Fabric pattern markings



Dots, squares and large triangles are some of the markings found on the actual stitching line, as opposed to the cutting edge of the pattern piece. These dots are there to match up with their equivalent dot on another piece and guide your construction. Large dots are often used to mark a collar and lapel edge.



Pattern markings for constructing a garment are there to indicate how the pattern pieces sew together. They can show how to distribute ease, create darts, where to gather, and zips and buttonhole placement.
