juneau, Alaska

OVERVIEW

Discover the wonders of Mendenhall Glacier at its visitor center and cruise a purpose-built vessel through waters where humpback whales and other marine creatures are commonly spotted. The glacier is the only one in Southeast Alaska accessible by road, just one of the facts you will learn while browsing the Mendenhall Glacier Visitor Center. The glacier is 13 miles long and is part of the massive Juneau Icefield, a remnant of the last ice age. Time permitting, you can stroll the glacier-view path at the center or watch salmon in a nearby stream before driving on to Auke Bay. Here, you will embark a catamaran specially designed for wildlife viewing. Humpback whales are the star attractions in these waters, but you may also spot orcas, sea lions and bald eagles. To enhance the experience, the vessel is outfitted with a hydrophone that may allow you to hear the sounds of the whales below. Throughout the cruise, your onboard naturalist will explain the behavior and habitat of the humpback whale.

HIGHLIGHTS

- See Mendenhall Glacier from its enlightening visitor center.
- Cruise a catamaran through waters where humpback whales are commonly seen.
- Watch for other marine animals and bald eagles.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Dress warmly in weather-appropriate clothing, gloves and a hat.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes. Bring a rainproof jacket.

Glacier Point Wilderness Safari

Skagway, Alaska

This wilderness expedition to the spectacular Davidson Glacier leads you through fjords, rain forests, colorful wildflowers, and towering mountains. Your adventure begins with a 75-minute journey through North America's deepest fjord aboard a high speed 26 passenger expedition

boat. Watch for whales, seals, sea lions, and cascading waterfalls along the way to a remote beach at Glacier Point, one of the most beautiful places in Alaska. After a short, adventurous drive across the forested glacial moraines, and a quarter mile walk, the forest suddenly opens to a breathtaking view of the glacier. The crystal blue ice tumbles from the jagged peaks into a pristine lake where 12 passenger, 31-foot voyager canoes wait to take you towards the face of the glacier. Throughout your tour, expert guides share their extensive knowledge of this amazing area. Enjoy a picnic lunch at the beach amid fields of wild strawberries and iris tops before your return trip to Skagway.

Tongass Rainforest Expedition

Ketchikan (Ward Cove), Alaska

OVERVIEW

Walk through the pristine natural environment of Tongass National Forest, the largest such wilderness in America. As you follow the shaded nature trail through the understory, you can expect to be enthralled by the majesty of the towering, centuries-old trees and the serenity of the forest. While pausing at a meadow, the naturalist guide will identify some of the more unusual plants and describe their characteristics. You will enjoy a different perspective of the wilderness from a viewing platform at a nearby rapids, where bald eagles are often spotted. You will also pause farther down the trail next to a crystal-clear stream where salmon spawn each year. Here, the guide will explain some of the traditions and legends of the indigenous people that lived in the forest.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Hike through Tongass National Forest.
- Marvel at the serenity and towering ancient trees.
- Listen to the naturalist describe the flora and fauna.
- Look for bald eagles and spawning salmon in season.

Hotel Transfer

Upon your arrival to Alaska, look for the Norwegian Cruise Line/ Premier Alaska Tours representative located in the baggage claim area for your transfer to the hotel.

Passports and Visas

It is each traveler's responsibility to have a passport valid for at least 6 months after the date of travel and a visa if required.

IMPORTANT: Guests who are not US citizens must check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what personal identification is required. Guests who enter, leave and then re-enter the same country on their itinerary should check if they require a double-entry visa.

Trip Preparation

A little pre-planning can make your trip go more smoothly. Several weeks before your trip, make a list of what you will need to take with you. Make sure your personal documents (passports, visas) are in order and that you have enough prescription medications to last throughout the trip. We suggest that you make photocopies of passports, visas and any other important travel documents and pack them separately from the originals. Avoid placing important medications or valuables, such as cameras or jewelry, in your checked luggage.

Tour Directors

Your Alaskan Tour Director will be with you for the entire trip to help you experience as much of Alaska's rugged and rustic

atmosphere as possible. From providing information about Alaska's history, people and wildlife to offering suggestions on local restaurants and optional excursions, your Tour Director has your best interests at heart.

Hotels

Norwegian Cruise Line features Alaskan-owned and locally operated hotels to help you experience as much of the to help you experience as much of Alaska's rugged and rustic atmosphere as possible. Since Alaska is a fairly remote location, some hotels may not have the same amenities and services you would normally expect in the lower 48 states; however, all hotels used are clean and comfortable. Hotels are assigned at Norwegian's discretion. Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate requests for hotel substitutions.

Baggage

Baggage Storage During Tour

As a convenience to our guests, we offer a service to store luggage while you are on the land portion of your Cruisetour. Your Tour Director will provide you with special tags to indicate storage. Those pieces of luggage will remain secured on the motorcoach during your tour.

Child Safety Information

Alaska State Law requires children to be in a car or booster seat as follows:

- Children younger than 1 year of age or less than 20 lbs (9 kg) must be in a rear-facing infant seat.
- Children ages 1-4 who are at least 20 lbs (9 kg) must be in a child restraint.
- Children ages 5-7 who are less than 57 in (1.4 m) tall or less than 65 lbs (30 kg) must be in a booster seat. Booster seats are no longer required for children ages 5-7 once they reach 57 in (1.4 m) tall or weigh 65+ lbs (30+ kg).
- Parents are responsible for providing the appropriate car seat.

