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“Garden Window” Template & Instruction Sheet

This is a raw edge appliqué portrait wall hanging quilt. It is versatile and a super fun pattern to make. The appliqué is fused to a background fabric. This pattern works beautifully with African wax print fabrics, and with solids in whatever skin tone color you'd like. A reference picture and template is included with this pattern.

FABRICS NEEDED:

Background Fabric for Appliqué	1 Fat Quarter	Print or Solid	Any color. I used a black & white zig-zag stripe
Fabric for hair	10" square	Print or Solid	Any color. I used a tone on tone black print
Fabric for Face/Neck	10" square	Tone on Tone or Solid	Any color. I used a marble brown
Fabric for Shoulders	10" square	Print	Any color. I used a large scale red & brown multi color print
Fabric for eyelashes	2 1/2" square	Solid	Any color. I used black
Fabric for lips	2 1/2" square	Solid	Any color. I used a deep purple

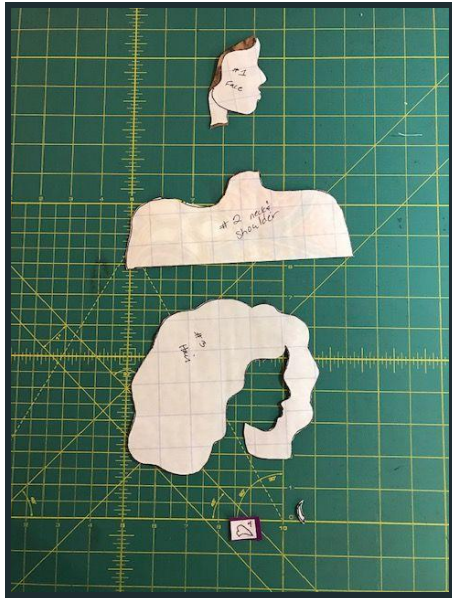
SUPPLIES NEEDED:

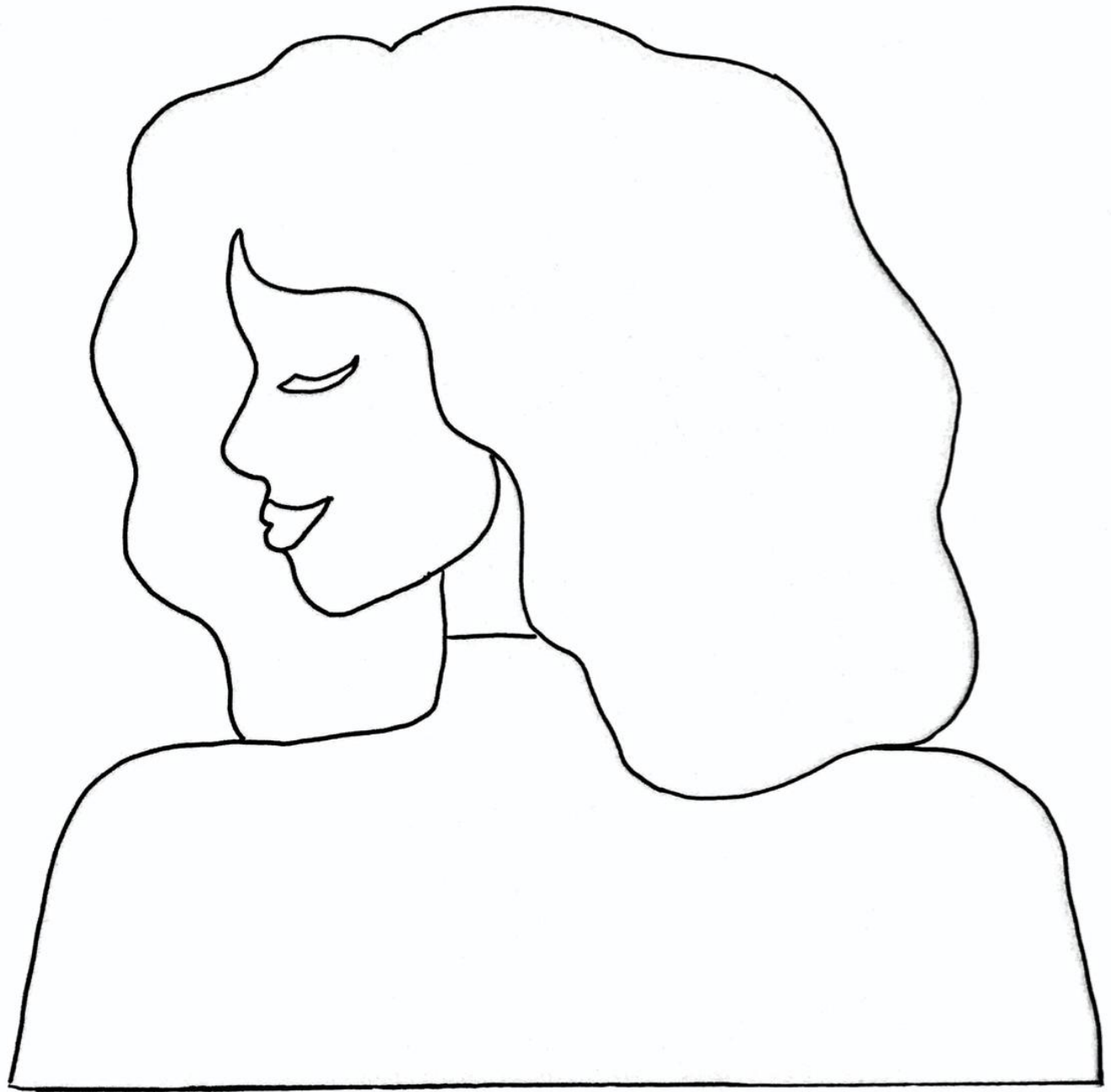
- Appliqué Template (*included with pdf*)
- Two-Sided Paper-backed Fusible Web (*such as Steam-A-Seam 2 or EZ-Steam II*)
- Pencil, Eraser and Sharpies
- Light box or Backlight from a window in your home
- Tape - Painters/Masking or Scotch
- Sharp fabric or appliqué scissors AND regular scissors for cutting paper
- Sewing pins

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Print out the enclosed Template. *Tip: should still fit on regular letter sized paper, however you can enlarge if you'd like. (Use lightbox or window for next step)*
- Turn over the printed out image then re-trace the outlines with a dark Sharpie from the “wrong-side of the copy
- Using a lightbox or the backlight from a window, trace the outlines of each section of the retraced side onto one side of double - sided /paper backed fusible web. You should have five shapes the face, hair, blouse, lips and eyelashes
- Rough cut around each piece and then remove the release paper from the non-traced side of the fusible web

- Apply all of the exposed sticky web pieces to the wrong side of your fabric choices.
 - Cut around the outline of each the shapes of the applique that are now attached to your fabric
 - Remove the release paper from the remaining untraced side of the fusible web
 - Place the new sticky side of the fusible web, that's attached to your fabric pieces, onto your background fabric.
- Arrange and layer the pieces to your liking
- With a dry Iron, press down the pieces to permanently bond the applique in place
 - Topstitch a zig-zag or other decorative stitch around the edges of all applique pieces to secure down the raw edges
 - Tip: If desired you can use an iron-on stabilizer if your zig-zag top stitching is bunching
 - Sandwich with batting and backing and quilt and bind as desired.