Whitewater Rafting in the Upper Nenana

Enjoy a scenic adventure on the glacially fed Nenana River! Your 3 hour adventure (2 hours on the river) covers 11 miles of Alaskan wilderness (Class I, II+ rapids). Choose between oar (guide steers the raft and guests are along for the ride) or paddle (learn how to paddle by following the guide's instructions). This tour is perfect for both new and experienced rafters. A dry suit is provided. Bring an extra pair of warm socks!

Iditarod Musher Husky Homestead Tour

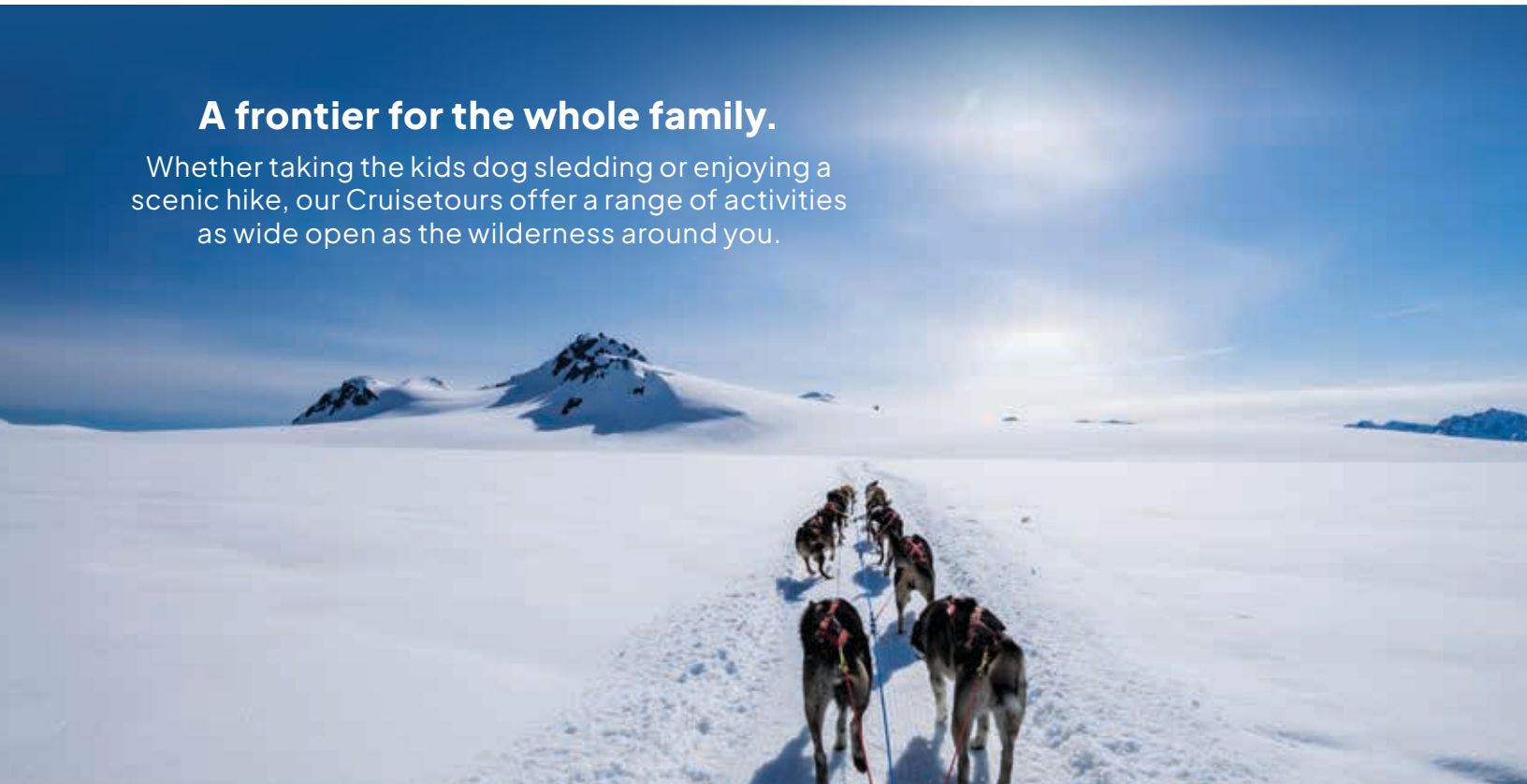

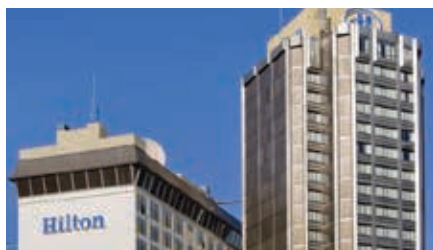
Since Alaska is a fairly remote location, some hotels may not have the same amenities and services you would normally expect in the lower 48 states.
